Blessings from the Blessed One

Fr Mark writes:

Imagine you're sat on top a grassy hill. The sun is shining down, there are clear blue skies above with the odd cloud drifting by. You're looking down at the Sea of Galilee, which is calm and tranquil, and along the four-mile long Plain of Gennesaret, a luscious valley, famed for its fertility, which the historian Josephus once described as "nature's crowning achievement".

This is the view which Jesus has when he begins to speak to his disciples. Up the mountain he has gone, just as Moses did, sitting down to indicate the position and authority of teacher.

Imagine yourself now as part of that group of disciples, part of his "inner circle". What you hear Jesus saying is, in some sense, privileged information.

Down below, or scattered upon the hill, now known as the Mount of Beatitudes, here in the countryside, far from the capital Jerusalem and all the symbols of power, are the crowds that have come looking for Jesus: those unwell with different diseases; suffering from torments; possessed with demons; those mentally unwell and paralysed.

What is it like to look upon those people – the needy, the weak, the vulnerable, the desperate? What emotions go through your being? Then, as Jesus begins to speak – his first sermon – listen to what he says:

"Congratulations to the destitute; the sad; the meek; those concerned for justice; congratulations to the merciful; to those who concentrate solely on God; to those who refuse to go down the road of violence; to those who are persecuted!"

What is happening here? Is Jesus saying that the way forward is for us to be wimps? Listen again. Is there actually something profound that Jesus is offering in this list of congratulations? It's quite the opposite of the sort of congratulations people normally offer one another.

Jesus does not only teach them these "ways of being". As we know, he will go on to embody them.

Poor in spirit - those who have cleared out the spiritual junk so that they can create room for God, allowing Him to live and move and grow in their deepest being. It's no longer "me, me, me!" We can think of Jesus in Gethsemane – "Father, not my will but yours be done" – or on the cross – "Into your hands I commit my spirit".

Merciful – again and again we see Jesus offering mercy: to the woman caught in adultery, to Zacchaeus up the sycamore tree, or to the paralysed man lowered through the roof, for example. Or speaking of mercy: for example, in the parable of the Prodigal Son or on the cross when he says, "Father, forgive them; they know not what they do".

Pure in heart – those who are true to their calling and vocation. We might think of Jesus saying to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan" when he tries to prevent him going to the cross, or of him resisting the temptations in desert.

Jesus, then, is the Blessed One par excellence. Which, on the one hand, is wonderful, whilst on the other, it seems to make these beatitudes lofty ideals too high for us to reach ..?

Perhaps we need now to look back to those crowds who have gathered. Jesus has been inviting his disciples to look at Him but is he perhaps asking them, and therefore also us, to look at this motley bunch too? Is he saying that it is because of their desperation and need that they are to be congratulated, for they know they cannot survive without God and his help? Is Jesus encouraging us to learn from them, to realise our own complete dependence on and indebtedness to God so that we may be free to follow Christ?

As we sit and listen to this strange new teaching, as we look upon the beauty of the countryside and wonder at the crowds around and below, how do we react? Do we want to slip away quietly? Do we find ourselves inspired by Jesus's words? Or challenged? Do we want to follow this man? If so, we cannot do it alone, so let's open our hearts that we may be filled with his Holy Spirit and be given the grace to go wherever he may lead us.



Meek – not timid and fearful but the opposite of aggressive. Strong in non-violent resistance. We can think of Jesus being led "like a lamb to slaughter" or being struck on the cheek and offering the other.

Those who mourn – not so much about those who wail without hope for loved ones who've died, but rather those who mourn by recognising things are not as God wills and lament this. It is a mourning which brings healing. We can think of Jesus weeping at the death of his friend, Lazarus, or over Jerusalem. He is also, we note, prepared to do something about the situation over which he mourns.

Peacemaker - Jesus is the one who brings true peace and reconciliation, with God and with each other. "My peace I give you..." It is a peace allied to justice.

Those who are persecuted in the cause of right – we recall Jesus being scourged at the pillar, or more generally his passion and death.

St Peter's is a busy and thriving city centre church, one of 4 churches in the Catholic parish of St Peter and the Winchester Martyrs (Winchester, Alresford and Stockbridge). It has a tradition of music, which in the past has included an adult SATB choir and a Youth Choir, contemporary music groups, and several volunteer organists and cantors.

We are now seeking an experienced pastoral musician to build and grow a strong music team at St Peter's, while also developing existing volunteer music leaders in their own roles and skills.

The successful candidate will

- Ensure that the Music team can provide suitable music for all weekend Masses at St Peter's (Saturday 17:30, Sunday 10:30 and 17:30, and Sunday 08:00 as required), and on major feasts;
- Lead, or preferably arrange for the leading of choirs and music groups that exist or may develop;
- Recruit and develop more volunteers: performers (singers, accompanists, instrumental players) and support roles (administration; music tech);
- Retain, and strengthen the commitment and confidence of those currently serving;
- Encourage more diverse involvement (age, nationality, musical styles, Mass communities).

We are looking for someone who, through their own musical performing and directing, is able to inspire others to join the team. Even more important than their own musical skills, will be their passion and enthusiasm to recruit, develop, support and grow others: new and existing talent – so that our music ministry can operate more sustainably, and over time grow in size and capability, to support the parish's vision to bring others closer to Jesus Christ in hope and joy.

Their success will be judged by the team they have built, more than the music they have performed.

To achieve this, they will

- Develop relationships with the clergy and the people in the parish, to gain support and assistance for their work in raising the profile of music in the parish;
- Be open to feedback about their own work and that of the whole music team, as they seek to fulfil the vision for music in the parish;
- Liaise with music teams at the other churches in the parish, to encourage collaboration (especially at major feasts), and to provide support, while respecting a degree of autonomy for these teams;
- Set a personal example, through their own life of prayer and their attitude of service.

We welcome applications from anyone with an active Christian faith, though candidates will be expected to demonstrate a readiness to engage with the Catholic Church's teaching and directives regarding music and liturgy.

Laudato Si Corner

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COP15, the biodiversity conference held in Montreal in December 2022, resulted in a historic agreement for member states to work together to protect the world's fragile ecosystems.

The Global Biodiversity Framework (GBF) aims to protect and restore at least 30% of Earth's land and water by 2030, as well as reduce our ecological footprint, half the risks of pesticides, and eliminate or repurpose harmful subsidies.

The event was also marked by the involvement of a coalition of faith-based organisations and conservation groups, 'Faith in COP15': the first time that all major religious traditions participated in such a conference. Faith in COP15 held events at the conference, lobbied governments, adopted its own set of recommendations and held a meeting with the Executive Secretary.

With the GBF in place, now comes the challenge to see that it is implemented. Gopal Patel, co-convener of Faiths at COP15 said: "Given the immense potential of faith communities to mobilize people at local levels, we are uniquely positioned to play a leading role in creating a nature positive world where all life flourishes."
