A Message from Fr Mark...

Pray Like This – Deliver us from evil - Save us from the wolves

Our Father

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that he is the "Good Shepherd", willing to lay down his life to protect us, his Father's children, his sheep, from the wolves that seek to attack and scatter us. We know that Jesus laid down his life on the cross to rescue us from all the wolves that seek to harm and destroy us.

What are some of those wolves?

- Well, they might be temptations to sin (e.g. does it really matter if you take / do that? Surely no one will get hurt, and you deserve it)
- Or lies that you've been fed (do you really think that God cares about you or is interested in you? Do you think you'll ever be good enough to please God? You'd be much better on your own than trusting in God and you'd have more fun. Do you really think God exists or is loving when you look at all the suffering in the world?)
- Or wounds you've experienced through neglect or bad things that have been done to you (e.g. you've never been shown genuine affection, or someone is always saying cruel things about you).

Those wolves are too powerful and clever for us to overcome by ourselves but (and this is the beauty of our faith) *that doesn't matter.*

We are not called to fight the devil on our own and we know that the wolves are not too powerful for Jesus. He can rescue us, protect us, deliver us from all that seeks to attack and destroy us - if we call upon him.



Every time we pray the Our Father, we are praying for the Lord to fight the enemy for us, to "deliver us from evil".



The catechism tells us that:

"In this petition, evil is not an abstraction, but refers to a person, Satan, the evil one, the angel who opposes God. The devil (dia-bolos) is the one who "throws himself across" God's plan and his work of salvation accomplished in Christ".
(Catechism, #2851)

Satan is:

"a murderer from the beginning...a liar and the father of lies", the "deceiver of the whole world". "The Lord who has taken away your sin and pardoned your faults also protects you and keeps you from the wiles of your adversary the devil, so that the enemy, who is accustomed to leading you into sin, may not surprise you. One who entrusts himself to God does not dread the devil. 'If God is for us, who is against us?'"

"When we ask to be delivered from the Evil One, we pray as well to be freed from all evils, present, past, and future, of which he is the author or instigator. In this final petition, the Church brings before the Father all the distress of the world. Along with deliverance from the evils that overwhelm humanity, she implores the precious gift of peace and the grace of perseverance in expectation of Christ's return. By praying in this way, she anticipates in humility of faith the gathering together of everyone and everything in him who has "the keys of Death and Hades," who "is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."" The Our Father is a confident, bold prayer, not because we are confident or bold ourselves but because we can have confidence in our Heavenly Father, our Abba. We can trust in his love for us, his adopted sons and daughters.
