Christian Hospitality

Fr Anthony writes:

What typically comes to mind when we think or hear the word hospitality? For some the word may bring to mind a hospital, or the hospitality of the industry (hotels). Both would be appropriate associations. In both hospitals and hotels, a guest or patient is offered a place to sleep and food to eat. But biblical hospitality is more than a room and board, it requires love and not just duty.

In today's readings, two very famous hospitality parts of the Old and New Testaments given us are joined together, and there's about one thousand eight hundred years between Jesus and Abraham. The two passages reveal to us that God wants to dwell within each of us personally, intimately—as the mysterious guests once visited Abraham's tent, as Jesus once entered the home of Mary and Martha.

Reflecting on the readings of today, Scott Hahn writes 'By his hospitality in this week's First Reading, Abraham shows us how we are to welcome the Lord into our lives. His selfless service of his divine guests (see Hebrews 13:1) stands in contrast to the portrait of Martha drawn in this week's Gospel. Where Abraham is concerned only for the well-being of his guests, Martha speaks only of herself—"Do you not care that my sister has left me by myself...? Tell her to help me." Jesus' gentle rebuke reminds us that we risk missing the divine in the mundane, that we can fall into the trap of believing that God somehow needs to be served by human hands (see Acts 17:25).

Our Lord comes to us not to be served but to serve (see Matthew 20:28). He gave His life that we might know the one thing we need, the "better part," which is life in the fellowship of God. Jesus is the true Son promised today by Abraham's visitors (see Matthew 1:1). In Him, God has made an everlasting covenant for all time; He has made us blessed descendants of Abraham (see Genesis 17:19, 21; Romans 4:16–17, 19–21). The Church now offers us this covenant, bringing to completion the word of God, the promise of His plan of salvation, what Paul calls "the mystery hidden for ages."

James Lewis' Ordination Saturday 16th July



James Lewis spent his extended pastoral placement year in our Parish as a seminarian, from autumn 2018, and very quickly became a popular member of the community: he was known to everyone in no time at all, and was much-loved. He got involved in all areas of Parish life - from being a member of Fr Mark's Senior Leadership Team to youth ministry and the Confirmation group - and of course table-tennis! James is an accomplished musician (clarinettist) and he assisted in enhancing our liturgies when he joined our musicians. He was invited everywhere, and loved to visit groups, and the school. He also organized a memorable bus trip up to London. His deep faith was as apparent as his smiling manner, and everyone has known all along that he will make a wonderful priest. He was ordained a Deacon a year ago - and in a very James touch, he didn't want our Parish to make a big fuss then, because he didn't want to deflect attention from those being ordained to the priesthood at the same time. So we did as he asked - but now we really have the chance to celebrate with him, so we hope as many of you as possible will come along - Ordination in Portsmouth Cathedral (11am), First Mass in St Peter's at 10.30 am Sunday, and Parish party in the grounds immediately afterwards.

As once He came to Abraham, Martha, and Mary, Christ now comes to each of us in Word and Sacrament. As we sing in this week's Psalm: He will make His dwelling with those who keep His Word and practice justice (see also John 14:23).

If we do these things, we will not be anxious or disturbed. We will not have our Lord taken from us. We will wait on the Lord, who told Abraham and who tells each of us: "I will surely return to you." We express our congratulations to James on his ordination and wish him well in his future ministry as our new Diocesan Priest.
