A Message from Fr Mark...

Dangerous Prayers IV - God's Blessing in Us and Through Us, at a Cost

You and I are almost constantly being reminded of our need for money, in nearly every area of our lives. And, while we have this constant need for money, how often do we think of bringing these needs before God? Many Catholics, in particular, seem reticent about turning to God in a meaningful way when it comes to their financial needs. It seems unworthy of prayer, not 'spiritual enough'. So, instead of turning to God we carry on all on our own to try and meet our own needs.

But God actually encourages us to invite him into our finances. Over and over again, the Bible tells stories of people who act in tandem with God when it comes to financial provision.

In our First Reading this weekend, God sends a drought over the land and tells Elijah to leave his hiding place, and what little security he had found, and go to a place called Zarephath, where an unnamed widow would be providing for

At face value, this is a strange instruction. Widows were almost always poor in that culture, as they couldn't hold jobs or own property. They were reduced to relying on the charity of others.

Turning to a widow for charity, especially under the extreme circumstances of a drought, didn't sound like much of a plan. However, Elijah does what we all should do. He simply obeys God and heads off.

When he finds the widow, Elijah asks her for water. It is no small ask in a time of drought. And the fact that she complies without question suggests great generosity on her part. But then he follows it up with an even bigger ask.

She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.'

1 Kings 17:12-13

I always find this one of the most moving lines in the whole of the Bible. The drought and famine have devastated her livelihood. She is resigned to die, her and her son together.

But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel:

Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth.

1 Kings 17:14-15

The widow has next to nothing and no hope of more. And Elijah tells her to give to him the little she's got...all of it. And in return she'll receive all she'll need.

This is completely counter-intuitive. Just like God's request to Elijah himself. God's ways are not our ways. His thoughts are not our thoughts. To work with God we have to be willing to think differently. So, the widow has a decision to make and she decided to trust in Elijah and God and

God, as promised, provides for her immediate need. But he also provided more, much more. God is never outdone in generosity.

There are two times where it can be tough to trust God with money: when we've got it and when we haven't. When I'm struggling financially, it can be very difficult to believe that giving will open me up to God's provision. Even though my way isn't working, letting go of money could seem crazy.

Ironically, it can be even more difficult to trust God when I've amassed wealth or have financial margin. Statistics show that the more wealth someone has, the less likely they are to give to God in any kind of meaningful way. We forget that all we have comes from God and that when we give we're simply returning to him what he has given to us.

Prayer can reveal the next step to take when we want to cooperate with God. Often, he'll require something from you. Not something impossible. Just something out of the ordinary. Maybe something counter-intuitive to your way of doing things. Sometimes it is so simple we can barely believe it will make any difference at all.

And when it comes to provision, often God will tell us to release resources that we have before we will see his blessing. Money and wealth can be a blessing but only if we choose to cooperate with God in the way we use it.

God's ultimate goal with respect to any material provision is to lead us to spiritual provision.

Spiritual wealth comes in two ways. Firstly, it comes in the form of an everdeepening understanding of God's love. Secondly, it comes in an ever-deepening knowledge that we can be a source of blessing to others.

Dangerous prayer comes at a cost. And, one way or another, it always pays off.
