A Message from Father Benedict

PETERPOST

The Catechism of the Catholic Church is divided into four main parts. Part One: Faith Professed (analysis of the Creed); Part Two: Faith Celebrated (The Liturgy and Sacraments); Part Three: Faith Lived (Christian Life); Part Four: Faith Prayed (Life of Prayer). All the parts are proven by Part 3 alone in today's Gospel. In basic Catechesis we were told that "Faith means believing in God." Thus, faith is man's response to God, who reveals Himself and gives Himself to man, at the same time bringing man a super abundant light as he searches for the ultimate meaning of his life. Given that the topic "Faith" is so wide, our main concern here is to match words with action - faith that is put into work and that works. The Letter to the Hebrews 11 defines faith and gives examples of people who acted in faith. (Please, do read it later on).

St. James was apparently dissatisfied with people who only talked or only listened but never acted (we can call them theory men). So in verses 20-22 he gave the example of Abraham who was considered righteous when he offered his son Isaac. You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did. Yet in a world where activism has gradually taken up even the normal Christian, others drift to the extreme of acting without faith. Faith is the light and foundation to our actions. Working relentlessly to alleviate people's difficulties (corporal works of mercy as St. James gives the two examples) is part and parcel of our faith.

ACT of FAITH

O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God in three divine persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

I believe that your divine Son became man and died for our sins, and that he will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe these and all the truths which the holy catholic Church teaches, because in revealing them you can neither deceive or be deceived. Amen.

St. James tells us in our Second Reading: "I will prove to you that I have faith by showing my good deeds." The fruits of Faith are good deeds. Faith produces evidence of its living existence by good works (by their actions you shall know them [cf. Mtt. 7:16]). Any living thing should have the capacity to bear fruits. We can now understand St. James when he says: "if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead." Do we have living and active faith or dead faith? Even if you are persecuted (trials) as you try to put your faith into action in various dimensions, remember that faith that is tested has the opportunity to grow stronger, to a place where it "works."

Consider how Jesus made disciples; only those who actually responded experienced discipleship. Secondly, notice the pattern of Jesus' miracles. He often acknowledged or ascertained the presence of faith in the individual before commanding that something essentially human be done. In faith, human effort collaborating with grace ends up with a better result. Faith is a human act wherein the human intellect and will cooperate with divine grace.

Due to his belief that the fundamental apostolate of the laity was fading away, Pope Paul VI said: "The first means of evangelization is the witness of an authentically Christian life, given over to God in a communion that nothing should destroy and at the same time given to one's neighbour with limitless zeal... 'Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than he does to teachers and if he listens to teachers, it's because they are witnesses'" (Evangelii Nuntiandi # 41)."

Parish Safeguarding Training at The Pastoral Centre on Saturday 12 October 2024

Firstly, on the behalf of Fr. Mark and the Diocese we would like to express our gratitude for all that you do ensuring compliance and adherence to the Safeguarding requirements that apply in our Church community, thank you.

In Person Training - St Peter's Pastoral Centre there will be two sessions, and you are welcome to attend both or just the one which is more relevant to your involvement within the Parish.

Children Training will start at 10:00am till 12 noon

We will then break for lunch, where you are invited to bring a packed lunch.

Adults will start at 1:00pm following lunch, and we hope to finish by 3:30pm

Every human being has a value and dignity which we as Catholics acknowledge as coming directly from God's creation of all men and women in his own image and likeness. This means we have a duty to value all people and therefore to support them and protect them from harm.

As a Diocese we are committed to ensuring our parishes and church communities are safe spaces for all those who use them. A key part of that commitment is ensuring that safeguarding training is undertaken as part of the safe recruitment process.

It is a requirement of the Bishop, the Trustee Board and the Safeguarding Committee that anyone who in a role (or roles) working with children and/or adults at risk, or those who might otherwise be vulnerable undertake safeguarding awareness training.

We would really encourage you to attend if at all possible, to ensure that you continue to be actively engaged in your role(s) within the Parish.
