# A Message from Fr Mark...

### Pray like This - Thy Will Be Done

Every time we pray the Our Father, we ask our Abba that his will be done.

#### Asking that God's will be done

This means that we are asking God to act. "Abba, carry out your will; do what you want to do." We are trusting God to act well and to do the right thing. He sees the bigger picture, more clearly than we ever could, and he loves us more than we could ever imagine. We know he will do what is best for us, and what is best for our brothers and sisters.

# Co-operating with God's will

To ask that God's will be done isn't, though, just a passive act of resignation, or even a deep imploring from the sidelines. Asking God's will to be done means more than merely relinquishing or letting go of my own will, as difficult and as challenging as that can be. It's good to note and imitate the way in which Mary submitted herself completely to the will of the Father. Eve said 'no' to

God in the garden of Eden; Mary said 'yes' to him in Nazareth. Eve didn't trust God but Mary is the mother of all who believe. Mary has provided God with the decisive 'yes' but it was not an easy 'yes'. Mary had no model to follow. Nobody else had been the Mother of God and so she had nobody to copy, no example to learn from. She was, and remains, unique. It was also a risky, dangerous 'yes'.

Mary never said, 'Let it be done to me according to your word.' But that is because she never spoke English! Mary is most likely to have answered, 'Amen!' To say 'Amen' is to give our full and complete consent to God. 'Yes' or 'Sí' or 'Oui' or 'Ja' tends to be a short word in most languages but it's a short word packed with a lot of power because with it we make a decision for our whole life.

Mary said a joyful 'Yes' to God! She felt loved by God and her 'yes' was a 'yes to Love'.

## Discerning God's will

In our First Reading this weekend, the Eleven choose the replacement for Judas, so that they may become the Twelve once more (for this is the number of the tribes of Israel, and the Church is the new Israel, the new People of God). One commentator notes that: "The method of choice of the twelfth member is itself significant: the Spirit has not yet come upon the members of the community to fill their minds and hearts and so enable them to select the twelfth member in a way both human and inspired. So in prayer the Lord is called upon to make the choice in a way which does not depend on the still uninspired human agency."

Let us spend these next few days, praying more earnestly to Abba, that his will be done and his kingdom come. But let us also pray more intensely for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit, not least that we may hear his voice more clearly and cooperate more wholeheartedly. If we look at Byzantine icons of Pentecost we see 6 apostles either side, with Mary in the middle, in an attitude of prayer. The Apostles are active, but Mary is still, like the mast of a ship, contemplative. Mary has put herself at the service of the Church, so that we can receive the Holy Spirit.

Know that Mary is at our service too, praying for us, so that we can also receive the same Holy Spirit and bear witness to the Risen Christ.



# **Thy Kingdom Come - Novena to the Holy Spirit**

Pentecost will soon be upon us, when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit given to Mary and the Apostles, and so also to the early Church. After Ascension, which we celebrated on Thursday 9th, those first disciples were told by Jesus not to leave Jerusalem but to wait there "for what the Lord had promised" (Acts 1:4) Please would you consider offering a Novena to the Holy Spirit from Friday 10th May -Saturday 18th May for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us as individuals, upon our parish, our diocese and upon Winchester and the surrounding towns and villages.
