Second Sunday in Advent – Year C

It's a Wonderful Life III

Fr Mark writes:

We're trying this Advent to help each other stay focussed on the blessings in our lives and grow in appreciation. We're talking about cultivating a spirit of thanksgiving: an attitude of gratitude. Today we are going to look at recognising a special blessing in our lives. It's one that, in our heart of hearts, we want to acknowledge but often forget.

St. Paul reminds us of this very point in his Letter to the Philippians. It was written around the year 62AD. But Paul is writing the letter from his prison cell in Rome. He's been jailed for the crime of preaching Christ and the Gospel, because Christianity was considered subversive by both Roman and Jewish authorities.

Philippi was a prosperous city of the Roman Empire in what is modern day Greece. Paul had actually planted the church there some years earlier. And over the years, the Philippians supported his ministry and mission financially and they supported him personally in other ways as well. They proved themselves to be good friends.

At this point, and in a time of some suffering and persecution by his enemies, Paul is remembering his friends.

"I thank my God whenever I think of you. Every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News from the day you first heard it right up to the present." (Philippians 1:3-5)

Philippians is sometimes called a "thank you note." Paul is grateful for them and he lets them know it. He's thankful every time he thinks of them. Can you think of anyone like that in your life? People for whom you have the same reaction? They have been such a blessing in your life that every time you think of them, just the thought alone brings a smile, perhaps a chuckle or maybe even a tear. Broadly they fall into two categories. Firstly, consider the people who have been a blessing in a previous season of your life. You had a teacher, a mentor, a coach, a boss who went the extra mile for you in the past and you have an abiding gratitude for them. Secondly, consider the people who are blessings right now. You look forward to time together because they are such a source of encouragement or positivity that always brightens your day or cheers your heart. Or, maybe they are such a constant, so consistent in their blessings in our lives, that we actually tend to take them for granted, treating their goodness to us as an entitlement, or falling into ingratitude. Then there is a special category. Maybe you're going through a difficult situation or challenging circumstance currently and this person / these people are a source of stability and support. Perhaps even inspiration.

Who are the people who for you are a source of many blessings? For Paul it was the Philippians, who thanks God whenever he thinks of them. He's grateful that the Philippians have worked alongside him from the early period of his ministry to promote the Gospel. They have been his co-workers in letting more and more people know Christ. Here Paul thanks the Philippians for both the relationship he has with them and for the work they have accomplished together. Then as an expression of thanksgiving, Paul prays for them.

"My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ, when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God." (Philippians 1:9-11)

He prays that their ability to love abound and continue to grow in knowledge and deepening perception (many translations prefer "all discernment" to "deepening perception").

Love simply means to be for someone else. And to be for others requires knowledge and discernment

- ❖ we have to know what is good for them.
- ❖ we have to be discerning about what they really need.

If you are a parent or a good boss, you know that. You can't just treat everyone the same. Rather, you have to know the person and discern in various situations and circumstances what is best for them.

Paul prays they will grow in love by discerning and knowing how to love. Finally, he prays that the Philippians will reach perfect goodness or, more literally from the Greek, be filled with fruit of righteousness. The fruit of righteousness means things like patience, peace, kindness, joy, happiness and goodness, self-control, self-sacrifice, attributes of Christ. Paul prays for their character, that they will become more like Christ.

So, this week, we want to practise gratitude and grow in gratitude by using Paul as an example. Think of one person you need to thank because every time you think of them you feel grateful for them. Or think of a person you know you take for granted but when you step back and think about them you realise he or she is an incredible blessing to you personally or in some work you are doing together. The work might be your job or it might be the work of raising a family, volunteering in some charity or a ministry here in the parish. Commit this week to pray for that person. Thank God for them and pray for their needs and that they will grow in love.

We'd love it if you could perhaps share their names with us, maybe just their first names if that's more appropriate. You could send a message to us on facebook or email in to hello@stpeterswinchester.org.uk. We'd like to include these names in our prayers over Christmas.

That's your basic homework but if you want bonus points, then this week let me suggest something else. Take time to write the person a letter or even a card, telling why you are grateful to God for them. And, don't forget to post it. Just tell that person that you thank God for them and why you are grateful. At the end of the day, being grateful is not a bad way to be remembered.

God has put some people in your life that have been an incredible blessing to you. They are instruments of his mercy and grace. When we recognise their blessing, we're doubly blessed.

Many took this up and the calls have continued throughout the past year and a half: amazing friendships and bonds have been formed. As restrictions came and went, and as people's needs and circumstances changed, the PeterCares callers have always been responsive and involved. We're happy to link with all age groups - university students and young parents as well as older people. 


