## A Message from Fr Mark... Listening to God's Voice - Listen to His Son, Jesus

Perhaps you have heard of the man who wanted to test his wife's hearing. He stood some distance behind her and said, "My dear, can you hear me?" Having received no answer, he moved closer and again whispered, "My dear, can you hear me?" Again, having received no answer he moved right up behind her and softly said, "My dear, can you hear me?" She replied, "For the third time, yes!"

Are there similarities between this story and our communication with God? We often check to see if He is listening, in the hope that He will respond to our needs. In reality, He hears us, but we won't know that unless we're able to hear Him too. Are we able to be attentive to his voice? Do we believe that he is speaking to us, that we are able to hear him?

In real life, it is very often not just God and me in the room. There are so many other voices clamouring for my attention - TV, radio, newspaper, social media, voices of people I love and care for, and who love and care for me, but also voices of people who want to sell me things, voices of people who are more interested in what they can get from me than in what they can do for me. How do we tell what voices to listen to. whose advice to take, what directives are important, and what we should just let fall on deaf ears? In today's Gospel text, the Divine Voice from the enshrouding cloud offered Peter, James, and John a simple, straightforward instruction:

"This is My Beloved Son; listen to Him." The message and mission of Jesus were meant to guide the disciples, informing all their actions, influencing their whole lives, enabling them to filter all else they heard. God's proclamation to those three disciples is the same for all who follow Christ today: Let Jesus be your high-tech hearing aid, filtering and clarifying what you hear and how you respond. Listen to him. Jesus is the truly obedient One, who does only that which His Heavenly Father wills. Jesus is foreshadowed by Abraham, loved by God, and blessed by Him. Let's pray that we may learn to be obedient to the Father by listening to Jesus and trusting Him. Then let us do whatever the Lord tells us, just as Mary told the servants at the wedding feast in Cana. Let us commit this Lent to being better listeners so that we may know what it is the Lord is telling us to do and then asking for courage to do it.

Lent should be a listening time for each of us. When we learn to listen, our lives become obedient lives, which in turn become fruitful lives as we bring God's love and mercy and compassion and healing into the world. Wouldn't it be a beautiful thing if we were able more clearly to hear God's voice, to have our hearts fed by His words of Love whispered into the secret caverns of our hearts, so that we could see His presence working through us and witness His power and His glory?

O God, who have commanded us to listen to your beloved Son, be pleased, we pray, to nourish us inwardly by your word, that, with spiritual sight made pure, we may rejoice to behold your glory.
