Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Four Last Things.

Fr Mark writes:

The central theme of today's readings is "The Day of the Lord" or the "Second Coming" of Jesus in glory, as Judge, at the end of the world. The readings warn us about the final days of the world, our own death, and the final judgment. They give us an opportunity to reflect a little on what the Church calls, "The Four Last things", namely death, judgment, heaven and hell.

Death

Last weekend I spoke about how we might prepare ourselves for our own death. I wanted to share with you this beautiful and powerful prayer that a priest may offer in the final hours of someone's life, handing over the soul of our loved one into the loving hands of God, who alone can help and save him or her... It's called the Commendation of the dying:

Go forth, Christian soul, from this world
in the name of God the almighty Father,
who created you,
in the name of Jesus Christ, the Son of the living God,
who suffered for you,
in the name of the Holy Spirit,
who was poured out upon you.

Go forth, faithful Christian!
May you live in peace this day,
may your home be with God in Zion,
with Mary, the virgin Mother of God,
with Joseph, and all the angels and saints....
May you return to your Creator
who formed you from the dust of the earth.
May holy Mary, the angels, and all the saints
come to meet you as you go forth from this life....
May you see your Redeemer face to face.

Judgement

Our faith tells us that we will all face judgement by Christ, the Good Shepherd. There will be the particular and unchangeable judgement at the moment of our death; and then the final and universal reckoning at the end of time, when Christ will come again to judge the living and the dead.

So ask God for his mercy; his help to put your life in order. Make a regular examination of conscience and make a regular confession.

Hell

Does Hell really exist if we have a merciful God? Is it full or empty? St. Thomas Aquinas thought that one of the pleasures of heaven was to watch the torture of those in hell! On the other hand, the so-called "universalist" position is that everyone will be saved and so no one is in hell. Von Balthasar – one of Pope St. John Paul II's favourite theologians – held a view that "we may reasonably hope that all will be saved". This seems like a reasonable view to me!

When the Church says that Hell exists, it means that the ultimate rejection of God's love is a real possibility. "Hell" or "Gehenna" are spatial metaphors for the lonely and sad condition of having completely refused the offer of the divine life. But is there anyone in this state of being? We don't know for sure. We are in fact permitted to hope and to pray that all people will finally surrender to the alluring beauty of God's grace.

Think of God's life as a party to which everyone is invited, and think of Hell as the sullen corner into which someone who resolutely refuses to join the fun has sadly slunk. In fact, the great poet Dante, pictured Satan / Lucifer, not as scary and powerful with a great pitchfork as in much hallowe'en costumes but as sulking in a corner, turned in on himself (for that is what sin makes us do).

What this image helps us to understand is that language which suggests that God "sends" people to Hell is misleading. As C.S. Lewis put it so memorably: the door that closes one into Hell (if there is anyone there) is locked from the inside not from the outside. The existence of Hell as a real possibility is a corollary of two more fundamental convictions, namely, that God is love and that human beings are free. The divine love, freely rejected, results in suffering.

And yet, we may, indeed we should, hope that God's grace will, in the end, wear down the even the most stubborn sinner.

Heaven

We do know that heaven is beyond all understanding and description and so we need images - life, light, peace, a wedding feast, the wine of the kingdom, the Father's house with many rooms, the heavenly Jerusalem, paradise – to help us understand. For "no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him."

Purgatory

"There will be few people whose lives are pure and fulfilled in all respects. And, we would hope, there will be few people whose lives have become an irredeemable and total No. For the most part, the longing for good has remained, despite many breakdowns, in some sense determinative.

God can pick up the broken pieces and make something of them. In any case, we need a final cleansing, a cleansing by fire, to be exact, in which the gaze of Christ, so to say, burns us free from everything, and only under this purifying gaze are we, as it were, fit to be with God and able, then, to make our home with him... I think it is something very human. I would go so far as to say that if there was no purgatory, then we would have to invent it, for who would dare say of himself that he was able to stand directly before God. And yet we don't want to be, to use an image from Scripture, "a pot that turned out wrong," that has to be thrown away; we want to be able to be put right.

Purgatory basically means that God can put the pieces back together again. That he can cleanse us in such a way that we are able to be with him and can stand there in the fullness of life. Purgatory strips off from one person what is unbearable and from another the inability to bear certain things, so that in each of them a pure heart is revealed, and we can see that we all belong together in one enormous symphony of being."

The Letter: a message for our earth

More than 60 members of the parish and other churches and organisations in Winchester attended the 2 showings of this film in the Parish Centre last Sunday. Produced by the Vatican, this was an invitation from the Pope to hear the powerful messages from those in the poorest countries suffering from the impact of damaging climate change now. "Nature is screaming" the Pope said and the "tower of human arrogance" in our attitude to the earth needs to be challenged. It is our children and grandchildren's generation who will suffer the impact: the young people he invited to the Vatican recognised this. But everyone can do something now, however small, to reduce the damage we have caused to the world God created for us.

WE can **Refuse** to support activities that damage the environment.

Think about everything you buy -do you need it? Is there an alternative?

WE can **Reduce** our use of harmful products and products that are not easy to recycle.
