Second Sunday of Advent - Year B

Fill Us with Your Spirit – Baptise Us in Your Life – Soak Us in Your Love

Father Mark writes:

This weekend, we start at the very beginning (a very good place to start). We listen to the first eight verses of Mark's Gospel and our evangelist, our Gospel-writer, makes it very clear that this is all about Jesus. Even in the very first verse, we discover that Jesus is the "Son of God". The reader is invited to hold onto this throughout the Gospel, in which nearly all the characters "on stage" grapple with the question of Jesus' identity ("Who is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?"). We are given a privileged insight and vantage point.

Admittedly, John the Baptist features heavily in this passage, and we learn some interesting things about him. John would have been a well-known, much loved and respected preacher and Mark seems to 'use' him in order to help us, the audience, get our bearings. For example, Mark saw John as a new Elijah, the Old Testament prophet who had a similar taste in clothing style, and whose return was expected to pave the way for the Messiah. In fact, everything Mark tells us about John is in relation to Jesus.

We learn that Jesus is important enough for someone as impressive as John to be required to prepare his way. There is an inference already that this is because Jesus is "Lord", a name reserved for God alone. John tells us that Jesus will follow him (as if he were the "warm up act" for Jesus), that Jesus is more powerful than he is, that he is unfit to kneel down and untie his sandal strap. Then, most importantly, John tells us that whilst he himself baptises with water, Jesus will baptise them with the Holy Spirit.

It is this last, bold statement that I would like to unpack a little this week. What does it mean for Jesus to baptise us in / with the Holy Spirit?

Pope Benedict XVI, in one of his Angelus addresses, said:

"Christ's entire mission is summed up in this: to baptise us in the Holy Spirit, to free us from the slavery of death, and to open heaven to us."

That's why Jesus came. This is the wonderful, life-changing Good News for you and me, and for us to share with others. Without the Spirit upon you, your life is Mission Impossible; with the Holy Spirit upon you it is Mission Possible.

Let's look a little more closely at that word 'baptise'. What does the Greek word 'baptizo' mean? Well, it didn't originally have the technical, narrow sacramental meaning that it does now. It was an ordinary word, meaning dip completely, in the sense of immersing, soaking or even submerging. I often like to translate it as 'to dunk'. Maybe think of that next time you're baptising your biscuit in a cup of tea...

So, Mark 1:8 could be translated:

"I have soaked you with water, but he [Jesus] will soak you with the Holy Spirit."

The image I have in mind is much more of a sponge than a stone. A stone can get a little wet when it gets immersed in water, but it doesn't hold onto the water very well and soon dries when removed. A sponge, on the other hand, will soak up a huge amount of the water and, when removed, will hold onto the water for a long time, even as it drips water everywhere.

In the Acts of the Apostles, we hear Jesus himself, just before returning to his Father in heaven, speaking of this baptism that he will give:

And while staying with them he ordered them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now".

The baptism in/with the Holy Spirit appears to refer to the experience of the disciples gathered in the Upper Room at Pentecost, when they were filled with (or we might say, "soaked in" or "immersed in") the Holy Spirit, the very Love of God.

What does it mean for you or me to be 'baptised in/with the Holy Spirit'? It means that we too experience our own personal and perennial Pentecost. Blessed Paul IV once said at a General Audience,

The Church needs her perennial Pentecost; she needs fire in her heart, words on her lips, prophecy in her outlook... The Church needs to rediscover the eagerness, the taste and the certainty of the truth that is hers... And then the Church needs to feel flowing through all her human faculties a wave of love, of that love which is called forth and poured into our hearts "by the Holy Spirit who has been given to us" (Romans 5.5)".

This renewal and activation and actualisation of baptism, and all that Christian initiation involves, is something we can receive again and again, and again. Sometimes it happens unexpectedly, as a "surprise" of the Holy Spirit. Sometimes, it is when, with humility, we prepare ourselves by confessing our sins and opening ourselves up, within an atmosphere of being loved and cared for, in a place where we feel we belong, to the truths of realities our faith:

"Jesus Christ loves you; he gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side every day to enlighten, strengthen and free you."

In this way, the Holy Spirit transforms us from within, giving us, for example, a desire to praise God, leading us to discover a new and deeper joy, opening our mind to understand the Scripture, an experience of being a beloved son or daughter of God, of truly being able to call Jesus "Lord" of our own life and "Lord of all", or of a new courage or energy to take on new and difficult tasks in the service of God and neighbour, opening ourselves up to being instruments of God's love and mercy.

To return to those beautiful words of Pope Benedict,

"Christ's entire mission is summed up in this: to baptise us in the Holy Spirit, to free us from the slavery of death, and to open heaven to us."

And these beautiful words of Pope Francis, just this week:

"Brothers and sisters, let us allow ourselves to be drawn by the Spirit and invoke him every day; may he be the source of our being and our work; may he be at the origin of every activity, encounter, meeting and proclamation. He enlivens and rejuvenates the Church: with him we must not fear, because he, who is harmony, always keeps creativity and simplicity together, inspires communion and sends out in mission, opens to diversity and leads back to unity. He is our strength, the breath of our proclamation, the source of apostolic zeal. Come, Holy Spirit!"

The Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

“Do not be afraid of Confession! One who is in line to confess himself feels all these things – even shame – but then, when he finishes confessing, he leaves free, great, beautiful, forgiven...happy. 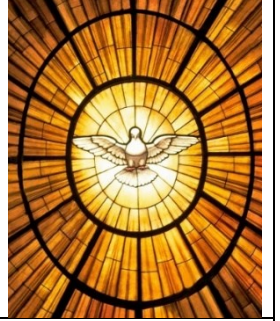


Christmas plants in memory, at St. Stephens

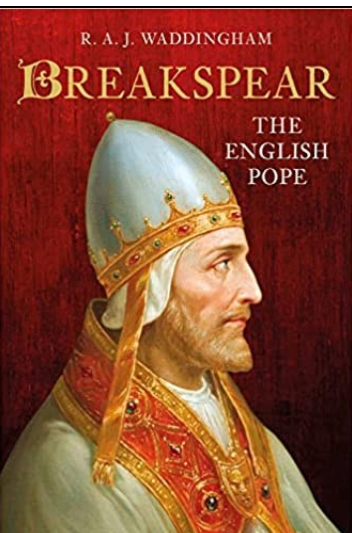
St Gregory's Christmas Fair

WINCHESTER CATHOLIC HISTORY SOCIETY The next talk for the Winchester Catholic History Society will be on **TUESDAY 12 DECEMBER at 7.15 pm in the Pastoral Centre**. Adrian Waddingham CBE will be speaking on his new book, 'Nicholas Breakspear: The English Pope'

In over 2,000 years of Christianity there has only been one English Pope - Nicholas Breakspear, reigning as Adrian IV. He was born around 1100 near St Albans, Hertfordshire and was elected Pope in 1154. Papal rule then was very much about political power struggles and intrigue. His papacy was dominated by problems with the Holy Roman Emperor Frederick 1 and the Byzantine Emperor Manuel Komnenos. Adrian IV died in September 1159 after a brief rule of just four years. Some say he was poisoned!

Adrian Waddingham's new book tells the exciting story of this unknown man who ascended the throne of St Peter and has been virtually forgotten.
