Next Door - Week IV – “Being at Home”

Fr Mark writes:

We are in the fourth and final week of our current series, which we are calling Next Door: The Art of Neighbouring.

We have laid out the challenge:

- ✘ To pray for our neighbours, the ones we know and the ones we don't know.
- ✘ To get to know some of our neighbours' names. And then, to pray for them by name/greet them by name.
- ✘ And finally, maybe to even reach out and share fellowship, companionship with them.

As we wrap up this series, today we are going to look to understand the root of the fragmentation and alienation in our neighbourhoods and the vision God has for us.

We're going to look at our second reading from this weekend, from a letter St. Paul wrote to the early Christian community in Corinth, Greece. Paul uses lots of different images to speak of heaven. We know that our imagery of heaven being “up there in the clouds” is pretty inadequate, not to mention the picture some have that we will just be playing harps all day (not that there's anything wrong with harps...) So, for example, Paul talks of participating in God's glory, and uses other metaphors like incorruptibility and glory, or the image of being transformed into a new mode of being by the Spirit.

In today's reading, he uses the image of ‘being at home’, in contrast to being in exile. The people of Israel had themselves been taken off physically into exiled slavery in Babylon and longed to return home, to be in Jerusalem. Many of our own parishioners are physically a long way from our loved ones and family, our homeland. Maybe some of us have felt that even more acutely during this pandemic, especially if loved ones have been ill or even died and we've been unable to be with them.

There is also in many of us a sense of “spiritual exile”. Things aren't as they should be. There's a restlessness in us because we don't find ourselves fully ‘at home’ or at ease with ourselves, with our relationships, with our neighbours. To the point of this series, why do you have crazy neighbours who mow their lawn at 5am on Saturday mornings? Or whose cats use our garden as a lavatory? Or who stay up late partying and stopping us from getting a good night's sleep?

When God created the world and had it just as he wanted it, we might say that he had only one rule. Basically, that rule came down to trust. Our first parents had to trust him. And what happened..? They ate the forbidden fruit, which was essentially a refusal to trust. This introduces sin. And sin introduces alienation, a three-fold alienation: three major problems that led to them being booted out of, exiled from the garden, and which have affected humanity throughout history and still trouble us today.

The first problem happens immediately after they eat the forbidden fruit, have their eyes opened, realise they're naked and sew fig leaves together to cover themselves up. As a result of sin, human beings are no longer comfortable in their own skin. After eating the fruit their eyes were opened to their own vulnerability and frailty. Before disobeying God they were clothed in divine protection. Now, having broken God's law they discard that protection and are naked before the world.

That's the first alienation, which leads to a second. When they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the evening, the man and his wife hid themselves from the Lord God. The phrase, ‘walking in the garden in the cool of the evening’, suggests the pattern of the relationship that had existed. God would visit them at the very time of day we usually put aside our work and relax with friends. After their

disobedience, that changed. Not on God's part, but on theirs. They hid from their former fellowship with God. They are alienated from him.

The story continues as the Lord God called to the man and asked him, “Where are you?” God, of course, knows exactly where Adam is. He is asking Adam where he thinks he is relationally. He is asking Adam to assess his own situation and acknowledge his mistake, which Adam fails to do. Since Adam doesn't admit the truth of having eaten the fruit, God challenges him. Before, God and man could have this open honest conversation with one another. Now, Adam is posturing, he is trying to hide what is really happening from God.



We do this as well. We pray prayers that are posturing before God or don't really reveal what is going on in our hearts and in our lives. People who have a great relationship with God, on the other hand, are incredibly honest with God. Look at the way David or Moses speak to God. This is the relationship God wants with us, but as a result of the Fall we have a tendency to hide from God our truth thoughts and feelings. We pretend that God cannot see us.

So God challenges Adam, who blames God and blames Eve (and Eve blamed the serpent, who didn't have a leg to stand on, but that's a different story 😊). He says it's God's fault for creating her and her fault for giving the fruit to him. This is the third form of alienation which sin brings. We are alienated from other people.

All the problems in the world perhaps boil down to this threefold alienation.

- ✘ We are uncomfortable with ourselves.
- ✘ We are not in right relationship with God.
- ✘ We are out of sorts with our neighbours.

We assume fear and alienation are normal because that is what we see. But it is not normal nor what God intends.

But even from the off, God has a plan to deal with that problem and to bring us home. God speaks to the serpent and points to the coming of a Saviour, who would one day save us from our own alienation and exile and bring us home.



Connecting with your neighbour isn't just about having a more pleasant neighbourhood. Connecting with neighbours is about overcoming our own fears and moving towards the people God wants us to be and we, in our heart of hearts, want to be. Connecting with your neighbour is about overcoming alienation and allowing Jesus to lead us out of exile and safely home. Connecting with neighbours is about living like we're actually redeemed in Christ and making our home in the Lord.


Second reading: Corinthians 5:6-10




"Year of the Eucharist"
