The CWL gives Catholic fellowship in today's secular world, and it is where lifelong friendships are able to develop and thrive. The Winchester Section was started in 1963 by Canon Mullarkey.

In 'normal times' we meet on the third Thursday of the month in the Parish Centre and are fortunate to have 7pm Mass as part of our meeting. We have interesting speakers at our meetings and learn about the Charities we support or those who may need our support in the future. We have a Soup Lunch each month to make funds for the charities we support. Our members also volunteer at Winchester Hospital and Winchester Cathedral; at St Peters they can be found manning the Reception Desk, cleaning the Brass and Flower Arranging in the church.
