A Message from Fr Benedict...

Prophesy to My People

When Amaziah asked the Prophet to go away from Bethel and not to prophesy there any more, Amos among other things replied: "...it was the Lord who took me from herding the flock, and the Lord who said, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'" We can understand 'Go, prophesy to my people' to mean the same as "Go and preach to my people," or "go and proclaim the Good News to my people" as we see Jesus in the Gospel sending His Apostles in pairs with authority even over unclean spirits. While the Old Testament uses prophesy, the New Testament uses preach or proclaim. We may be tempted to ask what 'to prophesy' actually means.

From its Greek roots, a **prophet** is "one who speaks for" (or on behalf of) and is also "an interpreter of the will of God." Thus, "to prophesy" means to speak for God thereby interpreting His will to others or to publicly preach His Words.

In contemporary charismatic or Pentecostal circles, prophesying is more and more being considered as an immediate inspiration flowing out from unpremeditated ideas and words (though the social media prophecies are well planned and calculated). Much of this aspect of prophesying has turned out to be drama or a show intended as a means of campaign for more members into the congregation.

From our readings of today and similar valid Biblical Prophets, prophesying involves much more of the Divine element than either their expository preaching or their ecstatic utterances. Amos tells us, "I was no prophet, neither did I belong to any of the brotherhoods of prophets... I was a shepherd, and looked after sycamores." This shows that there was no prior knowledge, learning, memorisation of a particular topic intended to give as prophesy. God was the authority behind his prophecy. Our emphasis here is that God directly equips the individual with His Word and Will when He wants it done and not at the decision of the individual.

Let us remind ourselves that a **Prophet** is/was a person chosen by God who speaks God's message to and guides the people.

Prophets of God often had a teaching and revelatory role, declaring God's truth, connecting the present and the future.

Their characteristics: faithful and truthful to God and His Word; they would not contradict God's revealed Word; they worshipped God alone; they interceded to God for the people; they were meek, gentle, humble and of a pure heart; they were advocates of forgiveness and God's justice; they were filled by the Holy Spirit and not influenced by other spirits; they discerned and acted with discretion; they had no agenda for personal benefits but God's agenda alone; they were fearless and trusted in God; they were full of integrity and moral uprightness; they were obedient to God; they spoke on behalf of the voiceless or the poor.

These qualities of a prophet now make us understand what God would mean by telling us to '**Go, prophesy to my people**'. Summarily, to prophesy is to alert the people of the consequences of their sins (or actions), to comfort them thereby giving them a message of hope for the future, to help people amend their ways by pricking their consciences, to be an example or sign for them to follow and to speak on behalf of the powerless. From the meaning of Prophesying and from Amos' response to Amaziah, we can pick up the following lessons:

- 1) God calls, transforms, equips and commissions ordinary individuals because He sees the heart.
- 2) The burden of a Divine Calling cannot be easily ignored. Just like Amos we have Paul as another example: "woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel" (1 Cor. 9:16).
- 3) We also see that worship must be on God's terms, not ours. Jeroboam had turned the minds of the people against the true worship for personal ambitions (cf. 1 Kings 12:26-28) which Amos then came up to renounce yet he was being sent away by the priest.
- 4) It should also be clear to us that God is Sovereign over the nations and their kings (royal sanctuary).

Just as all the prophecies ended with messages of hope pointing out to the Messiah who would free the whole of Israel, let us continue in the joyful hope of the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ. You can spend your time singing this music: "My Only Hope is You Jesus..."

His Holiness Pope Francis unveiled a message for the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation anticipated on 1st September: *"To hope and act with creation, then, means above all to join forces and to walk together with all men and women of good will."*

As we reflect on these words in July, let us carry forward the spirit of unity and dedication for that this celebration represents into the Season of Creation in September. For that season we have arranged a half-day **Conference on Saturday morning 14th September in the Pastoral Centre** covering Laudate Deum, the Pope's recent Apostolic Exhortation and the way forward for us all in saving the planet.
