Allowing God to “Feel at Home”

Fr Mark writes:

The concept of hospitality is fundamental to the Christian way of life. When we imagine hospitality, we naturally think of offering a sincere and warm welcome — to those new to our parish, for instance. We picture inviting them in and making them feel at home and at ease in our presence, communicating to them that they are highly valued, that we want them to be here with us.

Today’s Gospel reading from John invites us to think of hospitality in a slightly different way. In it, we hear Jesus speaking this to his disciples: *“If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him.”*

Jesus is asking that we permit the Blessed Trinity to come and dwell within us. This is an amazing request. It also tells us that our first and most privileged form of hospitality should be directed towards God Himself.

How does one show hospitality to God? How do we make God “at home and at ease” within us? How can we communicate to God that He is “highly valued” by us, that we want Him to be here within us?

Jesus tells us how: we are to keep His word, to follow His teachings. Over time, as we do this, we can begin more easily to think like Jesus, respond like Jesus, and love like Jesus. We really will form our minds, hearts and souls into a place where the Blessed Trinity is pleased to dwell.

How is this possible? Because we have an Unseen Teacher with us as we seek to know and keep God’s word. Later, in this same Gospel passage, Jesus tells us so: *“The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you.”* Ask the Holy Spirit to show you when and how you can get to know God’s word in your particular circumstances. Listen to this Advocate and learn from this Teacher.

We’re very blessed in this parish that we have so many people, of all ages and backgrounds, who serve us and the wider community through our volunteer ministries. For example, one of our key ministries is that of welcome and hospitality. Each and every one of us has a responsibility to offer welcome to our guests but this ministry helps us to be more intentional and focussed about it. Our welcome ministry challenges us to be more hospitable, helping us to strive to welcome everyone, without exception. We’re still learning and have a long way to go but I believe we’re moving in the right direction. All of our volunteer ministries aim to serve God, at Mass and in the wider community.

Participating in one of these ministries can, indeed should be enriching for us who serve too. I know how blessed I have been over my life, from a very tender age, by getting involved in my local parish. I used to help with Jumble Sales and May Fayres, Altar Serving and assembling the Crib and as a leader on the Don Bosco Camps, always getting back much more than I put in. I hope that those who serve in our parish volunteer ministries feel as blessed as I have been over the years. I really would like to thank you all for your kindness and generosity.

Serving in our parish and outreach ministries can benefit us (helping us become more like Jesus, growing spiritually and maturing as his followers, being instruments of his grace) and it can also benefit the Church (building up the Body of Christ, so we can grow healthier and stronger; bringing us to each other and increasing the impact we can have).

Maybe there are also some of you who belong to the parish but who aren’t currently serving. There might be lots of reasons for that but maybe for some of you it’s simply that you don’t know how to get involved. That’s why we’re launching our “First Serve” initiative this weekend. It’s an opportunity for those of you who aren’t yet volunteering to get a taste of serving in one of our ministries for just three months, with some basic training and supported by a mentor. At the end of the three months, we’d hope you will have had a good experience and that you’d stay on serving in that ministry or find another to which you’re better suited – but that’s up to you.

Would you be willing to try out one of these ministries?

- ❖ **Welcoming** – at any of our Masses;
- ❖ **Church cleaning**
- ❖ **Teas & Coffees** – offering hospitality after Mass at St. Gregory’s, St. Stephen’s, St. Thomas More or the 10:30am at St. Peter’s;
- ❖ **Reception Desk** – helping at the reception desk in our Pastoral Centre during the week;
- ❖ **Altar Servers** – if you’re under 18 and have made your First Holy Communion.
- ❖ **Something else** – *maybe you’d like to serve but just aren’t sure what or where or how?*

Jesus tells us that he came not to be served but to serve. As the Holy Spirit helps us to become more like Jesus, then our desire to serve others will also grow. It begins by allowing God to feel at home within us, with no room of our hearts out of bounds...

So, for example, if we want our parish to be a place of genuine Christian hospitality, we must be sure that our own hearts are hospitable dwelling places for the Blessed Trinity. Then, our smiles and words, our greetings and ministries, will radiate with the warmth of God’s love. And, our parish family will become at least a little bit like Heaven on earth.

Ascension Day – On Thursday 26th May, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. There will be masses at St Peter's Church at **7am, 12.15pm and 7pm**. St Gregory's Church will have Mass at 10am and Bishop Peter will celebrate Mass in Stockbridge (time and place to be confirmed at Mass on Sunday due to the redecoration of St Thomas More's taking place that week). There will be a Vigil Mass on **Wednesday 25th May at 7pm** in St Peter's Church.

Thy Kingdom Come- Novena to the Holy Spirit

The Great Feast of Pentecost will soon be upon us, when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit given to Mary and the Apostles, and so also to the early Church. After Ascension, which we celebrate this Thursday, those first disciples were told by Jesus not to leave Jerusalem but to wait there "for what the Lord had promised" (Acts 1:4). We too, then, are invited to "wait for what the Lord has promised us", namely the Holy Spirit. Please would you consider offering a Novena to the Holy Spirit from Friday 27th May to Saturday 4th June for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us as individuals, upon our parish, our diocese and upon Winchester and the surrounding towns and villages.

On Friday 27th May and Monday 30th May – Wednesday 1st June, we will include the Novena Prayer as part of Morning Prayer and Adoration. It will also be included during the morning Mass on Saturday 28th May and Thursday 2nd – Saturday 4th June and during Night Prayer on Sunday 28th May. This gives us the wonderful opportunity to pray the Novena together, either in person or online. Please join us if you can; otherwise pray the novena by yourself at home. Thy Kingdom Come is a global prayer movement, which invites Christians around the world to pray during this same period for more people to come to know Jesus Christ. As Catholics, we can support this initiative with our Pentecost Novena, Prayer of the Faithful and an encouragement for us to pray, as we normally do, with the particular intention for our loved ones to come to faith in Jesus Christ.

Pope John XXIII's 'invocation' prayer:

Renew your wonders in this our day, as by a new Pentecost. Grant to your Church that, being of one mind and steadfast in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and following the lead of Blessed Peter, it may advance the reign of our Divine Saviour, the reign of truth and justice, the reign of love and peace. Amen. Come Holy Spirit, in your power and might to renew the face of the earth. Holy Spirit, awaken the whole human race and help us to build bridges of trust that open our hearts to the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Winchester Pentecost 2022 - This wonderful ecumenical service is taking place on **Sunday 5 June**, rounding off 'Thy Kingdom Come', a 9 day season (between Ascension & Pentecost) during which believers across the nation are encouraged to pray for the coming of the Spirit, and specifically for five friends who do not know Jesus. Parish Retreat - Friday 27th May, 7pm – 9m and Saturday 28th May, 9am – 5pm

The last two years and effects of Covid may have taken their toll on us and left us wondering who we are.

Our parish retreat will help us to reflect on our journey, as we take stock and look back to where we have come from. This reflection helps us to get our bearings and see more clearly who we are now and how God speaking in our lives today. From that place, we look ahead to how God might be calling us for this next season. The retreat has three distinct but connected sections: past (Friday evening), present (Saturday morning), and future (Saturday afternoon) which we will explore over the course of our time together.

Altar Server Training



LIVE SIMPLY: REDUCE HEATING COSTS

We are all aware of the need to reduce our reliance on fossil fuels. The Ukraine war has exposed the fragility of our dependence on them. Rising energy costs have forced a lot of people to think hard about how heating bills can be reduced. There is a sense of relief as we enter the warmer months, but real fear about how we will keep our houses heated if prices rise steeply again in October. Do you know about the Winchester Area Super Homes project? You can get advice from an accredited professional on how your home could be retrofitted to increase insulation and reduce your heating bills. Subsidies are available for some groups. More information can be found on the WINACC website here: <https://www.winacc.org.uk/what-we-do/campaigns-2/wash-home/> Martin Lewis’ money saving expert website has a guide on reducing your energy costs: <https://www.moneysavingexpert.com/utilities/energy-saving-myths/> Many people will be thinking about turning their heating down or off to save on bills. Staying warm can be very important for both your physical and mental health. Again, Martin Lewis recommends a number of ways to ‘heat the person not the home’. This includes: wearing layers of clothes; eat a hot meal eat least once a day; keep your feet warm; try using a hot water bottle inside a sleeping bag; and a range of small heat-saving devices. If you have run into financial difficulties as a result of rising household bills, support may be available from the St Vincent de Paul society, Christians Against Poverty and the Citizens Advice Bureau.


