Third Sunday in Advent - Year C

It's a Wonderful Life - Expressing Our Gratitude by Sharing Our Extra

Fr Mark writes:

We're into double figures on those Advent Calendars and this weekend we light the third, rose-coloured, candle on our Advent Wreath. Christmas is definitely just around the corner. In fact, it feels to many of us, I suspect, as if it's hurtling toward us at breakneck speed. To help us all stay focused on the blessings of the season, we've been talking all about cultivating a spirit of thanksgiving: an attitude of gratitude.

This weekend we are looking at the connection between gratitude and giving. We see this played out in a passage from the Gospel of Luke introducing us to the figure of John the Baptist, a central figure in this season of Advent. John was a wildly popular prophet. Preaching out in the wilderness, people would flock from the cities and towns of the region to hear him. He called them to renewal in faith, reform in living and, as a sign of their renewal and reform, baptism. He called this "preparation" and challenged people to

"Prepare a way for the Lord." (Luke 3.4)

Implicit in this message is the good news that God would visit his people. Which meant the people had work to do. They couldn't simply rely on their religious heritage. To be ready for the coming of the Lord they had to prepare. John's preaching must have been pretty effective because the Gospel of Luke tells us that the crowds asked him,

"What must we do?" (Luke 3:10)

"Ok, John, you have convinced us. We believe the Messiah is coming. We believe we should do something to prepare for him. What exactly should we do to get ready?"

As Christians living 2,000 years later, knowing that Christmas is coming, wanting to prepare our hearts and homes, what should we do, how do we prepare? John the Baptist told the people and he tells us:

'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' (Luke 3:11)

It's important that we are giving to the Church: giving in our place of worship as an act of worship. Our current Closer to Christ campaign gives us an opportunity to fund the mission of the Church in bringing people closer to Jesus. I owe an enormous thank you to all of you who are prayerfully considering whether and how you might be able to contribute to this initiative.

But the other kind of giving which Bible talks about, and the one on which I wish to focus today, is giving to the poor. John describes this kind of giving as coming from what's extra. Spare coat? Spare food? Then share with those who don't have any. We give out of the extra we have to those who are in need. And many, if not most of us, in this community have plenty of extra. Which is nothing to feel guilty about. In fact you should celebrate the extra you have. That is first of all about expressing gratitude to God, for what you have, because ultimately it all comes from him. A great practical way to thank God for our extra is to share.

Those of us who are parents probably appreciate the things that others do and give to help our children. Well, it's similar for God, who sort of says to us, "Do something for my child and you do something for me."

We express gratitude to God by giving from our extra to his children, our brothers and sisters. That's why, for example, we invite our Covenant with the Poor team to present us four times a year with a project or initiative. It gives us an opportunity to share some of the financial blessings we've received with others who are struggling in some way. Already this year, your financial support has enabled us to help provide safe water for at least 500 women and children in Zambia through "The Sausage Tree Charity"; fund summer hobbies and recreation project for local people with learning disabilities through "Winchester GoLD" and help rebuild a school in Ethiopia, run by the sisters of St. Lucy and damaged by fighting in the civil war. You have generously contributed £16,168 this year alone for these appeals. Thank you, as always.

Today, our Advent appeal is to support an important project of The Medaille Trust, a Catholic charity founded by religious congregations to work for the eradication of human trafficking and to offer support to those who have been trafficked. I was hugely impressed by the work of the Medaille Sisters when I was assistant priest in Southampton from 2001-2007.

The fight against modern slavery has been a cause dear to the hearts of our recent Popes. For example, St. Pope John Paul II said:

"The trade in human persons constitutes a shocking offence against human dignity and a grave violation of fundamental human rights."

Pope Francis has spoken often on this subject. For example, in 2018:

"According to some recent statistics, there would be more than 40 million people, men, but especially women and children, who suffer slavery. Just to make us an idea we can think that if they lived in a single city, it would be the largest megalopolis on our planet and would have, more or less, four times the population of the entire urban area of Buenos Aires and Greater Buenos Aires."

Whilst there is a need to address the root causes of modern slavery, there is also a great need to support those who even in our own back yard have been exploited by modern slavery. Despite slavery being abolished throughout the British Empire nearly 200 years ago, there are, even today in the UK, an estimated one hundred thousand people living in slavery. The Medaille Trust is a wonderful Catholic organisation that helps rescue people from slavery and provides a safe space for them to adjust to normal life, a process that can take many months. Medaille now operates two safe houses in Southampton, each of which accommodates up to five women, some with babies, rescued from slavery. In 2018, you helped raise funds for a garden room in the first of these, and it has been a great success. It has provided a comfortable and confidential space for counselling, to help repair the damage suffered during exploitation. For a little over £4,000 a similar comfortable space can be erected at the newlyestablished second house to provide a warm location for counselling. You can read more about the work of the Medaille Trust and this appeal in our Covenant with the Poor Newsletter, sent out with this newsletter this week and on our parish website. Members of the Covenant with the Poor Team, who have visited the Southampton site, will also be speaking at Masses this weekend. Thank you, as always, for your generosity.

A wonderful way to express gratitude to God is to share our extra, and when we do and it can actually change and transform the lives of others, that's even more reason to be grateful.



It's hard work but rewarding, and Fr Mark says, "I was never trained to lead out of a team. I always thought I had to make the tough decisions by myself, even though I've always tried to listen to others, and it often felt like a huge burden of responsibility. I think generally I have a good instinct but I know too that I have weaknesses and blind spots.
