The Most Holy Trinity - Year C

Trinity Sunday – The Truth of How Much God Loves You

Fr Mark writes:

Little Nutbrown Hare wanted to be sure that Big Nutbrown Hare was listening. "Guess how much I love you," he said.

"I love you right up to the MOON," he said, and closed his eyes.

"Oh, that's far," said Big Nutbrown Hare. "That is very, very far."
Then Big Nutbrown Hare lay down close by Little Nutbrown Hare and whispered with a smile, "I love you right up to the moon – AND BACK."

Think of someone you love – and then stretch out your hands to show how much you love them. How wide will you stretch out your hands?



Now ask God how much he loves you and see how wide he stretches out his hands. Then look at the cross and you will see how wide he stretches them.

God is a God of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness.

Is that the image you have of God? Do you relate to God as a tender God? A compassionate God? A God who is slow to anger? A God who is rich in kindness? Rich in faithfulness?

Because if you don't, and, for example, you think of God as ready to trip you up or send lightning bolts towards you, or one who punishes the innocent or wants you to suffer, then your image isn't of God at all, and it is time to let go of that false god.

God's essence, God's very being is Love. Not just sit around, piled up on a plate love but active, passionate, loving love. God is Love Loving – Unconditional, infinite, never-ending, life-giving Love Loving. That is God!

The Trinity is the revelation that God is Love. Now we get Love wrong if we think of it as a 'thing' – something we can possess or control. It is a relationship and it is a verb – we can only 'have' love by loving, by participating in a relationship of love. So, the Trinity is Love Loving – dynamic, unfathomable, inexhaustible, eternally complete and creative. Yet, here is the great wonder. We only know this because the Father gives Himself to be known in His Son and the Son gathers us into this eternal self-giving through and in the Spirit. In other words, the fact that we can speak at all about God as Trinity is already a sign that we are beginning to participate in God's Triune life: we know and experience that the Trinity is Love Loving us. This is what we call grace. The whole of the Church's liturgy lives out of this knowledge. It is our act of love, both a confession and a proclamation – 'a great cry of wonder' – that in loving us the Trinity takes us into these relations of life, so that we learn again how to love by participating in Love. Literally, by 'being-in-Love'. (Revd Dr James Hanvey SJ)

So, if you want to look for God, you need to look for Love Loving. "Wherever there is Love" said St. Augustine, "there is God."

For God loved the world (and that doesn't just mean everyone else, that means you, and not just you but the person next to you, and the murderer, and the terrorist), God loved the world so so much that He gave His only Son...

Those of you who have children might be able to empathise here even more than me. Can you think of a cause or a person you love enough to be able to hand over your own child in order to aid that cause? Can you think how much God must love you to be willing to hand over his Son, his only Son?

God gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not be lost but may have eternal life.

Today's Feast invites us to ask do we believe in God? And another way of asking that is to ask, do you believe in Love?

There are plenty of people who don't believe in Love, and plenty who claim not to. We're not talking sentimental, slushy, mushy love here, by the way, but hard-hitting, sacrificial, never-giving-up Love. And this isn't just a rhetorical question, one to muse over whilst watching the footie or flicking through the Sunday supplement. Do you live your life in such a way that shows and demonstrates that you believe in Love? Do you allow yourself to be-in-Love? Will you let the Spirit lead you more deeply into the Truth of God's Love?

"Guess how much I love you?" God asks you. "And he stretched out his arms and died."

Do you want to participate in this life of receiving and giving love, in the rhythms of God's very own life? Do you wish to be-in-Love? Are you willing to let go and love Love Loving?



Through Him, with Him, in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, All Glory and honour is yours Almighty Father, Forever and ever. Amen.



Food Waste This week we are looking at food waste and how to prevent it. These tips will save wasting food and save money. The average family wastes £470 worth of food per year. The annual cost for UK equates to £50 million per year.

Understanding the labels

Friends of the Earth have a really good website looking at labels. In summary a use by date is about safety and storage instructions and must be followed carefully.

Best Before Dates (BBE =Best before the end)are about quality and texture. The food will be safe to eat, but the taste and flavour may not be as good. The Best Before Date will only be accurate if the foods have been stored correctly so read the instructions on the package. You can use the "sniff test". Use your sensory organs to see if the food is safe to eat. Look for visible signs such as mould on bread, stale taste of biscuits and a sour smell to dairy foods.

Plan Meals ahead

Get into the habit of checking what you already have before you go shopping and only buy what you need for the meals you have planned. Dont forget to contribute to Food Banks; they are needed more than ever these days!

Currently, our children are learning in R.E. about the Feast of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples after Jesus had ascended into Heaven, and the mission Jesus gave to his disciples. Our youngest will learn that the Holy Spirit came at Pentecost and Jesus' promise to his disciples. They will also learn that we celebrate the birthday of the church at Pentecost.

Meanwhile, those who are slightly older learn about the Holy Spirit during Mass, as well as thinking about how the Good News shaped the lives of different saints and our lives today.

Finally, our older children learn about the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit and how they impact on our lives today. Also, they will be thinking about the importance of the Sacrament of Confirmation.
