

Requiem Mass for Pope Emeritus Benedict

Father Stephen Vooght will lead a **Requiem Mass** for Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI on Sunday, 8th January, at 8am at St Peter's. The Mass will be live-streamed. All are welcome.

Report from the Vatican website from the funeral in Rome

In his homily at the Requiem Mass for Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, Pope Francis commends his predecessor into the loving hands of God the Father and prays that his joy may now be complete as he contemplates the Lord face to face.

"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Pope Francis recalled those final words spoken by the Lord, as proclaimed in the Gospel reading at the Requiem Mass for the late Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI on Thursday morning in St. Peter's Square.

Benedict, faithful friend of the Bridegroom, may your joy be complete as you hear his voice, now and forever.

Bishop Philip's Prayer for Pope Emeritus Benedict: Father, eternal shepherd, hear the prayers of your people for your servant Benedict, who governed your Church with love. In your mercy, bring him with the flock once entrusted to his care to the reward you have promised your faithful servants. May he who faithfully administered the mysteries of your forgiveness and love on earth, rejoice with you for ever in heaven. In your wise and loving care, you made your servant teacher of all your Church. He did the work of Christ on earth. May your Son welcome him into eternal glory. May your servant whom you appointed high priest of your flock be counted now among the priests in the life of your kingdom. Give your servant the reward of eternal happiness and let your mercy win for us the gift of your life and love. We entrust your servant to your mercy with faith and confidence. In the human family he was an instrument of your peace and love. May he rejoice in those gifts for ever with your saints. Through Christ our Lord, Amen.

Fr Mark writes: Music Team Leader

We are now advertising a new post, funded by some of our Closer to Christ allocation. This exciting new role of Music Team Leader will be a part-time, fixed-term contract (18 months).

One of my hopes is that when we come to celebrate the centenary of St. Peter's Church across our parish in 2026, people will be blown away by the liturgy and worship they experience, leading them to a transformative encounter with Christ. One of the key elements of liturgy is the music. Some priests say that when it comes to making our Sunday celebrations more joyful, uplifting and life-transforming, we need to focus especially on the three H's: Hospitality, Homilies and Hymns. Others say the same thing but speak of the three W's: Welcome, Word and Worship. Liturgical music is, in many ways, like the air we breathe, enabling us to sing well and "pray twice" as St Augustine might have put it.

We have some amazing and dedicated musicians in our parish but, especially since we started to return after the pandemic, and particularly in St. Peter's, we have been spread too thinly. We have had a few parishioners doing a valiant job but we really need some committed and focussed leadership in this area to ensure our liturgy is reliably and regularly supported by life-transforming music. We need someone who can build a broad and sustainable music team at St. Peter's, maximising the number and diversifying the range of musicians, helping them to develop and grow in their ministry. We need someone who can inspire, encourage and empower our musicians so that the Holy Spirit can use them all the more freely as his instruments to bring people closer to Jesus Christ, His Son, in hope and joy.

The parish has had paid roles in musical leadership before and it is my conviction that once more we need to bring in someone who can unleash the wonderful talent and gifting we have available to us, in order to reach its full potential.

If you know of anyone who could be a candidate for this role, please encourage them to contact Deacon Martin via email, and I ask you to keep the recruitment process for this post in your prayers.



The Committee would like to hear from campaigners, members of the medical profession and members of the public and will look at the moral, ethical and practical concerns raised in a way that is informed by actual evidence. Steve Brine feels that it is hugely important for everyone to have their say and invites you to submit your opinions on assisted dying/assisted suicide to be considered by the Committee. The Committee's terms of reference include the important point regarding access to palliative care. - Is the current access to palliative care acceptable and, if not, how can this be improved?






