More than Enough - We Need God and Other People

Fr Mark writes:

Over the last few weeks, we've been talking about when enough is enough. We've talked about this idea of enough and how it is a question that can haunt us. We wonder if we have enough, get enough, do enough, are enough. And if we focus our lives on 'enough', we might be missing out on the real purpose of our lives. Our goal is to follow the Lord. To follow Jesus means to go where he goes, even when that means going to the cross. And that sounds difficult and challenging. But it is better than the alternative in which we worry about making life work out for us all alone and on our own. It is better than the constant feeling of knowing that we don't have enough. Following the Lord to the cross is enough because the cross is more than enough.

Today we are going to look at a passage from the second chapter of the book of Genesis. While people often look at the beginning of Genesis as a kind of fairy tale, it is actually a book of great depth and insight. Genesis helps us to understand eternal truths and the reality of our human condition. When God created the world and everything in it, he pronounced it good. The whole world is created good. There is no sin, no war, no disease. It is a complete paradise.

"The Lord God then took the man and settled him in the Garden of Eden to cultivate it and care for it." Genesis 2:15

All the world is good and God gives the first man, Adam, a job to do: care for and cultivate the garden. Work is a gift from God and he gave it to humanity before anything went wrong in the world. Adam is in paradise. He is in a perfect world. All is good, which makes this next verse somewhat surprising. The Lord God said:

"It is not good that the man should be alone. I will make him a helpmate." Genesis 2:18

This is the only time in the first two chapters that we encounter those words, 'not good'. Despite all that Adam had going his way, living in this creation that is created 'good', something is 'not good'. God recognises a problem in Adam's life that even Adam himself, at this point, does not truly understand. That's our reality. We don't always recognise or appreciate the problems in our life. We can't always see when something is missing from our life that we truly need. What God sees that Adam doesn't see is that: "It is not good...to be alone." God hates loneliness. God hates loneliness because God is not alone, but rather God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, a communion of persons continually loving one another in an endless, eternal mutual indwelling of love.

Even though Adam has a good relationship with God, that is not enough. That almost sounds blasphemous because so often we are told that all we need is God, but this passage of Scripture seems to challenge that. We need more and God provides us with more. It is not enough just to have a relationship with God. Spiritual growth and health requires more. Unless you're called to the life of a hermit, you will not grow closer to God, you will not become everything God created you to be by just spending time with God in personal prayer or private devotions. Prayer is essential, it's just not enough, it's necessary but not sufficient.

To grow as a follower of Christ, it is not enough for you simply (or not so simply) to come here and attend Mass on the weekend. Mass is crucial.

It is the source and summit of our whole faith, but it's not the whole journey: more is needed. You need friendship in faith. We need friendships in faith, to follow Christ better. We also need them to just live more successful lives. You are not enough - you cannot solve the problems and meet the responsibilities of your life on your own. You will never have enough time, energy and stamina to meet your responsibilities. You can't. You need God and you need other people.

It is amazing the strength and power that comes when there is more than one in a group working together. We see this in physics and in nature. Geese, for example, go further and faster when they fly together in formation than geese flying alone...in fact, 70% further and faster.

It's the same for us: we need friends in faith. We may not see the problem of trying to do life all alone and on our own, but God sees the picture clearly.

"So from the soil the Lord God fashioned all the wild beasts and all the birds of heaven. These he brought to the man to see what he would call them...But no helpmate suitable for the man was found for him." (Genesis 2:19, 21)

Now, didn't God know that none of the animals would satisfy Adam's need for companionship? Of course he did. He knew that, but Adam didn't. As all these animals fail to meet Adam's need for companionship, God is helping him realise that he needs a human relationship. God is heightening his desire for friendship and fellowship, in which he is known and can be known, can love and be loved. Adam recognises that life on his own is not good. So, Genesis tells us,

"The Lord God built the rib he had taken from the man into a woman, and brought her to the man, The man exclaimed: "This at last is bone from my bones and flesh of my flesh." (Genesis 2.22)

Adam finally, at last, understands his situation. And now it is good.

The experience of many parishes is that when people join a small group, like our Acorn Groups, they have an experience not unlike Adam's. They never knew what they were missing. Simply having substantial conversation with other people who actually care about you could be a refreshing experience for many. Talking about what matters to you, what concerns you, what you're currently dealing with: at home, at school, at work, sharing joys and sorrows, hopes and fears. Moreover, simply placing all of it in the context of our faith, to understand better what's going on and to understand our faith better. How many of you have these sorts of conversations during the normal course of the week..?

God wants to put some people around you to help you shoulder your burdens and so you can help share the burdens of others. God wants to put some people around you to share your joys and successes. God wants to put some people around you who 'get' faith in Jesus, with its joys and challenges. God wants to put some people around you who can pray with you and for you.

Today, there is no homework! I'm just, at this stage, trying to plant a seed in your heart and mind...some might call it an acorn...The bad news is you cannot have an entirely successful life all alone and on your own, there are just too many areas to take care of. By yourself, there's never enough you can do.

That's the bad news. The good news is that you don't have to.

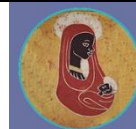
Super Welcome Sunday, 3rd October – 10:30am Mass at St. Peter's

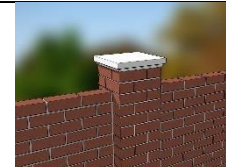

ORANGE HEART CAMPAIGN: Seventy years ago, after the horrors of World War II, the UK signed the UN Refugee Convention, giving our commitment to protecting people fleeing persecution. In celebration of seven decades of offering asylum, and in acknowledgement of the enormous contribution of refugees to British society, the Southampton and Winchester Visitors Group, (SWVG), and hundreds of other organisations across the UK are joining the Orange Heart Campaign. The heart was designed in collaboration with refugees and people seeking asylum as a symbol of welcome and support.

This simple expression of solidarity will be a powerful tool to counter negative messages about migrants and refugees, and to show the Government the enormous support from people across the UK for refugees and people seeking asylum.
