Salt and Light – enabling others to flourish

Fr Mark writes:

Certain supermarkets claim they're good at reducing it; lorries have been busy this winter spreading it; in St. Peter's car park there's a big yellow tub full of it; you'll find it on most of our tables with every main meal.

So, what does salt do? What is its role or purpose? Well, one thing that salt does is to bring out the flavour of the other ingredients – to enable them to come alive. Light too has this enabling role – it is the light which enables us to see in the darkness, to make our way around without stumbling, to go forward with confidence.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men.

'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.'

Remember that as Jesus speaks in our Gospel this weekend, he is still on that mountain-top and we, his disciples, are still gathered around, listening to his sermon. It is us whom Jesus wants to be salt and light – to be “enablers” in His Father's Kingdom; a Kingdom of righteousness, or “right relation” with God, through the new covenant which He will seal with His blood.

First of all, then, **who** is it that we are to be enabling? Well, remember the crowd who is gathered around us on the Mount of Beatitudes. Bring to mind those who are weakest and most in need. We think of the hungry, the poor, the homeless, the oppressed and the naked of today's first reading from the prophet Isaiah:

*“Share your bread with the hungry,
and shelter the homeless poor,
clothe the man you see to be naked
and do not turn from your own kin.
Then will your light shine like the dawn
and your wound be quickly healed over.”*

We think of those in our community, maybe, and perhaps especially today of all those whom the Basics Bank is trying to support. But we are certainly not meant to others, here locally and even internationally. And we think also of those who are weak in confidence or spirit – those who feel alone, unloved, unloveable; those who have gifts which they are too shy or self-conscious to use. And those who are in the darkness of ill health or loneliness or doubt, as well as those who find themselves stumbling about in search of the right way forward, the correct path, the Truth.

What are we enabling them to do? Put simply: to come alive, to blossom, to flourish! To illuminate for them the direction of freedom – from poverty, from hunger, from anxiety, from error. Not just to show them the way, but to lead them along that path, the path of righteousness, of right living, of right relationship with God through His Covenant. How hard it is to come alive when we are crippled by debt or weakened by starvation. How hard, though, also when feel unloved or resentful or vengeful or jealous or alone or unaware of our own strengths or weaknesses, gifts or failings.

How are we to enable others? Well, Jesus warns against too little salt (or salt that is ‘tasteless’) and too little light (that is hidden under a bucket) but excessive salt and light aren't great either. If you put too much salt on your meal it's not going to taste great; if the light is too bright it will simply dazzle and blind.

We are called to be good stewards of the salt and of the light – measuring the right amount for the right time; a little here and maybe a bit more there. If you'll permit me to mix my metaphors, the salt and light are not there to overpower and destroy what is already there but to bring forth, to nurture, to enhance. Sometimes it might be a listening ear or a gentle smile or word of encouragement. Other times, maybe a gentle correction, borne out of love, offered in humility, aware of our own weaknesses and failings.

Jesus speaks particularly of the light showing forth our good works – one of the key ways in which we can enable others is through our witness – through the lives we lead we may inspire others, offer them hope or courage. Most of all, may we be witnesses to those virtues and values which Jesus spoke to us of in last week's Gospel – the beatitudes – may we shine forth in our poverty of spirit; our gentleness; our mourning for that which is not as it should be; our hunger and thirst for justice; our mercy and forgiveness for others; our purity of heart and our love of peace.

As we were told last week, there may be times when others will resent the light we offer. Sometimes this might be because it has become our light rather than God's – but equally sometimes there will be those who prefer the shadow of darkness. There will be times when we are criticised and challenged and mocked, even persecuted on Christ's account.

As long as it is His light which shines forth, then we may rejoice even in that rejection. For if we are truly to be light for the world, then it is with hearts that are on fire with His love, our words and actions infused with the very love of Christ, and His Holy Spirit living in us as believers. Our call, ultimately, is to be enablers – enabling Christ to enable others by loving as He loves and serving as He serves.

Lenten Spiritual Campaign – Belong and Believe

This Lent (which begins in less than three weeks' time!), we will again, as a parish, enter into a “Spiritual Campaign”, inviting all of you to participate by engaging with the opportunities offered to become more fully part of our community and to deepen your faith in God and, especially this year, the Holy Spirit.

Our theme this year will be “Belong and Believe” and we will use this focus to help us get ready to renew our baptismal promises this Easter. You will be able to participate through joining Lenten small groups, engagement with the homilies and messages and by signing up for daily or weekly emails of encouragement – and in other ways. St Peter's is a busy and thriving city centre church, one of 4 churches in the Catholic parish of St Peter and the Winchester Martyrs (Winchester, Alresford and Stockbridge). It has a tradition of music, which in the past has included an adult SATB choir and a Youth Choir, contemporary music groups, and several volunteer organists and cantors.

We are now seeking an experienced pastoral musician to build and grow a strong music team at St Peter's, while also developing existing volunteer music leaders in their own roles and skills.

The successful candidate will

- Ensure that the Music team can provide suitable music for all weekend Masses at St Peter's (Saturday 17:30, Sunday 10:30 and 17:30, and Sunday 08:00 as required), and on major feasts;
- Lead, or preferably arrange for the leading of choirs and music groups that exist or may develop;
- Recruit and develop more volunteers: performers (singers, accompanists, instrumental players) and support roles (administration; music tech);
- Retain, and strengthen the commitment and confidence of those currently serving;
- Encourage more diverse involvement (age, nationality, musical styles, Mass communities).

We are looking for someone who, through their own musical performing and directing, is able to inspire others to join the team. Even more important than their own musical skills, will be their passion and enthusiasm to recruit, develop, support and grow others: new and existing talent – so that our music ministry can operate more sustainably, and over time grow in size and capability, to support the parish's vision to bring others closer to Jesus Christ in hope and joy.

Their success will be judged by the team they have built, more than the music they have performed.

To achieve this, they will

- Develop relationships with the clergy and the people in the parish, to gain support and assistance for their work in raising the profile of music in the parish;
- Be open to feedback about their own work and that of the whole music team, as they seek to fulfil the vision for music in the parish;
- Liaise with music teams at the other churches in the parish, to encourage collaboration (especially at major feasts), and to provide support, while respecting a degree of autonomy for these teams;
- Set a personal example, through their own life of prayer and their attitude of service.

We welcome applications from anyone with an active Christian faith, though candidates will be expected to demonstrate a readiness to engage with the Catholic Church's teaching and directives regarding music and liturgy.
