**A Message from Fr Mark...**

**Pray like this: Abba, Father – Let me walk upon the waters, Thy will be done**

There was, once upon a time, a fish who was taken out of the water and placed on a beach. His gills gasped and his scales rapidly began to dry in the midday sun. This did not a happy fish make.



How would you make him happy? Would you cover him with a mountain of cash? Or would you get him a beach chair and some sunglasses? Do you bring him a good book to read and a martini? Do you wardrobe him in double-breasted fins and people-skinned shoes? Of course not!

So, how would you make him happy? You simply put him back in his element. That's what you do. You put him back in the water. He will never be happy on the beach because he was not made for the beach.

Indeed so, and the same is true for you and me. We will never be happy living apart from the One who made us and saved us. Just as a fish was made to live in water... we were made to live in close and intimate fellowship with our Lord... for our will to be submerged in his will... and nothing can take the place of that.



Jesus uses another image in our Gospel this weekend, of a vine and its branches. When a branch is cut off from the vine, it loses life rapidly. It withers and dies and is just good to be burnt. Attached to the vine, on the other hand, fully connected to the source of its life, the sap flowing freely without blockages or restrictions, and the vine will produce beautiful and abundant and life-giving fruit.

God gives life to us and through us as we learn to swim freely in the ocean of God's love, or we come to abide more fully in the vine, whilst allowing the vine to abide in us. For us to be inside God and have God completely inside us is for us to hand ourselves over, to surrender or submit ourselves completely to his will.

That's not always easy. Sometimes we need pruning – allowing God to remove from us all that is “my will be done”. There can be unhealthy patterns of behaviour or addictions which have become attached to us, or us to them. There can be lies which we've allowed, consciously or otherwise to become a part of us. There may be wounds which we've allowed to fester and become infected. Jesus wants to free us from these, and it can sometimes be painful.



It is, however, when we wholeheartedly say, “Thy will be done”, that our heavenly Father, Abba, can enable us to bear much fruit – the peace and joy and love which others can taste and savour and which offers them hope.
