Learning to Know What to Say

#### **Father Mark writes:**

Last weekend is what I would call a mixed weekend.

There was real joy for me as we welcomed Revd Simon Cansdale from Christchurch here in Winchester. Simon and I have been meeting, along with other church ministers in the city, on Zoom and in person, for the last few years and so it was a particular delight to be able to invite him to join us for our worship. He was humble and gracious and generous and spoke beautifully and powerfully.

There was also "fatherly pride" for me to be able to allow Simon to see our community (or at least a part of it). I was able to pause briefly from time to time and see the welcome team making Simon and other guests feel at home; to hear the beautiful music being led by our musicians and sung throughout the church; to witness the seemingly endless procession of 40-50 young children going out for their own Liturgy of the Word and then returning for the Liturgy of the Eucharist with a "net full of fish";

to be barely aware of the altar servers, moving reverently around the sanctuary; to offer Holy Communion and blessings to those who came forward from every tribe and people and nation; to participate in the liturgy, filled with prayer and reverence, awe and wonder.

I was very blessed.

Then, just before I began a baptism soon after (which was another joy, -to welcome Nathaniel, a gift from God into our Church family), I spotted a text message from someone from my first parish in Southampton, asking me to call them back. When we spoke, she shared with me the tragic news that her sister, Chloe, just 27 years old, had passed away that night. I'd known Chloe for pretty much all of my life as a priest, about 22 years. I had prepared her for her first holy communion, and celebrated the funeral Mass for her mother when Chloe was just 7 or 8 years old. I had dipped in and out of Chloe's life ever since, accompanying her through some of those ups and downs. Last autumn I met with Chloe and her sister for dinner and we laughed and chatted and reminisced. Just before Christmas we learnt the sad news that Chloe's auntie, Danielle, had died suddenly, aged just 40 years old. It was only 2 weeks ago, less than a week before Chloe died, that I saw her at Danielle's funeral and Chloe said that she would message me to give an update on her baby Scarlett and her other news. To say that I am heartbroken is an understatement. I cannot even begin to imagine what her sister and family must be feeling.

It was, as I say, a mixed weekend.


In all of this, the questions I am coming back to are these: Lord, what are you trying to say to me at this time? Lord, what do you want to say through me?

What words do you have for me, Lord, when I seem to have none for myself and even less to offer? In the moments of deep joy and intense pain, help me to be attentive to your voice. Speak, Lord, your servant is listening.

Our Bible readings this weekend remind us that we should have a "listening heart" (Gospel), instead of a "hardened heart" (Responsorial Psalm) or a "divided heart" (Second reading) to welcome the authoritative word of God. Today's first reading tells us that a true prophet like Moses speaks with authority because it is God Who speaks through him.



Moses was about to die. The Chosen People were terrified because they were about to lose the person who had been successfully leading them through the wilderness toward



the Promised Land. They were also going to lose a prophet who had been keeping them informed of the Lord's will. When he died, how would they find out what God wanted of them? How would

they know what God wanted to say to them?

God answers the question by promising Moses that He will heed the people's request and raise up for them a prophet like Moses from among their kin. The people were to listen to this prophet because the Lord would put His words into this prophet's mouth, telling the people all that God would command him."

After the Babylonian exile, the Jewish priests began to interpret the words of Moses given in the first reading, namely, "a prophet like me," as referring to one individual, the expected Messiah. This passage is chosen for today's first reading because it refers to Jesus, the



"preacher with authority," mentioned in today's Gospel. Jesus is a prophet, anointed by the Holy Spirit, who hears the Word of God and speaks it with authority.

Both Moses and Jesus listened to God and were obedient to Him.

You too are a prophet. At least, if you have been baptised, then you were anointed with the oil of chrism and filled with the Holy Spirit and given a share in the prophetic ministry of Jesus. I don't know how often you think about this. I suspect not very often. But it's true. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (which gives a summary of the teachings of the Church), tells us that:

Jesus Christ is the one whom the Father anointed with the Holy Spirit and established as priest, prophet, and king. the whole People of God participates in these three offices of Christ and bears the responsibilities for mission and service that flow from them (#783)

At least part of that role as a prophet is to learn to listen to the voice of God and then to be obedient to it. We pray "Thy will be done" but how can we do the will of the Father unless we know what the will of the Father is?

And how do we know what words to share in times of joy and pain if we are not listening to the Father's heart and learning to have our hearts broken for what breaks his..?

Your homework this week..? Simply to bring this prayer to God: Lord, help me to hear what you are saying to me. Lord, help me to listen to what you want to say through me.


### Lent 2024 – Join us for a rewarding spiritual journey
