OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

*Christ the King.*

## Fr Mark writes:

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, the sixteenth centenary of the Council of Nicaea at which the doctrine of the consubstantiality of Christ with the Father was defined. The Feast was moved, in the calendar reforms of the Second Vatican Council, to the final Sunday of the liturgical year, in a period of the Church's liturgy when we reflect on the 'end times' and the second coming of Jesus as Lord and King.

The Pope asserted that the most effective defence against the destructive forces of the age is the recognition of the Universal Kingship of Christ. He alone is to be our supreme ruler and our Scripture readings help us to understand what sort of a King Jesus is.

In our Gospel this Sunday, we find Jesus on the Cross, with people looking at him and many mocking and laughing at him. It's not the usual way to think of a King. Only one person speaks up for Jesus. Only one person takes the risk of defending him. Only one person there talks about Jesus as King. It's one of the thieves who is on a cross beside Jesus.

'Jesus,' he said 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.'

What sort of a king does he think Jesus is? What about you – do you believe that Jesus is a king? What sort of a king? How can Jesus come into his kingdom if he's dead? Why do you think the "good thief" asks Jesus to 'remember him'? Would you like Jesus to remember you?

Do you think the 'good thief' trusted Jesus?

Pope Francis invites us to trust in Him:

'Trust the memory of God: his memory is not a "hard disk" that "saves" and "archives" all our data, his memory is a heart filled with tender compassion, one that finds joy in "erasing" in us every trace of evil.'

Jesus replies:

'Indeed, I promise you,' Jesus replied 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

This is the promise of a King, of one with authority. Jesus is a man of His Word. Are you able to believe in the promises of Jesus? What are those promises?

Pope Francis invites us to believe in Jesus:

'As far as Jesus is concerned – as the Gospel shows – no one is unworthy of, or far from his thoughts. No one is insignificant. He loves all of us with a special love: for him all of us are important: you are important.'

We trust in Jesus, that he loves us;

We **surrender** all our worries, our fears, all our burdens and sins, all our shame and guilt, into the loving hands of Jesus;

We **believe** in him as the Son of God who has power to forgive sins.

But, for us, there is one step more – we need to **receive and share**: receive our freedom and the joy which God wants to offer us and share it with others, taking it out into our world...

Each of us has been anointed with holy oil at baptism, as priest, prophet and king. The *responsibility* of a king is to care for his subjects, which is why we are obliged to care for our fellow humans and indeed all creation. How far that responsibility takes one can then be seen in the King of the Universe, who is simultaneously the ruler of all and the servant of all. He rules in triumph; and he rules from the Cross.

Pope Francis again:

*'Following Jesus demands a good dose of courage, a readiness to trade in the sofa for a pair of walking shoes and to set out on new and uncharted paths.'*

*'The joy that you have freely received from God, please, freely give away (cf Mt 10:8): so many people are waiting for it! So many are waiting for it from you.'*

## **World Youth Sunday**

In November 2020, Pope Francis called for a relaunch of World Youth Day (previously celebrated annually on Palm Sunday) and moving forward asks the global Catholic community to celebrate locally on the Solemnity of Christ the King.

It is a day for the world to recognise, celebrate and pray with and for young people in our local church communities, whether that be through school, at home, or of course in church.

Let us thank God for the young people and children in our parish and for all those who love and care for them. Let us pray that young and not-so-young alike can safely listen to and learn from each other, as we accompany one another on our pilgrimage towards the fullness of God's Kingdom.

**WHAT IS THE CATHOLIC CHURCH'S INVOLVEMENT IN COP 27?**

The COP27 conference in Egypt comes to an end on Friday 18 November.

The conference was addressed by Cardinal Pietro Parolin, Holy See secretary of state, who pointed out that for the first time the Holy See was participating as a state party to both the convention and the Paris Agreement. He went on to say:

'This important step is consistent with Pope Francis' announcement in 2020 that the Holy See would commit to the goal of net zero emissions, responding at two levels: first, the Vatican City State committed to reducing net emissions to zero before 2025 through intensifying its efforts to improve its environmental management, efforts that have already been in place for a number of years; and second, the Holy See is dedicated to promoting education in integral ecology. Indeed, political, technical and operational measures are not enough; they must be combined with an educational approach that promotes new lifestyles while fostering a new pattern of development and sustainability based on care, fraternity and co-operation as humankind, and on the strengthening of the covenant between human beings and the environment'.
