Lift Up Your Eyes – and Rejoice as He Comes Closer to Us

Fr Mark writes:

"And as if in answer there came from far away another note. Horns, horns, horns. In dark Mindolluin's sides they dimly echoed. Great horns of the North wildly blowing. Rohan had come at last." (The Lord of the Rings: The Return of the King)

Things are looking bleak for our heroes. They have given it their best shot, and may even briefly have looked like winning, but in the end, the villains were too strong, the heroes too few, and all that's left is just enough time for some last words and a Last Stand...

...Wait, what's that? Did I just hear a bugle?

Lift up your eyes and see, there, appearing on the horizon...It's The Cavalry, riding in to save the day!

Maybe it's real life (think Dunkirk invasion for the French and British stuck on the beaches facing the Wehrmacht with their backs to the sea, and the arrival of hundreds of ships of every variety who turn up to rescue them in the nick of time) or maybe it's fiction (think Lord of the Rings or Hogwarts or Star Wars or Stagecoach, the film that made a star of John Wayne). Either way, it's a sight that fills the heart with relief and joy.

In this weekend's Gospel, we discover that the Cavalry has indeed arrived. The Messiah is here among us. Jesus is the Christ of God who has come close to us, to save us.

Why did John send his disciples to ask Jesus if he were the one who was to come? Was John not the cousin of Jesus..? There are two mainstream explanations.

One is that John knew that Jesus was the Christ and, as a prisoner, he wanted his disciples to follow Jesus as their new master. So, he sent them to ask Jesus this question and presumed that, once they had met Jesus, they would see for themselves that he was the Messiah and so would become followers of Jesus.

The other is that John began to question Jesus' identity as the promised Messiah. The silent healing, preaching, saving, and empowering ministry of Jesus was a surprise to John and to those who expected a fire-and-brimstone Messiah (remember last week and talk of baptising "with the Holy Spirit and with fire" and of having a winnowing fork in his hand, ready to burn the chaff).

Jesus had not yet fulfilled John's prediction that the One-to-come would baptize the repentant in the Holy Spirit. Nor did Jesus conform to popular Jewish beliefs about a warrior and a political Messiah who would bring political, social, and economic deliverance to Israel. Instead, Jesus pronounced blessings on the poor in spirit, the meek, and peacemakers (5:1-11). He called his disciples to love their enemies (5:42-48). He warned his disciples not to judge others (7:1-5). For John, these teachings might have seemed to weaken rather than to strengthen the Messiah's cause.

Cardinal Cantalamessa tells us that,

"Prior to Jesus, to convert always meant to 'go back', as the very term 'shub' used in Hebrew for this action indicates. It meant to return to the violated covenant, through a renewed observance of the law. 'Return to me – says the Lord through the prophets - Return from your evil ways and from your evil deeds' (Zechariah 1:3-4; Jeremiah: 8: 4-5).

Consequently, to be converted had a primarily ascetic, moral and penitential meaning, and it was effected by changing one's conduct of life. Conversion was seen as a condition for salvation; the meaning was: be converted and you will be saved; be converted and salvation will come to you."

This was the case even for the Baptist.

However, Cardinal Cantalamessa continues:

"on Jesus' lips this meaning changed, not because Jesus played with the words, but because with him the reality has changed. The moral meaning becomes secondary (at least at the beginning of his preaching), [in regard] to a new meaning, unknown until now. To be converted no longer means to go back; it means, rather, to take a leap forward and to enter, through faith, into the kingdom of God who has come among [us]...Conversion and salvation have changed places. No longer: 'Convert and you will be saved; convert and salvation will come to you', but rather: 'Convert because salvation has come to you'...

This is the great novelty of Christianity. Every other religion lays out a path of salvation for man through ascetic observances or intellectual speculations, promising salvation or illumination as the end prize, but leaving people substantially on their own in accomplishing this task. Christianity does not begin by telling people what they must do to be saved, it begins by telling people what God has done to save them!"

We can now see why the Gospel is called 'Gospel' and why it is source of joy. It tells us of a God who, out of pure grace, has come to save us in his Son Jesus. A God who 'so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life' (John 3:16).

I was using a metaphor in last week's thought about going for a walk and getting lost in conversation and thoughts, before realising that maybe I'd wandered down a wrong path. There are times when I need to lift up my eyes and look around and get my bearings. Imagine me doing that and then seeing there's a huge mountain I need to climb – one that seems impossible...And then spotting Jesus running down the mountain towards me. I don't need to climb the mountain to get closer to Jesus because he's running joyfully to come closer to me.

He's running joyfully to come closer to you too...to bring healing and peace and salvation...but we have to lift up our eyes to see him...and then we can rejoice as he comes closer to us!

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy.

Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid.

'Look, your God is coming...he is coming to save you.' (Isaiah 35)

During Advent we are focused on the coming of the Christ child and the importance of the Holy family. This season reinforces the importance of all our human family too, with current world problems casting a shadow over what should be a joyous time.

One of those problems is the failure of world governments to reduce carbon emissions at COP27. This means that global temperatures may continue to rise – and with that rise there will be more damaging climate events.

In Laudato Si, the Pope called climate change "one of the principal challenges facing humanity in our day" and the urgency of this issue was the focus of discussion at the National Bishops Conference recently where Dr Carmody Grey said that COP 27's failure to reduce carbon emission means that we are facing a rise in global temperatures of 2.7degrees centigrade.
