First Sunday of Lent - Year B

A Message from Fr Mark... Listening to God's Heart – Stepping Forward in Faith

And shortly after that they looked into a room that was quite empty except for one big wardrobe; the sort that has a looking-glass in the door. "Nothing there!" said Peter, and they all trooped out again - all except Lucy. She stayed behind because she thought it would be worthwhile trying the door of the wardrobe, even though she felt almost sure that it would be locked. To her surprise it opened quite easily, and two mothballs dropped out. Looking into the inside, she saw several coats hanging up...She immediately stepped into the wardrobe and got in among the coats...she kept her arms stretched out in front of her so as not to bump her face into the back of the wardrobe. She took a step further in then two or three steps - always expecting to feel woodwork against the tips of her fingers. But she could not feel it.

"This must be a simply enormous wardrobe!" thought Lucy, going still further in...Lucy then...saw that there was a light ahead of her; not a few inches away where the back of the wardrobe ought to have been but a long way off. Something cold and soft was falling on her. A moment later she found that she was standing in the middle of a wood at night-time with snow under her feet and snowflakes falling through the air.

Lucy felt a little frightened, but she felt very inquisitive and excited as well. She looked back over her shoulder and there, between the dark tree-trunks, she could still see the open doorway of the wardrobe..."I can always get back if anything goes wrong," thought Lucy. She began to walk forward... In these few paragraphs we find Lucy Pevensie entering the world of Narnia via the wardrobe in C.S. Lewis' classic book, The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe. She decides it would be worthwhile to take a step and then ventures further and further in until she finds herself emerging, a little frightened but very inquisitive and excited too... That mixture of fear and curiosity and excitement are common to me whenever I find myself taking a step forward in faith towards or into something new. It might be something trivial, like the step onto a new rollercoaster ride, or something more substantial, like entering a meeting that I know will have a major impact on my life or that of others. I feel all of these things too when I take a step forward in faith: when I sense the Lord is calling me deeper into

Lord is calling me deeper into something, even if I'm not sure what, when there is something, someone, who is encouraging me to step out of my comfort zone and into a place where I need to rely more on Him. I've heard it said that faith is spelt R.I.S.K. and risktaking, for me at least, involves fear and curiosity and excitement...
