Holy Week – Belong to Me and Believe in Me

Fr Mark writes:

We enter now into the holiest, and to my mind, most beautiful week of the Church's year. It's the week in which the drama of our salvation is played out, almost in slow motion. We are offered symbol and ritual, music and word, silence and incense as a feast for our senses, to nourish our souls. More importantly still, it's a drama in which each of us has a key role...Whilst the option is there for us to stand by as silent onlookers, that is not the invitation that Jesus puts before us...He asks us to follow Him...to the cross and beyond to the Joy of Resurrection. Or, as we might phrase it this Lent, Jesus calls us to belong and believe...

Maundy Thursday - Belong to Me (have communion with me)

On Maundy Thursday, we are offered as our Psalm refrain, taken from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, these beautiful words:

"The blessing cup that we bless is a communion with the blood of Christ".

Over these last few weeks, we've been reflecting on how we might have a deeper sense of belonging to our parish community. We've been learning from the Celtic Christians, who lived simple lives but welcomed strangers into their communities with open arms, even before they'd signed up to believe everything the Church professed to be true. They invited people to learn alongside them, about faith and about life.

The deeper call is for those of us who know we belong to recognise Jesus Christ in those who don't feel that they belong, in those on the peripheries, in the stranger ("you did this to me"). We are then to invite the stranger to belong, alongside us, to Christ's body, the Church. Our ultimate desire, for ourselves and for others, is communion with Jesus Christ himself.

The Eucharist is communion with Christ, but it is also assimilation. In other words, it is not just the union of two bodies, two minds, two wills but it is assimilation to the one body, the one mind and the one will of Jesus Christ. Here we follow the rule that the strongest vital principle assimilates the less strong one to itself (e.g. a vegetable assimilates the mineral to itself and not vice versa; an animal assimilates the vegetable and the mineral to itself and not vice versa). In Holy Communion, then, we are assimilated to Christ. As Jesus invites us to belong more closely to him, so we become more like him. We become what we eat (c.f. St. Augustine; St. Leo the Great: *"Our participation in the body and blood of Christ tends to make us become what we eat"*).

Let us consider another image. We might also say that the Eucharist is the consummation of the marriage between Christ and the Church (and perhaps furthermore that Christian life without the Eucharist is 'ratified but not consummated'). Shortly before the moment of Holy Communion, the priest will say:

"Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb" (Beati qui ad coenam Agni vocati sunt).

The book of Revelation, from which the expression is taken, says even more explicitly: *"Blessed are those called to the marriage supper of the Lamb."* (Rev 19:9)

In a good and healthy marriage, the body of the husband 'belongs' to the wife, and vice versa. In the Eucharist, the incorruptible and life-giving flesh of Jesus 'belongs to me' but also my flesh, my humanity 'belongs to Christ'. There is a mutual giving and receiving. We receive the body and blood of Christ, but Christ also receives our body and blood. Jesus says, "Take, this is my body" but we can say to Jesus, "Take, this is my body".

St. Elizabeth of the Trinity wrote to her mother: *"The bride belongs to the bridegroom. My Bridegroom has taken me. He wants me to be an added humanity for him"*.

Thanks to the Eucharist, Jesus experiences life through me. This in itself is an inexhaustible reason for amazement and consolation. It is also an enormous responsibility (if my eyes have become the eyes of Christ, should I be looking inappropriately at people or images? If my mouth is that of Christ, should I be gossiping about my neighbour?) Even more beautifully, the bridegroom belongs to the bride, to me. We give and we receive. What do we receive? None other than Christ's holiness!

It is then through this intimate communion with Jesus that we enter into communion with the very life of God, the Holy Trinity, and into a deeper communion with one another, especially the poor and marginalised. St. Augustine (developing thoughts sketched out in the *Didache*), *"sees an analogy in the way in which the two bodies of Christ are formed: the Eucharistic and the ecclesial. In the case of the Eucharist, we have the wheat first scattered on the hills, which threshed, ground, mixed in water and cooked over the fire becomes the bread that reaches the altar; in the case of the Church, we have the multitude of people who, united by evangelical preaching, ground by fasting and penance, kneaded in water in baptism and cooked in the fire of the Spirit, form the body which is the Church."*

I would love each and every one of us to have a deeper sense of belonging to our parish family. Even more ardently, I desire for us to belong to Jesus Christ, and through him to the other.

Good Friday – Believe in Me

Near the end of John's Gospel, the Beloved Disciple tell us that:

Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." (John 20:30-31)

John's Gospel is written so that you may believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, and so share his divine life.

Again and again in this Fourth Gospel, we find a 'trial motif' used as a literary device, which works on two levels. On the earthly level, Jesus Christ is 'in the dock' and finds himself being tried and condemned by the religious leaders of his day. On the cosmic level, however, Jesus is sent by God as his agent on earth, inviting the world to belief in himself, a belief which will offer Life through his death. Both trials are carried out via encounters with accusers, appeals to witnesses, and a judgement / verdict. We find the two levels playing off each other again and again with irony and misunderstandings.

As you listen to the Passion of Our Lord according to John this Good Friday, perhaps try to bear this trial motif in mind. It's a very different account to the one we'll hear from St. Matthew this Palm Sunday. Try and ask yourself, who is really in charge here..? Who is really on trial? Note the words of the evangelist after the death of Jesus:

"This is the evidence of one who saw it – trustworthy evidence, and he knows he speaks the truth – and he gives it so that you may believe as well."

Then ask yourself the most important question: do you believe as well..?



Family Way of the Cross- 9.45am Friday 7th April at St Peter's Church Join us for our Family Way of the Cross on Good Friday when the parish will hold a child-friendly dramatised celebration of the Passion, including the Veneration of the Cross. We will gather outside the Pastoral Centre at 9.30am. Any children wishing to come and take part should arrive a little earlier to organise roles and costumes.

Churches Together in Winchester (CTiW) forthcoming events:

There will be an interactive act of witness in the Outer Close of the Cathedral Green between 10.00am and 12 noon on **Good Friday**. This will include the opportunity for adults and children to write or draw, on card, prayers, blessings for others, or to lay down burdens, and then to peg them to cords which will flow from the cross.

The Salvation Army band will play and volunteers will offer Easter Eggs to people who join the event and booklets to those interested. The programme of story-telling and invitation will run every half hour with interactive activities throughout the time. **Father Mark says** St Peter's Family Way of the Cross begins at 9:45am (see item above), so there would be plenty time to wander over to the Cathedral Close afterwards.

CTiW are also organising a free lunchtime **Ukrainian Festival concert** at St Cross on 20 April at 12.30 pm. A retiring collection will be taken in aid of Ukrainian good causes.

Life in the Spirit Seminars for Children – Easter to Pentecost



When? Friday afternoons beginning Friday April 28th.

Where? St Stephen's Church.

Time? Welcome from 3:30pm and Main Session 3:45 – 4:30pm.

Who? Open to children in the parish in Years 2 – 6 (there will be a further opportunity for Reception/KS1 age children).

Why? Do you really know how much God loves YOU, just for being YOU? Do you know the wonderful and exciting plan God has for YOU? Learn more about the abundant life God has for us and His promises for us, how God speaks to us personally through His Word in the Bible, how we can pray, and how we can experience the joy of the Holy Spirit working in our lives. There will be 5 sessions beginning Friday April 28th through to Friday May 26th (just before Pentecost Sunday) comprising a time of welcome, singing, a talk with related activity and discussion, and a weekly prayer challenge. The final session will include a time of prayer with the children, inviting the Holy Spirit who lives in us through our baptism, to work in them in a new way.

Holy Communion under Both Kinds

The Bishops' Conference of England and Wales have decided that a suitable time for the resumption of Holy Communion received under both species would be at the Mass of the Lord's Supper in Holy Week 2023, given the theological significance of the celebration. We aim to follow that lead in this parish, and to give the opportunity to receive from the Chalice at the Masses of the Triduum (Holy Thursday and the Easter Vigil), as well as our Easter Sunday Masses. We will also offer Holy Communion under both kinds the following weekend, Divine Mercy Sunday, and then at Ascension, Pentecost, Most Holy Trinity Sunday, *Corpus Christi*, and St. Peter and St. Paul, before resuming at every Mass from the beginning of September. (We might introduce Holy Communion under both kinds more regularly at weekday Masses, depending on Ministers available)

Recruitment of new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion – at Mass and to take Holy Communion to the Sick and Housebound

Our ability to offer Holy Communion under both kinds will mainly depend on the availability of trained Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. As you can imagine, our numbers have been depleted by the pandemic, and so we are now looking to recruit and train new ministers. We need people who are willing and able to distribute Holy Communion at Mass, and also to the sick and housebound (sadly, we have several people in our parish who are currently not receiving the Sacraments at home with any sort of regularity). Please pray and ask the Holy Spirit to show you whether you are being called to this ministry, at Mass and/or to people in their homes (DBS and safeguarding checks required for the latter). We would also be grateful to people who could not commit regularly but were willing to go on a reserved list. **Please let Fr Mark know, either directly or via the parish office.**

There will be training in St. Peter's on Sundays 4th June and 2nd July, 3:30-5pm (but we will offer alternatives for those who are interested but cannot make these dates).

Volunteers required for the Youth Ministry Programme

We are looking for more fantastic volunteers to help us with our Youth Ministry programme for those aged 11-18. We have a variety of roles available including facilitating small groups, preparing food or resources, or even help with the flow of sessions. We run several courses in the year; some continuous, others more seasonal so there are options to help with either a short-term or a long-term group. These groups run on different days of the week so if you can commit to a specific day, that's okay! Our young people are wonderful, and it is very rewarding to work with them. So, if you would like to give generously of your time to our teenagers, please do get in touch for an initial chat about our Youth Ministry, the vision in our parish, gifts and skills you might be able to offer. There is no requirement to commit at this stage.

As the role will be working with young people a DBS check (Children) will be needed which the Parish will provide. Thank youuuuu.

Laudato Si Corner

The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) Sixth Assessment Report has recently been published. Summarising, it recognises the interdependence of climate, ecosystems and biodiversity, and human societies. It states that "Human activities, principally through emissions of greenhouse gases, have unequivocally caused global warming, with global surface temperature reaching 1.1°C above 1850–1900 levels in 2011–2020. Global greenhouse gas emissions have continued to increase, with unequal historical and ongoing contributions arising from unsustainable energy use and land-use change, lifestyles and patterns of consumption and production."

What can we do?

Join CAFOD and Christian Aid on **Friday 21st April at 11.15am** at St John's Church, Waterloo to pray for leaders to take the action we need to tackle the climate emergency and declare that we have no faith in fossil fuels. After the service, there is a short pilgrimage to Westminster Parliament to join thousands of others calling for fossil fuels to be consigned to history. Already seven of our parishioners are travelling together by train in the morning to attend and returning by mid-afternoon.
