Sharing the Joy of the Gospel step by step

## Fr Mark writes:

I like walking. I like cycling. I can sort of cope with running. I don't mind driving and I enjoy going on trains and planes. What I do struggle with, though, is being without a map. Road map, train map, ordinance survey map, google map. Or if not a map, then at least a sense of how long the journey will be, roughly where we're ending up and what I need to take with me for the journey ahead. For me at least, not knowing where I am on a journey can make it seem much longer than it really is and that can be exhausting.

In the Gospel readings over these weeks, we are accompanying Jesus on his journey, his "Way" to heaven. He's going there via Jerusalem and the Cross. Most of them don't really know where he is going but they are enjoying this part of the journey, the buzz, the thrill of being near this major celebrity...and he's trying to help those who want, or think they want, to follow him, to be his disciples...

Maybe you come to church and it just feels like there are all these things you're asked to do and maybe it's just a bit confusing or you just feel like we're asking you to keep all these plates spinning. If you've been around a while, maybe you have a sense of the Church making lots of requests, perhaps it even feels like I'm just nagging you all the time..? "One more thing he needs me to do..."

And then, of course, there are the reminders about the importance of the rules: going to confession, fasting before Mass, Holy Days of Obligation.

And yet, at another level, an intellectual level, a spiritual level, at the level of people's hearts and minds, we don't always know what these things are all about, where they fit in. Church-life can sometimes feel like a trip without direction, with no mile markers, no end in sight. Being a disciple of Jesus is about following Jesus, wherever he leads. It's a journey. And every journey is made of steps. And from time to time, I will try and bring to our attention some of those steps involved in following Jesus.

Because, as it turns out, following Jesus comes down to simple steps. They're not all easy (some are uphill, some downhill, some on the flat) but they are, in their own way, fairly simple.

These STEPS are important to take as ways and means by which Jesus can change us for the better, make us more like Him, transform us into his image and likeness, and then send us out as his missionary disciples.

In a sense, Jesus himself talked about STEPS. Time and again he would invite potential disciples by saying, "Follow me".

In other words, take some STEPS along the path I, Jesus, am calling you along...

Now, rather conveniently and completely naturally(!), STEPS is also an acronym:

**SERVE** – Jesus calls us to serve others. He said of Himself, "For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve." (Mark 10:45) To grow as a disciple of Jesus, to follow on his path, it is vitally important that we learn to serve others, generously and freely. Christ-like disciples serve for the benefit of others. Isn't that the sort of person that in your heart of hearts you want to be – someone who makes a positive difference in the lives of others..?

**TRUST** – Jesus needs us to trust in him. In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus makes it clear, for example, that we cannot put all our trust in money and God – we have to choose. "Do not let your hearts be troubled," he says to his disciples at the last supper, "Trust in God still and trust in me." Jesus showed his complete trust in God by giving his life on the cross and there's nothing that will help us to grow in trust as much as giving. God is a generous giver and we are called to become more like Him.

**ENGAGE** – faith is personal but it's not supposed to be private. It needs to be lived out in a community of people. We all need friends in faith who strengthen and support us in our relationship with Christ. We need people around us who can encourage us. That's what our Acorn Groups try to help us with.

**PRAYER** (and the Sacraments) – to grow as a follower of Jesus we need to talk to Him and listen. We need to learn to hear his voice and recognise it. That happens in a daily time of quiet in which we're talking to Him and allowing Him to talk to us. That happens in our weekly worship at Church when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist.

**SHARING** – God so loved the world that He gave us His only Son. God wants us to share in the fullness of his divine life of unconditional, free, underserved, infinite Love. That is not just good news, it's The Good News, which we need to learn to share appropriately in order that our faith grows and we allow others to hear that message and experience God's love.

For some people, life is a trip with no direction, with no mile markers, no end in sight. That's a very difficult way to choose to live your life. Just before he begins his journey to heaven, via Jerusalem and the Cross, Jesus says:

'If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me.'

Discipleship is simply following the Lord, step by step...

A little bit more today than yesterday;

A little bit more tomorrow than today.

And as we take these STEPS to follow Jesus better, we will also find more of that love and peace and joy that He alone can offer us.
