

Help extend Catholic school in Munagallapalli, India

Sisters of St Lucy educating impoverished Indian children

The Sisters of St. Lucy are well-known for their education work in Africa and South America through several recent CWP appeals. We may know little of their work in India, however.

Most schools in India are secular and it is very hard for Catholic schools to survive. The education system has recently changed, and schooling will now finish at year 12 instead of year 10. This means that more students will be able to go to university, and so improve their career prospects and have a better future.



However, this also means that schools have had to create the extra space for two more years of teaching. The sisters run 2 schools in Andhra Pradesh and have asked for our help with one of these, a school in Munagallapalli which is east of Hyderabad. This school needs an extra floor for the additional teaching and, if not completed by 2025, the government will close the school.



Work has already started on this extra floor but, as you can imagine, the Sisters need funds to complete the project. Your donations could pay for all the electrical wiring for this floor. The space needs lighting, wiring for the science labs and fans for all the rooms. The temperature is often above 35°C so the fans are essential. Any extra we raise can go towards badly needed equipment.

The school teaches children of coolie labourers, who are regarded as the lowest caste. Education for these children will enable them to rise above their poverty, and develop their gifts to improve their lives and those of their families.
