A Book of Life

Fr Jean Patrice writes:

The Bible is most certainly a Book of Life. We can see that in the question posed to Jesus today, "Sir, will there only be a few saved?" It is a question that we will all ask at some point: "What will happen to me when I die? Will I go to heaven?"

In my time as a priest in a parish, I once came across a gentleman whose wife was a fervent believer. But although his wife and her mother prayed for him greatly, he never made the step of going beyond his baptism and living decisively in faith. He would come to the odd parish function, would happily help with some DIY around the church and presbytery, and was particularly friendly with an elderly priest who spoke to him about the Faith amongst other things.

However, at a still relatively sprightly age, he contracted cancer for which there would be no cure. His wife devoted herself to him night and day, and it was during this time that he spoke of being received into the Catholic Church. It turned out that he had listened well to the elderly priest, as he required little instruction and was able to be received into the Church in his house by his Parish Priest. He would then go into hospital and there receive the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion from the Hospital Chaplain. A day or so later, I offered to his wife to celebrate Mass for his intentions. They watched the Mass on the parish livestream from the hospital, and then I took them two Sacred Hosts that I had consecrated at that Mass. We were then able to have a short conversation. I then went to the Parish Church, where as in many places, there was a statue of Saint Anthony of Padua, where I asked the good Saint for his intercession (particularly as it was his Feast Day). As many people know, Saint Anthony is a powerful wonder worker. This gentleman duly died, fortified by the Sacraments in the presence of his wife the next day.

In the same way, we also have to be prepared for when we will leave this world, which is often at a time and place that we do not expect. The question, "Sir, will there only be a few saved?" is as relevant now as it was 2,000 years ago.

We all need to listen to the reply of Jesus, which, as often, is not a direct response, but one which invites the interlocutor an opportunity to process it, and come up with their own answer. The image of the narrow gate (or door) would have been familiar to his listeners as He was on His way to Jerusalem. This was a walled city, by which you could only access it through gates. Some of these were wide, which could allow a great number of people to enter, including those who were carried by animals such as dromedaries (camels). Others were narrow, and could only allow one or so pedestrians at a time. Furthermore, some gates could only be accessed by those who had received suitable initiation, they were not open to all.

It would not have been hard listening to Our Lord to understand what He was saying. He is inviting us not to simply follow the crowd, which can so often be wrong, particularly in things which offer a challenge of something new. Nor we should command others to carry us, and make no effort ourselves. But rather, we should choose the narrow gate, which involves thinking for ourselves, and be prepared to go against the majority opinion. We have to make our own effort to assist in our salvation. Of course, we cannot save ourselves (the classic heresy of Pelagius); that is the work of God; however He does not save us without

One of the best ways of cooperating in this effort for our salvation is quite simply to go to Mass. We have perhaps got out of the habit of our regular Sunday journey to the church, where we join with the community of believers in praising and worshipping God our Father. We speak of a Sunday Obligation simply because there is never a moment when He is not thinking of us and loving us. As we often watch a child responding with great love to their loving parent, in the same way, we respond to the infinite love of God our Father by our daily prayer, our community worship on the Lord's Day of Sunday, and our desire to be more and more like Him. We do this by reading and studying God's Word in the Bible, which teaches us how we should live in what we should and should not do. And Our Lord said that "if we have seen Him, then we have seen the Father", so we study the Gospel, and try to imitate Jesus in how He lived His life in self-giving, selfless offering of self for others.



I have started a new post of Catholic Chaplain to HMP Winchester, ministering to the men, who if even for a short time make up part of our parish population. Please keep them in your prayers, and pray for my ministry as I seek to bring the sacraments and the knowledge of God to help them in their quest to get through the narrow gate. We should always remember how often Our Lord speaks of forgiveness and mercy, which is why He ate with the sinners. This is a recurring theme with Pope Francis who often speaks of ministry to the margins, and in particular to prisoners. Please also consider if you would like to volunteer to help, either with the Sunday Mass (held on Saturday morning), and/or taking time to listen to the men. I will be also be doing some part-time parochial work in the Basingstoke area from October, but I am grateful to Fathers Mark and Anthony for welcoming me in the meantime. I look forward very much to meeting you all.

A gift for Fr Anthony - As you are no doubt aware, Fr Anthony will be leaving us at the beginning of September when he returns from his holiday. Fr Anthony originally came to our Diocese to study at Southampton University, where he gained his MSc in Education; now he has embarked on studying for a PhD in Education (again based on Education - where he is looking at inclusion in mainstream education). In his diocese, children with special needs do not yet have a chance to be educated. Some are still seen as curses to their families and are left hidden at home. Some are abused in all forms and there's no voice to advocate for them. Fr Anthony wants to be this voice. He wants to equip himself in Southampton University, so that he may lead this mission when he returns to Bamenda. His training will build his capacity to assist teachers

respond to the needs of these children. It has been our practice that when a priest moves to a new parish, we send him on his way with a gift. This time, it would be wonderful if we could help him financially in covering his fees for his PhD. He needs to fund one third personally (about £7,000) and he was supposed to have asked for support from the parish earlier - but he was too shy and proud to do so.

It would be wonderful if we could help him, and your gift will be very gratefully received. If you are able to contribute, you can make a donation by dropping an envelope (marked Fr. Anthony) into the collection bags at Mass; sending via the Parish Office or alternatively via Contactless at St. Peter's. Fr. Anthony will continue to need our prayers and we can be assured of his, as he moves on.
