

First Part: The Solemn Beginning of the Vigil or Lucernarium (Service of Light)

We gather in front of the entrance to the Pastoral Centre. The new fire and the Paschal Candle are blessed.

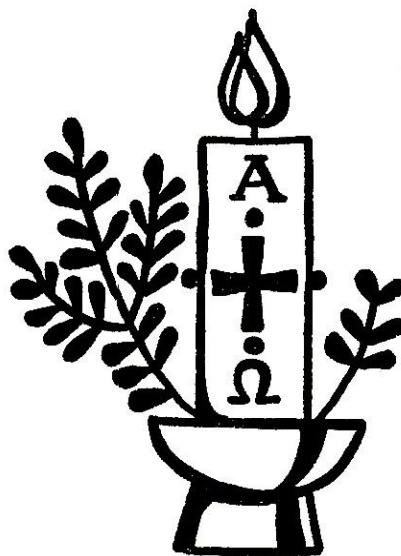
Procession with the Paschal Candle

Ever with the Spirit be.




