*Story of Your Life #3 - Community Helps You in Your Story*

**Fr Mark writes:**

This is the third message of our series on “the story of your life”. When we began this series recently, we noted that our lives are ultimately a story – with a beginning, a middle and an end. When it comes to our lives, we each make a decision whether to live in our own smaller story or to see ourselves as part of God’s larger story. Living in a smaller story brings fear, worry and anxiety. It leads to the things we regret most. Living in God’s larger story brings joy and blessing, even if it doesn’t always look that way at first.

Today’s message is all about our Lenten Spiritual Campaign, where I will invite everyone in the parish to join a small group for the season of Lent. I want to do everything in my power to convince you that your life will be a better story if you get yourself into one of these Lenten small groups. Small groups like these and our Acorn Groups will be core to who we are as a Church. We believe that small groups such as these are absolutely vital for spiritual growth.

What do I mean by a Lenten small group? Well, I simply mean a group of 6-10 people who will get together each week and discuss the topics we introduce here each weekend. As a church we provide materials, and some questions so members can talk about the weekend message in greater depth as well as discuss the Scripture. Here’s what we want to happen in these groups. We want group members to be sharing how the homily is touching their lives. We want to build up relationships, friendships in faith where we can discuss how God’s word intersects with our day-to-day reality. Small groups are almost essential for spiritual growth and they are an especially important environment if you want to understand your story in the light of God’s larger story. And in these small groups you will have the opportunity to learn from other people’s stories. Because there is a bit of randomness as to who joins a Lenten small group, it actually brings a freedom, so you can share your story without fear of judgment knowing that it is shared in confidence. You also come to know your story better as you hear stories from other people.

There is one other advantage to Lenten small groups. To help us understand that advantage we are going to look at this weekend’s passage from John’s Gospel, where we find Jesus and his disciples at a wedding.

*“When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, ‘They have no wine.’”*

So there is this wedding and everything is great and then the story turns. There is a problem – they have no wine. In Jesus’ culture, hospitality was everything and so to run out of wine was much more than embarrassing and not a good start to this couple’s marriage. Mary knows what’s going on so she brings the problem to her son. She tells Jesus that they don’t have enough wine, with confidence that he can do something about it. Now up to this point, Jesus had never publicly performed any miracle. But Mary knows who he is and she is asking him to start now. As John, the Gospel-writer, tells us, Jesus does perform the miracle. We discover that he not only has the power to turn water into wine, but he can make it into excellent quality wine. There is a happy ending.

It is at this point that the story turns because Mary knows the couple’s problems. She knows the reality of their story and so she brings their concerns to Jesus, to the Son of God who can do something about it.

All of us have problems in our lives. There are struggles in our story. And often we need help. We need someone either to help us out or to listen to us or to lighten the load or simply to do what Mary did in this story and bring our problem to God in prayer.


Who knows your story well enough to bring your problems and struggles to Jesus? Who can pray for your problems and struggles? You may think, “Well nobody. Usually I just hide it and hope that it goes away. I usually try and just tough it out on my own.” “Does that work?” “No, it’s just what I do.”

If the pandemic hasn’t taught us that we’re not self-sufficient then perhaps it hasn’t taught us anything at all.

Why not try something different? Why not join an environment where you can be the real you and share your story, share the good and the bad, the joys and the struggles so people can pray for you. I don’t mean that you spill your guts on the floor every week, but just a place to be authentic and acknowledge life isn’t perfect. That’s the environment these Lenten small groups will aim to create.

The whole Gospel story this weekend changes because Mary knew the couple’s problem and brought it before her son. Some of the problems in your life that seem insurmountable, that seem huge, could change because in a small group you would find some people to help you lighten your load, just a bit, and because you would have people praying for you.

Most of us need a small group, and Lent, which begins with Ash Wednesday on 2nd March, is a perfect time to try one out for just a few weeks. The purpose of our small groups is to be spaces that will help us share the joys of our story as well as some of life’s challenges. At times we are going to have problems. We need relationships to carry us. All good stories are marked by relationships. Carve out some time in your schedule this Lent for these supportive, life-giving, story-enhancing relationships.
