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This words of this song bring together more than 2000 years of praise to Almighty God, for the gift of His creation, which we offer to Him in the Eucharist. It begins by quoting the ancient Jewish *Berakah* blessing, still said at every Sabbath: *Blest are you Lord God, Sovereign of the Universe*. And it continues with rich images from the New Testament ("seed that died to bring life new" – Jn 12:24; "the breaking of the bread" - Lk 24:35) and from our Apostolic tradition ("as the separate grains become one loaf, gather us as one in you" – The Didache, c.150 AD). Combining our Jewish, New Testament and Apostolic heritage, with contemporary expressions of charity and justice, it is a song of all the ages, in praise of Him Whom we address in the 3rd Eucharistic Prayer: "You never cease to gather a people to Yourself, so that from the rising of the sun to its setting, a pure sacrifice may be offered to Your name."
