4th Sunday of Lent Gospel - Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32

The prodigal son

Perhaps we recognise something of ourselves in the prodigal son: foolishly preferring pleasure and ease to love; confidently striking out in life with his own plans; wondering what to do when it all goes wrong; and even then, rehearsing an apology motivated more by self-interest than pure love. But amazingly, through all this, his father lovingly waits, looking out for his son's return.

Lord, I thank and praise you for your patient love even when I take wrong paths; I long to return to your open arms.

Laetare Sunday (Sun March 27th)

The 4th (middle) Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday or 'rejoicing' Sunday (named after the words of the Entrance Antiphon at Mass 'Laetare Jerusalem ...' or 'Rejoice O Jerusalem...'). On Laetare Sunday the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances, with Easter in sight. The colour rose is used to represent this.

It is also called 'Mothering Sunday' - nowadays we remember our mothers and give them thankful cards and gifts, though in times past people used celebrate their baptism by visiting their 'mother' church, i.e. where they were baptised.

Am I joyful in my fasting and almsgiving? Do I have true hope in Jesus and Heaven which He has won for us? Do I love God with all my heart?


The traditional 14 stations are as follows:


- 1. Jesus is condemned to death
- 2. Jesus takes up his cross
- 3. Jesus falls the first time
- 4. Jesus meets his mother
- 5. Simon of Cyrene carries the cross
- 6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
- 7. Jesus falls the second time
- 8. Jesus meets the daughters of Jerusalem
- 9. Jesus falls the third time
- 10. Jesus is stripped of his garments
- 11. Jesus is nailed to the cross
- 12. Jesus is crucified
- 13. Jesus is taken down from the cross
- 14. Jesus' body is laid in the tomb


At each station we pray the following and then announce and meditate on the station:


Leader: We adore You, O Christ, and we bless You


All: Because by Your holy cross You have redeemed the world.






































