Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year A

*Welcoming the Holy One, the Messiah who is among us*

**Fr Mark writes:**

*The special joy of the young, nature-loving Howard Kelly was to hike great distances and study animals in the wild. On a walking trip, up through Northern Pennsylvania one spring, he stopped by a small farmhouse for a drink of cool spring water. A little girl answered his knock at the door and, instead of water, she brought him a glass of fresh milk. He thanked her profusely and went on his way.*

*After years of medical studies, he became Dr. Howard Kelly, a distinguished physician who was one of the four founding doctors of Johns Hopkins, the first medical research university in the U.S.A. In 1895, he established in that school the department of Gynaecology and Obstetrics. Over the course of his career, Doctor Kelly advanced the sciences of gynaecology and surgery, both as a teacher and as a practitioner.*

*Some years later, that same little girl from Northern Pennsylvania who had given him that glass of milk years ago, came to him for an operation. Just before she left for home, fearful of a huge bill, her bill was brought into the room and across its face was written in a bold hand, "Paid in full for one glass of milk."*

*The young girl at the farmhouse had been generous in her hospitality, and years later her kindness was repaid by the skilled doctor, who was now able to offer her something that she needed.*

In our Gospel today, Jesus says to the Twelve Apostles:

*'Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me.*

*'Anyone who welcomes a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man will have a holy man's reward.*

*'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.'*

He is about to send the Twelve out and he is underlining the importance of hospitality. Anyone who welcomes these Apostles welcomes Jesus himself and will be rewarded accordingly. By extension, the same can be said of anyone who welcomes us, Jesus' disciples in the world today.

Later in the same Gospel, Jesus will expand even on this, when he says to those who are to be blessed by his Father with the reward of eternal life,

*"I was a stranger and you welcomed me... as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you did it to me".*

Hospitality is a key part of the life of a disciple. We are called to accept hospitality as it's offered to us, and to offer hospitality to others, as if they were Jesus Christ himself. Christ comes to our door in many disguises. Hospitality entails encountering the hidden presence of God in others, usually where we least expect to find Him, and offering Him there the loving service we give to that person.

We, as a parish community, are to look for opportunities to be hospitable, and, of course, there are many ways of doing this. Maybe we offer hospitality simply by offering a stranger a kind word or a smile. When we live in such a busy and hectic world, we tend to rush past people who need help. A kind smile or a "hello" to someone waiting with us in the queue at the supermarket may be the only kindness that person encounters all day. In a cold and inhospitable world, a caring person becomes an oasis of encouragement and companionship.

In particular, we are called to be welcoming to all those who come to the doors of our churches or peer in cautiously through our many "shop windows", real or virtual, that reveal something of our life. We are already making great strides in ensuring that we offer a warm welcome to those who approach us, and I hear many tales from visitors and those new to the community who have appreciated the hospitality they've received here. But I know that we are also capable of much more, so that every single person whom we encounter is treated as if they were Jesus Christ himself. I suspect many of us have encountered at some time in our life, 'bad hospitality' and it doesn't feel great. It feels even worse in church. This task isn't one just for the 'professionals', the clergy, staff and welcoming team – it's the responsibility of us all, each and every one of us.

Let me finish with another story:

*Once upon a time there was a wise abbot of a monastery who was the friend of an equally wise rabbi. This was long ago, when times were always hard, but just then they were even worse. The abbot's community was dwindling, and the faith life of his monks was fearful, weak and anxious. He went to his friend and wept. His friend, the Rabbi, comforted him, and said "there is something you need to know, my brother. We have long known in our community that the Messiah is among you."*

*"What," exclaimed the abbot, "the Messiah is among us? How can this be?"*

*But the Rabbi insisted that it was so, and the abbot went back to his monastery wondering and praying, comforted and excited. Once back in the monastery, he would pass by a monk and wonder if he was the one. Sitting in chapel, praying, he would hear a voice and look intently at a face and wonder, is he the one. The abbot had always been kind, but now began to treat all of his brothers with profound kindness and awe, ever deeper respect, even reverence. Soon everyone noticed. One of the other brothers came to him and asked him what had happened to him.*

*After some coaxing, the abbot told him what the rabbi had said. Soon the other monk was looking at his brothers differently, with deeper respect and wondering. Word spread quickly: the Messiah is among us. The monastery was suddenly full of life, worship, love and grace. The prayer life was rich and passionate, devoted, and the Masses were alive and vibrant. Soon the surrounding villagers came to the services, listening and watching intently, and many joined the community of monks. After their novitiate, when they took their vows, they were told the mystery, the truth that their life was based upon, the source of their strength, the richness of their life together: The Messiah is among us.*

*The monastery grew and expanded into house after house, and the monks grew in wisdom and grace before each other and in the eyes of God. And they say still, that if you stumble across this place where there is life and hope and kindness and graciousness, that the secret is the same: The Messiah is among us.*

Let this parish be that place!

- 5) Order plant or dairy milk to be delivered in **glass bottles**.
