Vanity of vanities, all is vanity

Fr Anthony writes:

Vanity of vanities, all is vanity. This is a common assertion that we might be familiar with. While others might have had occasions to give an absolute *assent* to it, others might still have made a *notional assent*. Just a week ago, I was brutally forced to cry out in desperation after receiving the news about the untimely death of a fellow young priest back in Cameroon. Fr Didymus was turning 35 and was barely three years ordained. He was returning from receiving his American visa, where he was going to further his education when he collided with an on-coming truck and died on the spot. I was devastated when I got the news, and the words of the Qohelet came to me, 'Vanity of vanities, all is vanity'. He was a young, intelligent, hardworking and dedicated priest with whom I spent about seven years in the seminary. He had plans for himself, but now everything seemed shattered. His shocking death invited me to ask crucial questions about my own life.

The readings of this Sunday warn us about the futility of the greedy acquisition of wealth and power since they are all ephemeral. Everything and everyone is here today and gone tomorrow. However, the temptation to harden our hearts in subtle but no less disastrous ways persists. For instance, putting our trust in possessions, squabbling over earthly inheritances, kidding ourselves that what we have we deserve, storing up treasures and thinking they will afford us security and rest.

Qohelet, in the first reading, reminds us that the greedy acquisition and hoarding of wealth is useless. He wonders what use wealth is when one dies and goes empty-handed while one's heir gains and squanders one's riches. It is a grim picture filled with a profound message to ponder. In today's gospel, Jesus calls the rich man a fool, a word used in the Old Testament for someone who rebels against God or has forgotten Him. Although his rich harvest was hard-earned, his concern was more about himself and his well-being than God and those whom God wanted to bless through him. The more God blessed him with a rich harvest; the more his heart rebelled against God instead of turning to God in praise and thanksgiving.

In the second reading, St Paul invites us to treasure the new life we have been given in Christ and seek what is above, the promised inheritance of heaven. We must see all things in the light of eternity, mindful that He who gives us the breath of life could at any moment—this night even—demand it back from us. He calls us to focus our thoughts on heavenly things, not on the things on the earth, because we have died, and now our lives are hidden with Christ in God.

While praising God for rescuing him, the Psalmist prays for the wisdom to know the shortness of life so that he may gain wisdom of the heart. This is the wisdom we need, dear brothers and sisters. The wisdom to know that we are on a pilgrimage. The wisdom to know what indeed is essential for our lives. The wisdom to know when to embark and when to refrain. The wisdom to know the will of God for us and the wisdom to walk in his ways. The wisdom to say no to the lures and pleasures of the world, flesh and Satan. Thus, today's readings in no way encourage us to be lazy but to gain wisdom of the heart and follow the ways of the Lord our God.
