General (and Particular) Election

#### Fr Mark writes:

There are few days which pass in the world of politics without mention, implicit or explicit, of the word 'election'. Will this policy or that decision help us to win the next election? Is our party united enough, appealing enough, competent enough to put on a good showing at the next election? Will he or she hold onto their seat or win a seat at the next election? Elections are all about making choices. In general and local elections, we, the people, are asked who we would like to choose as our leaders, to make decisions on our behalf, to represent us?

There is, however, another sort of election — both 'general' and very 'particular', one in which each and every one of us is "standing". God is an 'electing God', which means that God chooses. We see this throughout the Scriptures. God chooses, elects, calls, Moses (from the burning bush), Samuel (when he was a young boy in the Temple), David (who was out tending the sheep), Jonah (who was trying to run away), Mary (who was still a young woman), Peter (a fisherman), Levi (the tax collector), the Samaritan Woman (by the well) and countless others.

Of all those living on the Earth, God elects Abram to be father to many nations and he chooses Israel to be his people. Notice how personal this is. God is not some remote or vague force or absent watchmaker. The God of the Bible is a personal God with mind, will and intention, who chooses people for his own purposes. Perhaps this jars with our sense of equality...Is it fair that certain people are singled out and given privileges?

### God does not call the equipped but equips those whom He calls

What we notice in the Bible, however, is that God does not call people because they're great or have done a wonderful job. God's election is not a reward or a recognition of talent. In fact, it always seems to be the opposite. God always seems to choose the underdog, the one who is weak, insufficient.

Noah got drunk; Abraham was too old; Isaac was a daydreamer; Jacob lied; Joseph was beaten by his brothers and sold into slavery; Moses was a murderer and couldn't talk; Gideon was afraid; Rahab was a prostitute; Jeremiah and Timothy were too young; David was a murderer and adulterer; Jonah ran from God; Naomi was a widow; Job went bankrupt; John the Baptist ate locusts; Peter denied Jesus; the disciples fell asleep while praying; Martha worried about everything; Mary Magdalene had been possessed by demons; the Samaritan woman was divorced...more than once...Zaccheus was too small; Paul was a murderer; Timothy had an ulcer; and Lazarus was dead!

So please, no excuses! God finds a way to do amazing things through each of them and, can do incredible things through you too.

## God's choice is always for service and never for glory

For us humanfolk, being chosen is an honour. God, however, does not choose individuals and communities so that they might be honoured but so that he might give them a mission, and usually a pretty hard mission at that! Let's turn briefly to our first reading this weekend:

The LORD called to him out of the mountain, saying, "Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the people of Israel: 'You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine; and you shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.' (Exodus 19:3-6)

These are beautiful words. Imagine your heavenly Father whispering these words into your ear...

"You yourself have seen what I did, how I bore you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my treasured possession, for all the earth is mine."

Israel has been chosen, not because they deserved it, not because they were to be honoured, but for a mission. A priest was someone who offered sacrifice on behalf of the people. He was there to serve the people. So too was Israel to be a 'kingdom of priests', to serve God and to serve the nations on God's behalf. The world would look to them and be moved to repentance and praise. Israel was "the rescue operation" that God launched, in order to save the world from its sin and destruction.

# Israel was not elected because Israel was great, but Israel became great because it was elected.

So, too, have you been called, as God's treasured possession, to serve Him and his people on a mission. You have been baptised, elected, chosen, not because of your virtues but because of God's grace; not because you're great but because you will become great by being chosen. Like Israel, like the twelve apostles, you have been given a mission, to find your own holiness by bringing others to holiness; to become friends with God by bringing others to friendship with Him.

My heartfelt conviction is that we have been called as a parish community to serve God by bringing people closer to Jesus, in hope and joy, just as those friends of the paralysed man brought him on a stretcher to the feet of Jesus. They brought him with faith that he might be healed and have his life transformed. This is our mission, and you have a part to play in it. God has chosen us as a parish and God has chosen you, elected you, not because we're great but because God needs us to serve Him. God is equipping us, even now, by the power of His Holy Spirit, to do his work.

Much of what I have shared in this piece echoes the thinking of Bishop Robert Barron, and so I end by quoting him:

"One of the key themes of the Bible is the divine election, the fact that God chooses. But God chooses, not on the basis of merit, but simply through and because of his grace. And he chooses, not to glorify those whom he elects, but rather to give them a mission of love. Accordingly, he chose Israel so that it might be a priestly nation; and he chose the twelve so that they might proclaim the kingdom, and he chose us the baptized that we might be conduits of his grace to the world."



# **Bamenda - Day of the African Child 2023**

The Day of the African Child (DAC) is held on 16<sup>th</sup> June to commemorate the student uprising on that day in 1976 in Soweto, South Africa, when students marched in protest at the poor level of education they were receiving and to demand the right to be taught in their own languages. It's a great sadness that 40 years on, teachers and lawyers in the English-speaking provinces of Cameroon, were opposing the central government's attempts to enforce the use of French instead of English in schools, courts, etc, the dispute escalating to the devastating internal conflict that has impacted so seriously on the lives and livelihoods of the people in our sister diocese of Bamenda since 2016.

The theme of this year's DAC commemoration is "The Rights of the Child in the Digital Environment". Whilst African States are being called upon to consider all aspects of the rights of the child, including the very important legislative framework that needs to be in place and then enforced to safeguard the rights of children in the digital world, protecting their personal identities, keeping them safe from pornography and sexual exploitation, etc, the areas where we in the Diocese of Portsmouth can help are the rights of the child to participation and provision, which are so important for their education generally and for their preparation for work in the digital age. A 2020 UNICEF report indicated as little as 1% of children living in the poorest quintiles in West and Central Africa have access to the internet.

When the Portsmouth delegation visited Bamenda in 2014 to celebrate the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the link, we saw a primary school teacher using a flipchart with pictures of a computer and keyboard to teach her pupils how to use a computer! If pupils wanted to find work in the cities, they would need to use a computer for many jobs, so they had to know what they looked like and try to learn the sequence of the keyboard. In 2021, the Bamenda Fund was able to support a project to fund a lab with 20 computers at St Joseph's College, Mankon. The Archdiocese had set up the college to educate hundreds of students internally displaced by the troubles. Reporting in July 2022 on the success of the project, Fr Bon said the lab had already made a huge difference, enabling 540 students to have practical computer lessons, over 50% of the college. 25 'A Level' students had taken ICT/Computer Science and wanted to go on to study Computer/Software Engineering, hopefully creating jobs for themselves and
