Carrying Mats in Faith

Fr Mark writes:

Many of you will have heard me talking, many times, about my vision for the parish as one where we all act as “Mat Carriers”, bringing people to Jesus just like the four friends who once brought their paralysed friend to him on a stretcher. Imagine if this were a parish in which all our parishioners had the faith and courage and perseverance to overcome all obstacles and barriers to bring others to Jesus, knowing that he can offer them healing. Imagine if this were a parish in which each of us had the humility to accept that we too have times when we need healing, when we need to allow others to bring us to Jesus in faith.

The truth is that everybody has a mat. Maybe it’s a temper you can’t control; or a fear you cannot drown out; or an inability to trust; or the dis-ease of busyness...

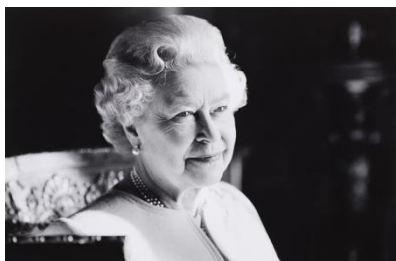
There are so many people in our world right now in need of healing in so many ways – physically, spiritually, mentally, emotionally, socially – and Jesus spent so much of his short public life offering that healing to those who came to him. This was true before the pandemic and it’s even more true now as the anxiety starts to subside and our hurts and pains are given space to surface...

Jesus had great solidarity with those who were “on the peripheries”, marginalised. We see it time and time again in the Gospels and we see it in this weekend’s passage, the story of Lazarus and the anonymous rich man. When the story is read from the perspective of God’s kingdom, an inversion occurs. Those who according to the criteria of power and social prestige are most important find themselves anonymous before God. Those who are considered insignificant and nameless in this world are the ones who are known by name to the God of the Kingdom. Are we able to make the hurt, the wounded, the Lazarus first in our building up of the Church..?

“Fr Abraham” makes it clear that the rich man and his peers have the Word of God to listen to. None of us can use ignorance as an excuse to be blind to the needs of our brothers and sisters.

Queen Elizabeth II RIP – Woman of Faith

Many of us will have witnessed the powerful and beautiful funeral service for Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II this week. As we come to terms with the death of our dear and late monarch, many will remember her amazing qualities. Much has been said about Her Majesty’s joy-filled smile, her poise, her dignity and grace – not to mention her wisdom, resilience and confidence. We can call to mind her serenity and humility, her ability to treat all as of interest. Always keen to connect with others, she was extraordinary!



Much has also been spoken about the Queen’s Christian faith, although not always making the connection that it was this faith which enabled her to be the person she was. The Queen believed in and trusted in God and was unafraid to show this to the nation.

Reading at St Peter's

The teaching of reading is at the core of all learning at St Peter's. It is our aim to produce an environment where the children are enthusiastic, capable readers who love books. A range of texts encourage reading with confidence, fluency, vocabulary development and understanding.

How do we teach reading?

Children are taught phonics from the start of Reception and our staff are experts in early reading. In Reception and Key Stage 1 home reading books are chosen in line with phonics and are matched to the sounds that the children know thus consolidating phoneme learning. The content and sequence of *Letters and Sounds* supports progress which is taught through the Little Wandle Phonics programme.

In addition, the children are encouraged to read for pleasure choosing books from the class and school libraries. Staff foster a love of reading as they share class texts, introduce new books and revisit old favourites. Foundation stage, KS1 and Year 3 have access to the online resource “Collins Big Cat”, both at school and at home, to support the development of reading using decodable books.

Home Reading

The children in KS2 need to be reading each evening for the minimum of fifteen minutes. What they are reading at home needs to be recorded on a Home Reading Log. They need to be available for class teachers to monitor each week. Some children in Key Stage 2 choose their own reading books. These books can be books from home or school. There are lots of useful tips for Home Reading on our website.

In KS1, children will bring home a book they have worked on with an adult: first decoding the text, then reading with meaning and expression as well as working on comprehension. Their reading of the book with you should be a celebration of the work they have done in school where they are able to show you that they can read the text with confidence. In order to encourage your child to become a lifelong reader, it is important that they learn to read for pleasure. Each week your child will also bring home library books. These are books they have chosen for you to enjoy together.

From Years 1-6, Guided Reading is carefully planned and taught to the whole class. The texts can vary from those chosen in line with English learning or other texts chosen to engage the children. This practice lends itself to word reading, the learning of phonics/spelling and comprehension. Texts can be ‘unpicked’, new language introduced and reading strategies practised. Pupils who struggle are supported through well planned interventions and supported to catch up quickly.

In addition to this, the children are regularly read to by their teacher and are encouraged to read for pleasure whenever the opportunity arises. Regular visits to the well-stocked school library, class libraries and texts brought in from home, allow the children to be surrounded by interesting and informative reading material.
