We are what we eat

Fr Anthony writes:

Going down memory lane, I remember with a big smile, my fun-filled primary school days in St Anthony's school, Njinikom. One of such striking memories is my graduation ceremony in primary seven. I was one of the pupils selected to take part in a role-play debate 'Who does the most?'. Together with my classmates who played the roles of doctor, teacher, father, mother, baby sittler, with each arguing he/she does the most for society, we all thrilled our parents and invitees. For some reason beyond my understanding, I, farmer, was voted as the most important. Although I can still recite my part from memory, I often pondered more on one of the reasons I advanced 'Because we are what we eat, the farmer is the most important because he provides what we eat'. Although it is still contestable, it is almost a truism that 'we are what we eat', since the body works only with the food given it. Conscious of the negative impact of junk-food, we are often advised to shun them because our bodies need healthy foods in order to function well over a long period.



The human person, created in the image of God, is a being at once corporeal and spiritual (CCC 362). We not only have a body to cater for, but a God-given soul. The Church teaches that every spiritual soul is created immediately by God - it is not "produced" by the parents - and also, that it is immortal: it does not perish when it separates from the body at death, and it will be reunited with the body at the final Resurrection (Pius XII, Humani Generis: DS 3896). In this light, we have both body and soul to look after. Just as one must discipline oneself to provide and eat physical food, so must one exercise discipline to seek and ingest spiritual food. If one will not do this, then, just as physical health will decline without adequate food, a person's inadequate spiritual diet will lead to spiritual disease. At the very least, one's quality of life will be severely compromised.




We are challenged in today's readings to be more concerned with spiritual food than with physical food and to get our spiritual food regularly from the word of God and from the Holy Eucharist — the Heavenly Bread — because only God can satisfy the various forms of our spiritual hunger. Although physical food is the most basic of our human needs, we cannot live by this bread alone. We need the bread of eternal life that preserves those who believe in God (Scott Hann).

In the first reading, God provides miraculous manna and quails to His starving children. He wanted them see beyond the physical provision and so realize the need for total dependence on Him, their creator and provider; the one who gives them bread from heaven, the bread of angels, as the responsorial Psalm of today puts it.

St. Paul in the second reading of today admonishes the Ephesians to satisfy their spiritual hunger by turning away from their former evil ways to a renewed way of living, driven by love, kindness, compassion and forgiveness. Paul reminds us that our acceptance of Jesus as the real source of our life and the nourishment of our souls, transforms us totally into witnesses of Christ.

In the Gospel pericope of today's liturgy gleaned from the "Bread of Life Discourse" in John's Gospel, Jesus makes the unique and bold claim: "I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger, and whoever believes in Me will never thirst." By saying this, Jesus offers the crowd, especially those who believe in Him, Bread from Heaven, which nourishes and gives eternal life. This is the same bread of life you and I receive at Holy mass; which brings about the presence and indwelling of God in our hearts.



This week's challenge is to WATCH OUR DIET, ESPECIALLY OUR SPIRITUAL DIET.
