Thirty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

He is God, not of the dead, but of the living.

Fr Mark writes:

Some years ago, two police officers were driving along a nondescript road in Denmark when they noticed something odd about the motorbike in front. Something was obviously not right with the way the motorbike was being driven. So they pulled the motorcyclist over and asked the young driver and his passenger to dismount. Imagine their shock when they discovered that the passenger was none other than the young man's dead father. For two days, the young man had been so grief-stricken at his father's passing that he felt unable to do anything at all. He stayed in his house with his father's corpse. Finally, he decided to take his dad for one last ride on his motorbike. So he strapped his father's body onto the back of the bike and off they went for a farewell drive.

My heart went out to that young man when I heard that story the first time. He was doing what he felt he could in the face of the terrible finality of death, which is the one non-negotiable reality for each of us.

Today's readings confront us with the question of what death is — and what comes after. And that question is important because it helps us to shape how we live in the present. So, in the first reading, which we also heard last weekend for our Patronal Feast of the Blessed Winchester Martyrs, those seven brothers were able to endure terrible hardship because of their faith in God's ability to raise them up after death. Their belief in the resurrection enabled them to remain true to their identity, to their values, to their God.

In the Gospel, the Sadducees, who believed that there is no afterlife, dragged up a little-used law about marrying your dead brother's wife in order to ridicule Jesus' belief in the resurrection of the dead. That law was designed to ensure that a man's name lived on after his death. Jesus says that for those who belong to God, there is no need for such devices to try to cheat death. Those who have died and "are judged worthy" are living with God, where there is no need to think of marrying and having children to try to preserve your name or to carry on the human race. Why? Quite simply, because there is no more death. Those who are worthy are living a new kind of life, eternal life, as sons and daughters of God. Death has no more power over them. Jesus is crystal clear: this life is not the end. God wants us to live in God's presence for ever.

Critics may regard this month of prayer for the Holy Souls as a Catholic version of what that young motorcyclist did — they may think that in the face of death, we seem unable to let go of our loved ones. In fact, no matter how deep our grief, this month of prayer is an affirmation of our faith in the power of God's love, which is stronger than death. It is an expression of our hope in the resurrection: that just as God our Father raised Christ from the dead, so he will raise all those who belong to him. It is an expression of our continuing love for those who have share with us some of this earthly pilgrimage.

But what difference does faith in the resurrection actually make in our lives? Sometimes religious people are accused of being so heavenly minded that they are of no earthly use – they disengage from this world's problems and just focus on churchy matters. That's not where faith in the resurrection should lead us.

A Christian charity engaged in practical help for those who are poor once ran a series of adverts with the slogan: "We believe in life before death." Our belief in the resurrection shows us that to God, life is absolutely important. God created us for life, not death. God is God of the living, Jesus tells us, and what we do with our life determines our future life with God. To believe in the God of Abraham is to believe in the God who wants all to live. And it means that we will strive to defend life and oppose everything that diminishes life or robs people of life in any way – whether such attacks come in the form of physical violence or oppression, illness or lack of education, or economic injustice and inequality.

Faith in the resurrection led the seven brothers to resist an evil king. It led Jesus to the cross. For Christians, it leads us to cherish life in the here and now and to defend life for all – especially those whose quality of life is most threatened.

Faith in the resurrection can perhaps also help us to prepare ourselves and our loved ones for the time when we need to say goodbye, in other words for our own death or for that of someone important to us. Death can come upon us in all sorts of different ways, sometimes very suddenly. There are times, though, when we do get chance to prepare ourselves – when we are told that we or someone we love only has a matter of time left to live. In these circumstances, there are things we can do to help prepare ourselves for dying. The church in our country has available a website to help us do just that. It is called "The Art of Dying Well" and it is a modernised version of a Medieval Manuscript, Ars Moriendi – https://www.artofdyingwell.org Why not spend a little time this November looking at this site?



St Anne's Catholic School and Sixth Form College remains Outstanding!

Local Catholic school St Anne's has been judged to be Outstanding for the second time in a row. Ofsted inspectors returned to the school and sixth form college for two days in September 2022, six years after the school's previous visit, and reconfirmed the top judgement against a new, more stringent framework under which the number of Outstanding schools is expected to halve nationally.

Headteacher, James Rouse said: "We are delighted that St Anne's has been found to be Outstanding by Ofsted yet again, and the report reflects the continued success of the whole St Anne's community. Ever since our last inspection, we have refused to rely on past glory but continued to strive to be the best that we can be every day for the sake of our current and future pupils. As the report says, we are always looking for ways to make things better. As a result, we continue to ensure the pupils in our school get the very best learning experience."

Inspectors described the school as a "lively, diverse and inclusive school" where "pupils are well cared for and have excellent opportunities". Staff described to inspectors how they felt "valued" and "love working" at the school. The report describes how "parents are very positive about their experience, describing the school as 'amazing' and 'wonderful'".
