Turning Point – Be Alert for the Holy Spirit in Unexpected Places

A Message from Father Mark

According to a traditional Hebrew story, Abraham was sitting outside his tent one evening when he saw an old man, weary from age and the journey, coming toward him. Abraham rushed out, greeted him, and then invited him into his tent. There he washed the old man's feet and gave him food and drink.

The old man immediately began eating without saying any prayer or blessing. So, Abraham asked him, "Don't you worship God?" The old traveller replied, "I worship fire only and reverence no other god." When Abraham heard this, he became incensed, grabbed the old man by the shoulders, and threw him out of his tent into the cold night air.

When the old man had departed, God called to his friend Abraham and asked where the stranger was. Abraham replied, "I forced him out because he did not worship You." God answered, "I have suffered him these eighty years although he dishonours me. Could you not endure him one night?"

Our Gospel two weeks ago was a turning point in the ministry of Jesus and for his disciples. Now, as he led them towards Jerusalem and his suffering, death and Resurrection, he would try to teach them what it really means to be the disciple of this Messiah. And they would have to choose – to remain part of the crowd (Jesus is a prophet); to reject Jesus (he is a blasphemer); or to accept and follow him (by renouncing themselves and picking up their own cross).

In last weekend's Gospel, Jesus begins his teaching:

"If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all".

One of the real blessings of our parish is the genuine diversity we find. We find people from so many different nations; aged from a few weeks old to 100 years old; from the city and from the rural areas; of varying political persuasions; with a wide range of jobs and professions. We have many different natural gifts and talents and charisms. When we gather on a Sunday, we celebrate that beautiful diversity in unity, brought about by the Holy Spirit, and we focus on the One True God, and offer Him worship.

But how well do we really know each other? How many of us know the names, the stories, the joys and the struggles of the person who sits two or three rows behind us at Mass? What they might need prayer for this week? In a large community like ours, we need to be intentional in taking time to offer a cup of water to, share bread with, and listen to those others who help form our Catholic Christian community. Especially those who are not like us. Our small groups – Alpha, Journey in Faith, Acorn Groups, etc. help us to do this and it's why they're so important.

Who knows in what unexpected place the Holy Spirit might be trying to talk to you this week... And what a turning-point it might be for us when we become alert to His presence...

We would like to express our sincere gratitude to the Filipino community for leading us in celebration at 10.30 Mass and also for their hospitality, to which we are all invited in the Pastoral Centre after the Mass.

SVP Awareness Month—Other Outreach work

This week we're focussing on two areas where we work alongside other parish ministries:- the weekly Wednesday Sanctuary Welcome Hub and support in Winchester prison.

In May 2022 the Weekly Hub opened its doors, initially to welcome Ukrainians who were seeking sanctuary in Winchester and the neighbouring area. Our aim is to provide a safe and comfortable space where people can meet, share feelings and experiences, and offer mutual support. We are also able to signpost guests to relevant organisations and resources, as well as help with English conversation practice. The Hub could not operate without the help of volunteers, including many SVP members. The SVP also contributes financially with the Hub's running costs.

For over a year SVP members have been supporting prison chaplain Fr Jean-Patrice Coulon and visiting chaplains to HMP Winchester, for an invaluable weekly Saturday morning Mass. There is important and enjoyable social time before and after Mass when we, as chaplaincy volunteers, chat with, pray with and above all, listen to the men. During this social time there is also the opportunity to distribute the essential reading glasses, stress balls and picture prayer cards which are funded by the SVP. Each recipient is immensely grateful and appreciative, for having such needs met helps their mental health and helps them to feel human. We often use this opportunity to let the men know that whilst here in prison, they are a part of our parish and that we are praying for them.
