Fourth Sunday in Advent – Year C

It's a Wonderful Life V – Bringing People Closer to Christ

Fr Mark writes:

It's the Fourth Sunday of Advent, which means Christmas will very soon be upon us. This year, to help us stay focused on the blessing that Christmas is supposed to be, we have been working our way through our current message series...all about gratitude.

Being ungrateful can be a trap we can get stuck in, and it is incompatible with happiness. Plenty of studies and all of our experience make it clear that there's no practice more effective at increasing your happiness and well-being than practising gratitude. There's no question that it is in our own best interest to grow in gratitude. This series has been focused on the question of how.

So, we've talk about steps we can take, simple and necessary but not necessarily easy steps. The first step is that we actually learn to *recognise the gifts and blessings that we are given*. Gratitude is a thankful appreciation. The second step is to *turn our attention from the gift towards the giver of the gift*. The third step is going to be all about *practising gratitude*.

We see a great example of this third step played out in an encounter which we read about in Luke's Gospel, which is known as the Visitation. Luke has already described the appearance of the Angel Gabriel to Mary. He announces to her this incredible plan that God has in store for her to be the Mother of God.

On the heels of this amazing, life-changing, world-transforming encounter, having just been given the highest honour in history, what does Mary do? She goes to visit her cousin Elizabeth. It sounds charming, doesn't it? It wasn't. It was a long journey, on foot, that would have taken many days, with little in the way of comfort. It would have been dusty and dirty and dangerous too. Mary goes to help Elizabeth prepare for the birth of Elizabeth's own child and to undertake the household duties that Elizabeth, a much more elderly woman, could no longer handle. She joyfully receives Mary with a greeting which, along with Gabriel's greeting, would become just about the most famous one ever.

Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. (Luke 1.39)

And then Elizabeth asks:

Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? (Luke 1.39)

Mary shows gratitude for her own motherhood by supporting Elizabeth. Elizabeth, in turn, responds with gratitude for the gift of Mary's presence and support but also for the greater gift Mary carries.

For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. (Luke 1:44-45)

Elizabeth and the child within her, John the Baptist, recognize the child Mary herself carries. She is bringing Jesus, the Lord, to them.

We can be thankful for the people who have brought Jesus into our life or brought us closer to him. None of us would know the Lord or anything about him if someone, or maybe several some ones, had not introduced us to him.

Maybe it was your parents who introduced you to Jesus. Maybe it was someone at church or school, a friend or neighbour. If you have a relationship with Jesus, it is because of someone else. So why not take some time to pray for that person or those people this Christmas..?

I would sincerely like to thank all of you who have made a pledge, are prayerfully considering making a pledge, or are praying for the success of our "Closer to Christ" campaign. I've been overwhelmed by your generosity. Many of you will know that I don't enjoy or feel particularly comfortable talking about money and yet I know that we need it to help bring people closer to Jesus. We need it to train priests and help them to grow, so they can bring others closer to Jesus; we need it to make sure our church buildings are beautiful and fitting places for worshipping Jesus and lifting our hearts and minds to Our Heavenly Father; we need it to develop a vibrant, welcoming, joyful, hope-filled community, empowered by the Holy Spirit. We need it to make sure our priests are well looked after at the end of their lives, as an expression of our gratitude for bringing us and others closer to Jesus.

This weekend we will try to have a "mopping up exercise" at our Masses. We will be doing our best to ensure that we're aware of all those who've made a pledge, those who would still like to make one (some of whom might appreciate a conversation, soon in the New Year), and those who aren't in a position to make a pledge. It will also be an opportunity to thank all of you who've supported this campaign in any way, especially by your prayers.

Another way to express gratitude to God for the people who have brought you closer to him. Thank God by doing the same for others. Mary is considered the proto-Christian. Just as she brought the Lord into the world, we are to bring him into our little part of it. We are to carry Christ in our hearts and bring him to our schools, our homes, our work places, most especially into our Christmas gatherings and holiday celebrations which we'll soon enjoy.



Invest in a friend, a family member or a co-worker who does not know Christ. Pray that God would use you to make himself known to them: in your kindness, charity, joy, or in a thousand other ways. Maybe you could consider inviting them to join you at our next Alpha after Christmas..?

Bringing people closer to Christ is a beautiful way to express gratitude. It's also the best way to celebrate Christmas.
