# Lift Up Your Eyes and Welcome the One He has promised us

#### Fr Mark writes:

Aspicients a longe, ecce video Dei potentiam venientem: et nebulum totam terram regentem. Ite obviam ei et dicite nuncio nobis sit u es ipse qui regaturus es in populo Israel?

I look from afar:

And behold, I see God coming in power, And a cloud covering the whole earth. Go out to meet him and say: Tell us, are you the One that is to come Who is to reign over your people Israel?

(2nd Responsory for Office of Readings, Sunday Advent Week 1)

We enter now into the last week of Advent, almost able to "see" Christmas ahead of us. There is a shift in our readings and prayers too. We have been "looking from afar" for the One who has been promised us through the Old Testament prophecies, and now we begin to get ready to go out and welcome him.

Let's have a brief glance at the prayers and readings for the weekend...

#### **Entrance antiphon**

Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Saviour.

What a beautiful and powerful image – Jesus being "rained down" upon us from the heavens! Can we lift up our eyes to recognise him and to be ready to welcome him like the rains in a dry, weary land..?

#### **First Reading**

"The maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son, whom she will call 'Immanuel', a name which means 'God-is-with-us'".

As we sing, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel", can we sing it sincerely, from the depth of our hearts, truly welcoming him as he comes to ransom us from our sins and prejudices, as he did for captive Israel?

#### <u>Psalm</u>

Let the Lord enter! He is the King of glory.

As we lift up our eyes and see the Lord, will we let Him enter? Is He welcome as Lord of our hearts, our lives, our homes, our parish? Will we let Him take His place as King of glory?

#### <u>Gospel – Creator Spirit</u>

Mary, betrothed to Joseph, was "found to be with child" through the Holy Spirit.

God had taken flesh in the womb of Mary and was truly with his people. This was made possible by the working of the Holy Spirit, the Creator Spirit, as we profess in the Creed: by the Holy Spirit [He] was incarnate of the Virgin Mary.

St. Paul speaks of "a letter from Christ delivered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts" (2 Cor 3:3). The Holy Spirit wrote this marvellous letter- the letter that is Christ, and is above all in Mary's heart. The famous saying, also by Augustine, that "Mary conceived Christ first in her heart and then in her body" ("prius concepit mente quam corpore") means that the Holy Spirit worked in Mary's heart, illuminating it and inflaming it with Christ even before filling her womb with Christ.

#### St. Bonaventure, writes,

When she gave her consent to him, the Holy Spirit came upon her like a divine fire inflaming her soul and sanctifying her flesh in perfect purity. But the power of the Most High overshadowed her (Luke 1:35) so that she could endure such a fire. . . . Oh, if you could feel in some way the quality and intensity of that fire sent from heaven, the refreshing coolness that accompanied it, the consolation it imparted; if you could realize the great exaltation of the Virgin Mother, the ennobling of the human race, the condescension of the divine majesty, . . . then I am sure you would sing in sweet tones with the Blessed Virgin that sacred hymn: My soul magnifies the Lord.

Mary was the model of a soul who is "aglow with the Spirit" (Rom 12:11). The Annunciation was her Pentecost. All this was possible because, so to speak, she "lifted up her eyes" to the Angelic messenger and made welcome the One who had been promised to us.

#### <u>Bishop Philip – Pastoral Letter</u>

This weekend we will be reading at all our Masses a Pastoral Letter from Bishop Philip. He has a gift for us by way of a prayer book, *Lord I am not worthy*, as well as a reminder of the "six holy habits" he spoke of in the last letter. Finally, he will also officially announce something I've been speaking about recently...be sure to listen out for what he has to say.

### <u>Angelus</u>

The Collect, or "Opening Prayer" this weekend will be familiar to those of us who pray the *Angelus*. Maybe that prayer is a good way to end this thought, inviting you to pray from the depth of your being that God will pour his grace into your heart this week.

Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts, that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection. Through the same Christ, Our Lord. Amen.

#### **INVITATION FROM Fr MARK TO BE PART OF CHRISTMAS**



Advent Reconciliation Service (St. Peter's, Winchester, 7pm, Mon 19th Dec) Fr Mark says: I encourage you to celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation this Monday evening, 19th Dec, 7pm. We will have a short, prayerful service, followed by the opportunity for individual confession and absolution. I am asking you to come because I believe there is a great joy to be found in this personal encounter with Jesus through the sacrament. I want you to leave feeling lighter, with a spring in your step, ready for Christmas. And it doesn't cost a penny! (Note: no confessions on Sat 24<sup>th</sup>).

Blue Christmas Service (St. Peter's, Winchester, 11am, Weds 21st Dec) For many people, there are split emotions as Christmas approaches. Some of us feel keenly the pain of loss, bereavement, separation, hurt or regrets. Others feel anxious or isolated, at a time of material difficulty for many. And many feel alienated by the manifest materialism and secularisation of the season, in a world where so many lack the basics of food, shelter, peace and justice. As a result, many of us find Christmas a difficult time to celebrate and worry that we have to bury our feelings to make everyone else happy. Blue Christmas is a service to enable us to recognise these more painful parts of our lives and of our world, not to cheer each other up, or wallow in pity, but to offer God the whole of who we are. Do come and make use of this space and pray with us for healing and wholeness.

#### **Christmas Masses**

Children's Nativity Mass (St. Peter's, Winchester, 3pm, Sat 24th Dec) This is our first Mass of Christmas and is pitched particularly at our young children (preschool and Key Stage 1) and their families. It will include traditional carols suitable for children and people of all ages.

#### Family Christmas Vigil Masses (St. Stephen's, Winchester, and St. Peter's, Winchester, 5:30pm, Sat 24th Dec)

These Masses (one in St. Stephen's and the other at the same time in St. Peter's) tend to be our busiest of the Christmas Festivities, so please do come along in plenty of time. The readings and homily are pitched at our slightly older children (Key Stage 2 and upwards) and their families, but everyone is welcome. Lots of familiar carols to join in with too and a great way to begin celebrating the birth of Jesus.

# **Laudato Si Corner**



During Advent we are focused on the coming of the Christ child and the importance of the Holy family. This season reinforces the importance of all our human family too, with current world problems casting a shadow over what should be a joyous time.

One of those problems is the failure of world governments to reduce carbon emissions at COP27. This means that global temperatures may continue to rise – and with that rise there will be more damaging climate events.

In Laudato Si, the Pope called climate change "one of the principal challenges facing humanity in our day" and the urgency of this issue was the focus of discussion at the National Bishops Conference recently where Dr Carmody Grey said that COP 27's failure to reduce carbon emission means that we are facing a rise in global temperatures of 2.7degrees centigrade. 


