A Message from Fr Mark... Actions Speak Louder than Words

Throughout the ages, many, including St. Anthony of Padua, have claimed that "actions speak louder than words". There is much truth in this, even considering the fact that the volume of our speech is not always an accurate indicator of the truth of what we are saying. What we communicate with our actions needs just as much interpretation as what we say with our lips.

We've been reflecting this Lent on how to listen to God as He speaks to us from his heart. I'd like to suggest that we can learn much by looking at what God does as well as what God says. This weekend's Gospel gives us a wonderful opportunity to do just this. John 3:16, has been called a summary of the whole Gospel. In fact, one translation allows us to discover the very word, 'Gospel', hidden within:

" $\underline{\mathbf{G}}$ od so loved the world that He gave His

<u>**O**</u>nly-begotten <u>**S**</u>on, so that whoever believes in Him should not

<u>P</u>erish but have <u>E</u>ternal **L**ife." - Jn 3:16

One of our Eucharistic Prayers, addressed to the Father as always, expresses this gift of Love beautifully:

"For you have given us Jesus Christ, your Son, as our Lord and Redeemer. He always showed compassion for children and for the poor, for the sick and for sinners, and he became a neighbour to the oppressed and the afflicted.

By word and deed he announced to the world that you are our Father and that you care for all your sons and daughters." The ultimate announcement of the Love of God comes in the Mystery of the Cross and the death and Resurrection of Jesus.

"We have enough reason to trust God, because when we look at the cross, we understand how much Jesus loved us. It is wonderful to be able to come to Jesus! That's why God made Him – to be our bread of life, to give us life! And with His life comes new life! New energy! New peace! New joy! New everything! And I think that's what brings glory to God, also, and it brings peace." - St. "Mother" Teresa of Kolkata

This Lent, will I allow God to speak to me personally of His immense Love, announced through the free gift of Jesus and His life, death and resurrection?

One wonderful Lenten way to deepen my sense of what God is saying to me personally through the Passion of Jesus is to pray the stations of the cross. I'd highly recommend it. There are lots of versions available and you can find one here, led by Cardinal Vincent Nichols, reflecting on the Stations in Lourdes.

Or simply come back to this key text from our Gospel, personalised, whilst gazing at an image of Jesus crucified. Maybe print it and put in on your fridge or memorise it:

"God loves **me** so much
That He gave **me** Jesus
So that if **I** believe in Him, **I** will not die,
but **I** will have eternal life
For God sent Jesus to **me**Not to condemn **me**But so that **I** might be saved through
Jesus."
