# Realign IV - Don't worry but pray instead

#### **Father Mark writes:**

There are so many uncertainties in life, but one thing remains certain: Jesus Christ still calls us to follow him today, just as he always has. That's certain. And he calls us as a Church to support one another as we all seek to follow him. That's certain too. It just isn't easy. It never is.

We all know we want to be loving people. And we all know we have room for improvement. There is a gap, and, if we're not careful, that gap between the loving person we want to be and the reality of how we live our lives can grow.

When we see people as God sees them, it is easier to love them as God loves them. I want us to help each other to align, or realign, our view of people with God's view.

A few weeks ago, we were looking at the fact that God forgave us a debt we could not repay. So, when others hurt us or annoy us or just get in our way, he teaches us to cancel their debt too. We love people best by forgiving them their faults and flaws and failures, just as God has forgiven us a much greater debt.

Today we are looking at how to love others when we are frustrated with what they are doing or not doing. In other words, what to do when people are driving you crazy by their words and actions.

So today, we are going to offer two suggestions for what to do when people are frustrating you. Before we get to those two practices, we are going to look at two things not to do.

The first mistake we make is trying to control people. We all have our own way of controlling or manipulating people so that we can get our way, probably using different ways at different times. But, if you think about it, you actually can't manipulate people and love them at the same time. The two are mutually exclusive. If you're actively manipulating someone, you are not actively loving them. God never manipulates or controls us. He gives us free will.

Philippians 4:6

The second mistake we make is equally common, and it is very explicitly addressed in Scripture. We find it in St. Paul's letter to the Philippians, which we read again this weekend. Paul writes,

"Have no anxiety at all."

Now in talking about anxiety we are not referring to the mental health disorder that requires treatment and sometimes medication. We're talking about what everybody feels when they're stressed out or worried.

Our anxiety might be caused by fear of danger or misfortune, or fear of the future, by apprehension concerning current events, or obsessive regret about the past. We often get anxious at other people's words or thoughts or behaviour but that is a choice we make. People's behaviours and beliefs can be temptations for anxiety but they are not the cause.

When Paul says, "Have no anxiety at all", he is suggesting we have a choice. Other people are responsible for their behaviours and we are responsible for our responses. Nobody else is the cause of your anxiety, but rather your response is the cause of your anxiety.

If we are honest, worry and anxiety add nothing positive. So, rather than getting anxious and upset about other people's behaviours and beliefs, there is something much more positive we can do.

Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.

Rather than worrying about people or controlling them, you can love them by praying for them. You can release them and their decisions and their choices over to God.

Think about it: If you turned all

your worry into prayer; if, every time you found yourself worrying, you turned it into a prayer, you would be a world class pray-er.

You can pray for others to change or make better choices. Or even better, pray that they will draw closer to God. Pray blessings over their life, even if that means things don't go your way.

Rather than letting people make you anxious/upset, use that feeling of worry as an opportunity for prayer and thanksgiving. Hand everything and everyone over to God.

Then, the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Praying for people, especially those who are the source of anxiety, brings peace. The peace of God will guard your hearts and minds. You hand people over to God through prayer and, in exchange, he will grant you peace that will guard your heart against further anxiousness and anxiety...a pretty good deal.

Now as good as that sounds and as simple as that sounds, it's not enough. We need help to make it happen, because very few of us are any good at this.

We need friends in faith, people who can encourage us/support us/walk with us. That's why we have our Acorn Groups and other small groups here in the parish. Our small groups are relationships that support your other relationships. They help you carry the burdens you have to carry and release the ones that are not yours to carry. They're a safe place in your life, where you can process what's going on in your life. Our various small groups are the place to grow in faith as you learn about others faith. Elsewhere Paul says:

"I will learn from your faith and you will learn from mine".

That might seem scary for some of you. You might not think you have much faith to share. You might think: "I don't really know the Bible. I don't even know the commandments or the Church teachings." But don't let that stop you. There really aren't that many theologians in the parish. Most people are just like you.

Wherever you are on your faith journey, others can learn from you and your faith experiences. Groups are not about having all the answers, they're about asking and exploring questions, learning and growing in faith.

Our Acorn Groups are small groups, and Alpha and Journey in Faith are both based on small groups. Deacon Martin's sessions on the Holy Spirit in Scripture will give the opportunity to discuss in small groups. In Advent, and especially in Lent, we'll set up some temporary small groups. Most are in person, some are online.

We believe in small groups and are increasingly seeing the value of them. The stress and tension of life is not good for us to carry all alone and on our own. During dark and difficult times friends in faith can bring light and life.

# Prisoners' Sunday - Parish Support Group for Winchester - SECOND COLLECTION AT MASSES

On **Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> October**, the Church marks **Prisoners' Sunday**, the national day of pray, action and (we hope) generosity - for those in prison, their loved ones and those who work with them. In the Parish of St Peter's, we are a small but growing group of volunteers supporting Fr Jean Patrice Coulon's Chaplaincy within Winchester Prison. This is what we do:



- We attend Prison Mass, held every Saturday morning.
- We demonstrate Christ's love to all without judgement by listening and talking with prisoners and prison staff before and after Mass.
- We signpost prisoners to the Prisoners Advice and Care Trust (PACT) and make them aware of the support available for their families and themselves on their release.
- We have links with SVP to help fund commodities such as reading glasses and stress balls.
- We share specific prisoner prayer intentions with our Parish Prayer Intercessors.

How to help? Volunteers will need to go through a Prison Vetting process should they feel called to this Ministry.

Year 4 have been learning about architecture in art, and in history we have been looking at Anglo Saxons. We combined our learning and built Anglo Saxon houses, using only the materials Anglo Saxons would have used. We cut sticks and hessian and combined them with lambswool and clay to form structures. We then used our Typography learning from Year 3 to label our design creations. Henry - "I really enjoyed making things with sticks and clay. I labelled my house the end of the world because it kept falling down."

Eva - "I found this quite tricky but I really enjoyed designing my structure with my partners. I called my house lovely because it looked lovely."

Noah - "I really enjoyed this art project because I liked exploring and building our houses. I was really proud of my finished product."

Riley - "It was challenging to make the walls, but even when it was challenging we had to keep adapting."

Year 3 have enjoyed learning about Andy Goldsworthy this week. We explored his sculptures and then used natural objects around our school to create our own artwork. We were encouraged to think about what we could represent using the natural objects – some of us chose to represent things like a beach, the moon or the spiral of the Milky Way.

Year 6 have been looking at the artist Paul Cezanne and his collected paintings of still life. We have explored sketching techniques and the use of positive and negative space to begin to create our own images.
