This Teaching is Difficult – But Where Else Can We Go if Jesus has the Message of Eternal Life

A Message from Fr Mark

Actress Dolores Hart, was once hailed as the next Grace Kelly. She gave Elvis Presley his first on-screen kiss and worked alongside leading men like Montgomery Clift, Anthony Quinn and Marlon Brando - to name but a few. But in 1962 she left Hollywood behind and became a nun. In 2016, the former star, now known as Mother Dolores Hart, celebrated 50 years of vowed life at the Abbey of Regina Laudis, an enclosed Benedictine monastery and working farm in Bethlehem, Conn. The now-82-year-old previously released a memoir titled 'The Ear of the Heart: An Actress' Journey from Hollywood to Holy Vows", where she detailed her surprising journey. Her story was also the subject of an Oscar-nominated short film on HBO, titled "God Is the Bigger Elvis", released in 2012. You can watch a short clip here -

Actress Dolores Hart accepted the challenge to make a brave choice for God, sacrificing what many would have considered the perfect life, and "Yes!" - not just an act of Faith in the Real kept it with commitment.

Last week, we had a tough, challenging message from Jesus. Many of you, I know, found it hard. I to give us and ask of us. find it hard too, and so did Jesus' first disciples. Faithful discipleship is seldom easy. Why is the Despite having witnessed many miracles, including the Feeding of the 5,000, we hear them say to Jesus today:

"This teaching is difficult. Who can accept it?" They were, understandably, offended by Jesus' language – eating his Flesh and drinking his Blood to have Life eternal. It smacked of cannibalism and going against the strict dietary requirements persecution. They knew martyred Christians, they'd received from God. This was the Master's dramatic way of saying that we must accept St Peter's on Tuesday 3rd September at Jesus totally, without any conditions or reservations, his words and teachings and his very self. We and Jesus are to become as one in The total assimilation of Jesus into our lives is every way. Above all we are to identify with Jesus in the offering of His Flesh and the pouring some of Jesus' disciples were not prepared to out of His Blood on the cross, the ultimate face. The reason? "There are among you some expression of God's unfathomable love for us. However, without giving any further explanation, Even when we don't get it or fully understand, Jesus simply challenges them to open themselves we must hear in our own heart and soul Peter's to the gift of Faith that God is offering them: "No words to Jesus which have resounded through one can come to me unless it is granted by the the centuries: Father" (v. 65).

Jesus tries to help the remaining followers eternal life."

to make a leap of Faith, because it is only with Faith that they will be able to see and grasp the triple mystery which has been revealed to them, namely, (1) the Incarnation (I am the Bread that came down from Heaven, 6:41); (2) the redemption (the Bread that I give is my Flesh for the life of the world, 6:51); (3) the Ascension and glorification (the Son of Man will ascend to where He was before, 6:62).

Peter's response to Jesus' question, "Do you also want to leave? "is simple, "Master, to whom we shall go? You have the words of eternal life." Peter might not get it. He might not fully understand. But he knows that Jesus is "the One" and he trusts him completely. His response reflects the Faith-filled, free, wholehearted decision of the apostles and the early Christian community to follow Jesus in total, accepting obedience and trust.

While giving us Holy Communion, the priest or minister says, "The Body of Christ" and we respond with a total, "Amen". This is our Presence, but also the total commitment of each recipient to Jesus and everything he wants

Gospel offensive and scandalous? Because our ways are not God's ways. The Gospel is offensive because it is costly. When Christ calls us to "eat My Flesh and to drink My Blood,"this is an invitation to us to participate in Jesus' death that we may rise with Him. The Christians who first heard this Gospel experienced and they knew Christians who had avoided martyrdom by compromising their Faith. The Gospel with no offence would be like a surgeon with no scalpel — having no power to heal.
