Hoping to Hear the Voice of the Good Shepherd

Fr Mark writes:

Last week, we discussed how the risen Lord restores our hope. We then talked about three degrees of hope: casual hope, precious hope and ultimate hope. I invited you to do an exercise – to make a list of all the things you are hoping for and to categorise those hopes into casual hopes, precious hopes and your ultimate hope.

This weekend I want to focus on a contender for our ‘ultimate hope’ as we look at the passage from the tenth chapter of John’s Gospel. Jesus is speaking to the Pharisees and other religious leaders. In his speech, he uses imagery that would have been very familiar to them – that of a shepherd. He also describes a scene that they would have witnessed daily in their middle eastern community.

Towards evening shepherds would herd their sheep into an enclosure called a sheepfold along with the flocks of the other shepherds. A guard would be stationed at the entrance of the gate, both to protect the sheep and to keep them in the fold. Then, at dawn the shepherds would return to call their flocks out of the sheepfold.

Each shepherd had his own distinct call, and the sheep knew the sound of their own shepherd’s voice. They heard that voice every single day, so they became accustomed to it and followed it. The sheep knew their shepherd and the shepherds knew their sheep.

There are certain voices you recognize. They bring comfort and security. As a child, you recognized the voice of your parents. Maybe you can recall a time as a child when you were separated from your parents at a supermarket or in a crowd. For me it was Woolworths! You were scared and alone and then you heard the voice of your parents, and you knew it would be ok.

Nowadays, it might be the voice of your spouse or a good friend. When you hear their voice or their greeting it brings joy to your heart. It is that feeling of being at a party when you don’t know anyone, and you feel out of place, and you hear a friendly voice call out your name. There is a joy in knowing someone knows you and is glad you are there. It is said the sweetest sound you ever hear is the sound of your own name.

Jesus says that he knows the name of his sheep. He calls his sheep, his people, his followers by name. He knows us that well.

The shepherd would lead the sheep out of the sheepfold and off to the pastures where they would graze for the day. On different days they would go to different pastures, to give the grass time to grow back. Shepherds would walk ahead of the sheep and lead them to the right pasture. He would make sure they were on the correct path and with his staff he would ward off any potential predators they might encounter along the way. He goes before them leading them to exactly where they will be able to feed, in peace and security.

- ✦ Did you know that the Lord walks ahead of you?
- ✦ He knows the path you should be on and the direction you should take.
- ✦ He knows the mistakes you can make, and the wrong paths you can take, as well as the threats and dangers lurking up ahead.
- ✦ He knows the very best place for you to be, what is best for the health of your heart and soul and spirit.
- ✦ He wants to lead you into the future that he has in mind for you.

There are many voices in our lives. And often they are leading us.

- ✦ There are voices that are supportive and encouraging of the path we’re on...
- ✦ There are voices that are critical, whether or not we deserve the criticism.
- ✦ There are voices of wisdom and voices of folly.
- ✦ There are voices of humour and good cheer and voices of gloom and doom.

Then, there is that voice in our own head, which can often be quite negative.

There are many voices in our lives, and they have the potential to influence us. They’re leading us:

- ✦ to more successful living or to self-defeating patterns of behaviour.
- ✦ to life affirming and enriching relationships or just abusive ones filled with distrust/discord.
- ✦ to hope and confidence in the future or just anxiety about it.

The wrong voice can rob us of joy, like a thief stealing what is valuable to us. The wrong voice in our lives can be destructive, damaging and destroying our future.

Christ describes himself as the Good Shepherd who came that we might have life and know it more abundantly: abundant peace, abundant joy, abundant love.

So, here’s a hope, among all our hopes, which we can hold onto in all circumstances of our lives...

We can hope to hear the Lord as he goes before us.

I’d like to suggest three steps we can take to help make that happen, to learn to hear Jesus’ voice as he goes before us. I am not offering anything terribly insightful, just three basic steps:

Firstly, simply turn down the noise.

You need some space and silence to listen to the Lord. Maybe that’s not a problem for you these days if you live alone. We have plenty of silence, whether we like it or not. *But*, for others among you silence can be in shorter supply than usual.

Secondly, ask the Lord to help you hear.

We have to want to hear from Jesus enough that we ask him to speak to us. Ask Jesus to allow you to hear his voice. If you don’t know what else to say in prayer, pray that.

The third key to hearing Jesus’ voice is Scripture.

Scripture is the Word of God and anytime we spend time reading it, even reading it out loud, we are hearing the Lord.

A good place to get started is with the Gospels. The Gospels literally give us Jesus’ own words, what he said to his friends and followers during his life. In your daily quiet *time take care*, even if only a few minutes a day, to read through one of the four gospels. Pay attention to how Jesus addresses people. Imagine the tone of voice he used in speaking to people and addressing them.

You really can learn to recognize the voice of Jesus.

His alone is the voice that can confidently lead us into a more hopeful future.


From Wednesday 3rd May, Wednesday Mass time will revert to 10.00am.

Please think about encouraging your child to attend the Life in the Spirit seminars for children that starts this Friday (April 28th). The Coronation of King Charles III

As a Catholic community, we wish to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III on 6th May. We will keep the King in our prayers at Morning Prayer and Mass on Wednesday 3rd, Thursday 4th and Friday 5th May. On Saturday 6th May, we will offer the Mass for the intentions of the King at 9am in St. Peter’s, allowing people enough time to go home and watch the coronation later that morning. There will be special readings and prayers for that Mass, provided by the Bishops’ Conference of England and Wales. Then, the *Domine, salvum fac* in English or Latin and/or the National Anthem will be sung at the end of each Mass on Sunday 7th May (including the Vigil Mass), and a Prayer of Intercession for the King will be included in the Prayer of the Faithful. Prayer cards for this occasion from the Secretariat of the Bishops’ Conference will be available at the back of all Churches.

Laudato Si Corner

An act of witness for the Care of Creation.

Eight St Peter’s parishioners went to London for the big demonstration on Friday 21st April against our government’s reliance on the fossil fuels which contribute to the Climate Crisis. We joined many other Christians attending the “No faith in fossil fuels” event that had been organized by CAFOD, Christian Aid and other Christian charities at St John’s Church, Waterloo. The event began with a discussion with members of the House of Lords Environment and Climate Change Committee, Baroness Karen Parminter and Bishop Steven Croft, before a service led by the Tearfund (which like CAFOD is an international Christian relief and development agency).

After the service, we walked on pilgrimage to Parliament Square, halting at the headquarters of Shell where a letter was handed in about the damage caused by fossils fuels to our environment. Outside the Parliament buildings, we joined with many other groups of demonstrators.

It was heartening to have the support of the many Christians involved and good that so many people were making their concerns known. Let’s hope the demonstrations (which were continued by many other groups on Saturday and Sunday) will lead to effective Government policies on the speedy reduction in our reliance on fossil fuels.

We pray for the world: the interdependence of all living things; the beauty and flourishing of the planet, plundered and misused by humanity.

May we all, through our actions, help repair the harm we have caused.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.
