Actively and Ultimately Hoping in the King of kings

Fr Mark writes:

This weekend, we celebrate the coronation of a King. He will be anointed with holy oil, as have countless kings, priests and prophets before him. King Charles III has been selected to rule and govern this temporal kingdom. The Archbishop of Canterbury and several other Christian leaders, including Cardinal Vincent Nichols, will pray over him and proclaim God's blessing on him.

King Charles III will also be promising to serve another King, the King of kings, Jesus the Anointed One of God.

In our First Reading this weekend, we hear of seven others, chosen by the disciples. They were to be men of good reputation, filled with the Holy Spirit and wisdom. They were selected to distribute food to the needy, to teach and baptise. The Apostles prayed and laid hands on them, calling down the Holy Spirit upon them for this ministry.

In our Gospel Reading this weekend, we find ourselves before Easter, back at the Last Supper. It is just a few days after Jesus had entered triumphantly into Jerusalem that first Sunday, welcomed by the crowd as their King.

But now Jesus speaks to his closest followers and friends, beginning his discourse with some alarming news: someone (Judas) would betray him; Peter would deny knowing who he is; the others would be scattered like sheep and Jesus himself was about to be killed. This was all going to take place just a few hours later. This news, understandably, is shocking, and begins turning their world upside-down. Then Jesus says this:

"Do not let your hearts be troubled." (John 14:1)

The apostles might have been wondering what Jesus was talking about! Don't let our hearts be troubled?! Are you joking? You've just told us that everything is *falling* apart at the seams and now you tell us not to worry about it?

Often, in the midst of trials and tribulations, we are deceived into believing that we do not have a choice. We receive some unexpected, unwelcome, unhappy news and we become upset, as if we had no choice, as if there were no other possible response. External problems create internal problems: anger, annoyance, disappointment, frustration. Some people spend a lot of time stewing on those feelings. Our hearts are definitely troubled. It feels like we have no choice.

But, in fact, we do...Jesus tells the apostles that they do have a choice. You can choose to let your heart be troubled or you can choose a better option.

Jesus says, "Trust in God still; and trust in me." (John 14:2)

Have faith in God and have faith in me; believe in God still and believe in me; believe in Love still and believe in me.

You can choose to be agitated or choose in the moment of agitation to rely on our faith. Faith in God and in his Son means trusting in advance what will only make sense with hindsight.

There have been times in your life and mine too, when you had to trust someone in the midst of a problem or when you couldn't make sense of a situation. Maybe you trusted your parents or an accountant or a mechanic, a doctor, a financial advisor. Or a grandchild who knew how your phone worked! They saw the bigger picture and, although you didn't understand it, you trusted the expert. Then, after the experience, you could see with hindsight that they were right. You were glad you took their advice.

Jesus says to us, when it comes to living your life, "trust me on this...I'm the expert here...because I know that..."

There are many rooms in my Father's house; if there were not, I should have told you.

I am going now to prepare a place for you. (John 14:3)

He's talking about *heaven*. The Father's house means heaven. Jesus, through his death, Resurrection, and Ascension, has gone ahead to prepare a place for you in heaven. He prepares a place perfectly suited for you.

It's a lovely idea, a wonderful promise. Our ultimate hope is not in this world. Our ultimate hope is in the next one.

Even if we believe in heaven, though, does it make any actual practical difference to our daily life..? Do we truly hope for heaven or do we just wish for heaven..? Wishing is *passive*. Hope is only hope if its *active*.

If we can come to know that Jesus really is the King of kings, the Lord of lords, the one who has conquered the grave and wants to lead us safely to heaven then it changes everything right now...it has practical consequences for how we live our lives and face each day.

When our ultimate hope becomes an active hope, it changes everything.

- ✦ My daily disappointments no longer bear the same weight. They are not quite so heavy.
- ✦ I don't take much offence at offences.
- ✦ Losses are always recognized as short term.

The list could go on and on. When our ultimate hope becomes an active hope, it changes everything.

But how does it happen? How do we finally get there?

- ✦ Maybe it's by earning our way there so we can pay the entry fee to St. Peter on the gate to let us in?
- ✦ Perhaps it's successfully avoiding sin and managing not to irritate or anger God?
- ✦ Or is it making sure we get those Last Rites at the last possible moment, so we're guaranteed admission?

It is Thomas's question, "*how can we know the way.*" (John 14:5) Jesus responds:

I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, you know my Father too. (John 14:6)

The way home to heaven, the way to the place where all our hopes will ultimately be fulfilled is the person of Jesus Christ. A living loving relationship with the living, loving King of kings and Lord of lords. And that doesn't have to wait until the end of your life. That can begin or grow and develop right here and now, today in this place...

Jesus, I know that you are the King of kings and the Lord of lords.

And I also know now that I am Yours and You are mine forever.

Thank You for sending Your Holy Spirit to me

that I might have the power to live this new life with You.

Stir up Your Spirit in me.

Release Your Spirit in me.

Baptise me with the fullness of Your Spirit

that I may experience Your presence and power in my life.

I wish to receive all that You must give me. Amen

A chance to grow in faith and love of God, and to welcome the Holy Spirit into your life in a new way!

Please think about encouraging your child to attend the Life in the Spirit seminars for children that started last Friday (April 28th). These are 5 weekly sessions beginning at 3:30pm in St Stephen's Church (next to the school). If warmer weather, we may also use the outside space during the welcome time.

We will start with a time of transition from the school day with (nut/dairy-free) refreshments and games/ice breakers. This will hopefully give children from schools further away time to join for the main session at 3:45 – 4:30pm. Each week, following a time of singing praise to God, the children will discover in interactive ways how we can live a life of joy in the

The Coronation of King Charles III

As a Catholic community, we wish to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III on 6th May. On Saturday 6th May, we will offer the Mass for the intentions of the King at 9am in St. Peter's, allowing people enough time to go home and watch the coronation later that morning. There will be special readings and prayers for that Mass, provided by the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales. Then, the *Domine, salvum fac* in English or Latin and/or the National Anthem will be sung at the end of each Mass on Sunday 7th May (including the Vigil Mass), and a Prayer of Intercession for the King will be included in the Prayer of the Faithful. Prayer cards for this occasion from the Secretariat of the Bishops' Conference are available at the back of all Churches.

Laudato Si Corner



Last week, members of the Laudato Si Group had the chance to meet with Jenny Lelean, the new director of Caritas within the Portsmouth Diocese.

Jenny talked about the diocesan environment strategy and the new policy on fossil fuel divestment which is going to be implemented.

We then discussed how our group within the parish can keep in contact with Caritas and make sure that local initiatives reflect what is happening at a diocesan level. Jenny praised Hampshire Downs parish for being one of the most active parishes in this area.

We then discussed how we could link up with our wider parish community, to create initiatives that support our common home. We identified that stronger links could be made with the school, families and young people. We also looked at how we might better inform ourselves about the challenges that parts of the developing world are facing from climate change, by drawing on the knowledge of members of our parish as well as those seeking sanctuary in Winchester.

Dear Parents

Kings' PE support

I am Alison MacQuillin and I work at Kings' School as the Primary PE Outreach Coordinator.



Every Friday morning since September I have been visiting St Peter's School to deliver and develop PE lessons alongside the classroom teachers. Each half term the classes change and so I have been welcomed into 9 classes so far. I have worked with Year R on their outdoor play area and Years 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 during their core PE lessons.

In gymnastics Year 1 looked at different body shapes and jumping on both the floor and apparatus while Year 5 worked on large apparatus to produce pair and group sequences based on balance and travel, looking in detail at how to improve quality in their performance.

Years 2, 3 and 4 have undertaken dance. Year 2 explored the underwater world and how various sea creatures, fish and divers would move underwater, as well as using PADI diving signals to communicate with each other. They also recreated the story of how William Walker worked underwater to shore up Winchester Cathedral in 1906-1911, reinforcing their classroom learning. Mrs Woolgar writes *"It was such a pleasure to work with Mrs MacQuillin this half term. The year 2 curriculum was dance; so we spoke with Mrs MacQuillin about our broader learning and together came up with a great idea, she suggested we incorporated our History curriculum regarding the diver William Walker. Mrs MacQuillin then created a full unit based on diving and underwater movements. Not only did the children love it but the teachers thoroughly enjoyed it too!"*

Year 3 have experienced various country dances and created their own in small groups. Oscar *"really liked the line dances"* while Elodie said *"I really liked it when we performed in front of the other class and the teachers"*.

Year 4 worked on a whole class dance based on the Saxons, re-telling the story of how they came and settled along with their daily life, culminating in preparation for and the recreation of a battle using dance movements. Niamh said *"I really liked doing the boats and moving like it. I also liked all of the different boats people made"*, while Bradley W *"enjoyed building the civilisations on the land, you could really tell what people were doing by their actions"*.

It has been a pleasure working with the classes and I have loved every minute, I look forward to working with more classes on different PE projects during the Summer Term.

St Peter's Sanctuary Welcome Hub celebrates its first year

On 4th May 2022, St Peter's Sanctuary Welcome Hub opened its doors to welcome 45 people from Ukraine, mainly women and children. Our aim was to provide a safe and comfortable space where people could get together, relax, share feelings and experiences and offer mutual support. We also wanted to provide support by directing guests to relevant organizations and useful resources.

One of the key concerns in those early days was whether we would have sufficient volunteers to bake cakes, serve refreshments and be on hand to integrate with our guests. God provides! We still have approximately 40 really brilliant individuals from the Parish and beyond who form the backbone of the Hub.

One year later, the guest base of the Hub has changed. Our Ukrainian guests are more settled, have jobs or are studying, and although some still attend, their numbers have reduced, but we have engaged other guests from across the world. St Peter's Hub is providing a secure and welcoming environment, bringing together people from different backgrounds who are seeking sanctuary, creating a sense of community and belonging.

St Peter's Sanctuary Welcome Hub continues to meet the needs of people seeking sanctuary. We offer a supportive and welcoming environment and are making a significant difference in the lives of many people.

Diocesan Vacancy for a Choral Director

The Catholic Diocese of Portsmouth is seeking to recruit an enthusiastic and appropriately qualified Choral Director who, working with the diocesan Education Service, will be responsible for partnering with up to 12 local schools in the diocese, to implement and develop the National Schools Singing Programme (NSSP).

Full Time: 35 hours per week (part time would be considered. The core work of the Choral Director takes place during the school day).
