# **The Terminally III Adults** (End of Life) Bill ("Assisted Suicide")

The bill introduced to Parliament by Kim Leadbeater MP to legalise assisted suicide will be voted on by MPs on 29th November. #### A Message from Fr Mark...

#### Dangerous Prayers - My Thy Will be Done

In our second reading this weekend, Jesus offers his life back to the Father and prays the most dangerous prayer of all,

#### "I have come to do your will, O God."

It's the prayer Jesus prays in the agony in the Garden, just before his arrest:

Not my will, but yours be done

Luke 22.42

That prayer was difficult even for Jesus, as Luke goes on to tell us:

And being in agony he prayed more earnestly; and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down to the around.

Luke 22.44

It's also the prayer Jesus teaches us in the Our Father:

Thy will be done, thy kingdom come. Matthew 6.9

When we pray thy will be done and surrender our will to God's will, we open ourselves up to see God move powerfully. Jesus laid down his life to take away our sins. He sacrificed his life and surrendered to his Father's will. Then, he rose from the dead. He conquered the grave and now he sits in the place of authority over the world.

When we in our turn surrender our will to God's will, we will ultimately find a place of rest, triumph over the "enemies" that haunt us and the struggles that plague

I'm hoping that over the last few weeks, some of you have been joining me in offering "Dangerous Prayers". At this point, I want to briefly acknowledge three different ways in which God might have responded.

Firstly, for some of you, your dangerous prayer was answered with a **'no'**. You were praying for something to happen but it didn't happen. You prayed and you:

- didn't get the job
- still had to have the surgery you hoped to avoid
- experienced the relationship ending

I think there are at least a couple of possible reasons. Sometimes, for example, dark forces get in the way of our prayer. While ultimately good triumphs over evil, evil does win some battles.

Or maybe you are getting a no because the answer is no. What you want is not what the Father wants and so that's why you are getting a no. Jesus prayed that the cup would pass, that there would be some other way to redeem humanity than having to go to the cross.

So, he kept on praying until he could accept the Father's will.

Sometimes, we're being invited to trust that God has a greater plan or that the Father is teaching us something we can only learn through suffering and setback. Or that God is going to use our suffering and sacrifice for the good of others. God might be redirecting you in the no to what is his will. If God has told you no and you accept that and do his will, that is incredibly powerful.

Secondly, some of you will not have received a 'no' but have not yet received a 'yes' either. The answer seems to be **"not** yet" or "wait". For you I would say, persevere. Keep on praying. Keep on praying. Keep on praying. Jesus told a few different parables about the importance of praying and not giving up.

As you pray, God might be redirecting you to pray for something just a little different, or a broader perspective. Another tactic would be to consecrate whatever you are praying for to God. To consecrate simply means to give it over to God. It is the fresh act of dedicating yourself or where you want to see God's power and grace back to him. It is offering back to God your body, your home, your marriage, your family, your job, your finances - whatever needs God's grace - deliberately and intentionally to Jesus, bringing it fully into his kingdom and under his rule.

For example, for peace in your family, name every person in your family and hand them over to God. When you consecrate something to God, you plug it into his power and put it under his authority. The blessings of the kingdom of God cannot flow until we first bring things under the rule and jurisdiction of Jesus Christ who is seated at the right hand of the Father.

Thirdly, there may be some of you who have experienced the answer to their prayer as a **"yes"**. You have seen God move. If that is you, praise God! And I don't mean that just as an expression of happiness, but literally praise God. Praise him not only because he deserves it but because it will reinforce the gain you have received. It will reinforce the healing, the provision, the sense of purpose.

In fact, ask God for the grace to praise Him, no matter what the answer to your dangerous prayer may have been or if you are struggling to hear any kind of answer at all: praise Him when you feel it and praise Him when you don't! Keep on praising and praying and seek out the prayerful support of others, which can be very powerful and effective.

Dangerous prayers are bold, risky prayers. They lead us to accept God's will, to persevere when nothing seems to be happening and to praise God for his goodness in all things.


