



Trinity Winchester has supported homeless and vulnerable people in Winchester since 1986. Trinity's purpose-built day centre, based on our "Support, Change, Aspire" framework, opened in 2009. Trinity offers a safe space, with bathing and laundry facilities and nutritious hot lunches free of

charge to encourage approximately 640 homeless and vulnerable people each year to engage with our skilled and experienced support workers. It is the only direct-access day centre in central Hampshire. Open 5.5 days per week from 0830 – 1600 weekdays, 0900-1100 Saturdays, with a core staff of 8.5 FTE and around 70 volunteers.

Trinity reaches out to over 600 homeless and vulnerable people annually, including our Women's services for survivors of domestic abuse. We work closely with Winchester City Council's Housing options teams, helping people to get a secure roof over their heads and maintain their tenancies – this is key to enabling vulnerable people to address underlying issues such as a chaotic lifestyle. We facilitate onsite GP surgery, dentistry, chiropody and opticians.

Our Learning Programmes and Job Clubs help people back into employment / structured volunteering through rebuilding their confidence and enabling them to gain accredited qualifications. Around a quarter of our Job Club participants are back in work within 6 months.
