Full of myself or Full of Godself?

Father Mark writes:

As I write these words, I find myself entering into the last few hours of my annual retreat. This year it has taken place at Douai Abbey, Berkshire, where I've joined with many of the diocesan clergy, under the loving care and direction of Bishop Peter Doyle. His warm, encouraging words have created a wonderful 'climate' in which to ask the Holy Spirit to help me ponder my life, calling and mission.

Any retreat needs to begin with a reminder and a renewed experience of God's infinite, unconditional love for each and every one of us, even me. All that we do and are can only be a response to the initiative taken by God in loving us first. It is knowing that we are held in his faithful and unconditional embrace that allows us then to begin to look in the mirror, so to speak, and ask the Lord to show us how He sees us.

One of the key learnings for me from this retreat has come about by allowing myself to come face to face with the objective truth of my own lack of humility. I am often too 'full of myself'. I focus too much in my thoughts on the things I do well, or that I don't do well, on things of the past and the possible things of the future, or on the things that I am afraid of – the fear of failure, the fear of embarrassment, the fear even of letting down Jesus, and others, like my family and like you, my parish family, whom I love and care for deeply.

I've been reminded of the sobering truth of my 'proud nothingness', as one author has put it, and I have found it a liberating truth. I remember that I am dust, and that to dust I shall return. Knowing this helps me to shift my focus from myself to God, and to give Him, rather than myself, the honour and the glory. It helps me to humbly but confidently ask that I may be 'full of Himself'.

I suspect I'm not alone. Trusting in the Father's faithful love for you, knowing that He sees you as you really are, more clearly than you see yourself, and loves you perfectly, I invite you to ask yourself these questions: How much time do I spend focussed on myself, in my thoughts and actions? How much energy do I give to pursuing my own dreams, tackling my own fears, worries and anxieties, applauding myself for my own gifts, or condemning myself for my own weaknesses? How much of my effort goes into comparing myself with others - they are so much better than me, or worse than me – or competing with others - over money or attention or even love? How full of myself am I? Or how much do I allow God to fill me?

Jesus is the only truly humble person. The truly humble person is the one who strives to have the heart and mind of Jesus. We see this beautifully expressed in this week's second reading:

In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus:

His state was divine, yet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death,

death on a cross.

Jesus empties himself, pours himself out, in selfless, unconditional Love.



The trajectory of God's love cannot, however, and will not end there, neither on the cross nor in the grave. The law of gravity tells us that what goes up must come down. Throw a tennis ball up and it will return to earth, usually in a beautiful parabola. Since God turns the world upside down, we can say of God's love that what goes down must come up. The self-emptying love of God hits rock bottom in the humiliating death of Jesus and his descent among the dead, before propelling Him back home, through Resurrection and Ascension, to the right hand of His Father in glory.

But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

As Jesus returns home to heaven, to receive glory and to give glory to His Father, He 'scoops us up' to take us with Him. How does he do this? By grace, the power of the Holy Spirit, the fire of His Love. God gives his grace to the humble because only the humble person is capable of recognising grace. We can allow the Lord to raise us up by emptying ourselves of ourselves, our 'old selves', and allowing our new selves, our new hearts and minds, to be filled with the Holy Spirit. In this way, we can be truly amazing people and do truly amazing things, not for our own glory but for the greater glory of God.

Again, in our second reading this weekend, St. Paul writes: There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self-effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself, so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people's interests instead.

As we hold our autumn Covenant with the Poor appeal this weekend, for Firefly International and their work with Syrian Refugees, maybe this is one practical way in which we could 'think of other people's interests instead'. Again, as we end Green Week here in Winchester, perhaps this gives us an opportunity to put before us the interests of those on our planet who are already being affected by climate change, as well as future generations, our children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren...

This week has given me a wonderful opportunity to reflect on my own need for greater humility, to self-empty in order to be filled with the Love of Jesus and led by Him, all for God's glory; to live with a new mind, the mind of Jesus, who held nothing back...But, if I'm honest, that's not something I desire just for myself, but for all of us. Please allow me then, to finish with the opening words of St. Paul in this weekend's second reading, and to make them my own, addressed to you, my beloved parish family:

"If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy.

SVP - 100 years in the Parish

We continue to share information about our work around the Parish.

This week we're focussing on the weekly Wednesday Sanctuary Welcome Hub.

In May 2022 the Hub opened its doors to welcome Ukrainians who were seeking sanctuary in Winchester and the neighbouring area. Our aim was to provide a safe and comfortable space where people could meet, share feelings and experiences, and offer mutual support. We were also able to signpost guests to relevant organisations and resources, as well as help with English conversation practice.



Over the course of 2023, we extended our welcome to sanctuary guests from across the world, bringing together people from different backgrounds, and providing a sense of community and belonging. Recently our activities have also expanded to offering befriending support to those who have sought sanctuary and are particularly isolated/lonely.

The Hub could not operate without the help of volunteers, including many SVP members. The SVP also contributes financially with the Hub's running costs.
