## **EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - Year C**

## What are you doing to Step Forward in Love this Lent?

## Fr Mark writes:

Bishop Philip reminds us in his Pastoral Letter, which we will be reading at all Masses and sharing this weekend, that Lent is a time of spiritual renewal. Lent, he says, is an "annual spiritual campaign, a time of change and conversion, a time to do battle against evil in ourselves and in others, and the weapons we deploy are threefold: prayer, self-denial and charity.

We are calling our parish Lenten Spiritual Campaign, "Stepping Forward in Love". During this Jubilee Year, with our focus on hope, we are longing to step forward towards our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, entrusting ourselves more fully into His embrace. We do so in love.

Lent is a season for all people, and we can all access it wherever we are on our journey of faith. One of the powerful elements of Ash Wednesday is that the ashing is available to everyone -Catholic or non-Catholic, saint or sinner, from 1 day old to 100+ years old. My deepest desire this Lent is that all of us use this grace-filled and joyful season as an opportunity to take a step or two forward in love, growing closer to Jesus and closer to one another in the process.

Here I share a few excerpts from Pope Francis and his Lenten Message for 2025 (you can find the full text HERE, and it's well worth reading), in the hope that they might inspire us. "This Lent, as we share in the grace of the Jubilee Year, I would like to propose a few reflections on what it means to journey together in hope, and on the summons to conversion that God in his mercy addresses to all of us, as individuals and as a community...

First of all, to journey...A first call to conversion thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life; each of us is invited to stop and ask how our lives reflect this fact. Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone? Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity? It would be a good Lenten exercise for us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn how to sympathize with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us so that we can better advance on our journey to the house of the Father.

This would be a good "examination of conscience" for all of us wayfarers...

Second, to journey **together**. The Church is called to walk together, to be synodal. Christians are called to walk at the side of others, and never as lone travellers. The Holy Spirit impels us not to remain self-absorbed, but to leave ourselves behind and keep walking towards God and our brothers and sisters...This Lent, God is asking us to examine whether in our lives, in our families, in the places where we work and spend our time, we are capable of walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to become self-absorbed and to think only of our own needs. Let us ask ourselves in the presence of the Lord whether...we cooperate with others. Whether we show ourselves welcoming, with concrete gestures, to those both near and far. Whether we make others feel a part of the community or keep them at a distance. This, then, is a second call to conversion: a summons to synodality...

Third, let us journey together **in hope**, for we have been given a promise. May the hope that does not disappoint (cf.Rom5:5), the central message of the Jubilee, be the focus of our Lenten journey towards the victory of Easter... Christ, my hope, has risen!

This, then, is the third call to conversion: a call to hope, to trust in God and his great promise of eternal life. Let us ask ourselves: Am I convinced that the Lord forgives my sins? Or do I act as if I can save myself? Do I long for salvation and call upon God's help to attain it? Do I concretely experience the hope that enables me to interpret the events of history and inspires in me a commitment to justice and fraternity, to care for our common home and in such a way that no one feels excluded?

Sisters and brothers, thanks to God's love in Jesus Christ, we are sustained in the hope that does not disappoint (cf.Rom5:5). Hope is the "sure and steadfast anchor of the soul" (c.f. Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1820)" Pope Francis, Message of the Holy Father for Lent 2025.

# <u>Continuation of Building Works at St Peter's - What's New</u>

As we continue with essential works, please remember to wrap up warm if you are planning to come along to St Peter's Church, as the heating is still switched off.

Can we please ask for your continued support and ask that if you have any issues you please direct them to Gerard in the first instance, and he will respond and/or get the answer on your behalf. We did highlight the issues about having no heating in St Peter's and apologised for any inconvenience that this has caused, and we are also aware that some parishioners are visiting the other parish communities whilst the weather is unpleasant, cold, and wet. We sincerely hope that they are being warmly welcomed.

Please note that other members of staff are aware of some elements but are not fully aware of the intricacies of what is occurring and when. It is not fair that they are challenged and put in difficult situations in trying to defend what is happening when they come along to Mass in the Parish.

So, to help address some of the initial concerns – why are we doing it now and not in the Summer, when the weather is warmer (nicer)? The nature of the work that is being carried out has been scheduled and considered in three phases

- Phase 1 Dirty Work, repairing plaster and cracks around the church building; there may also be some decoration in the harder to reach places if the plaster is dry Phase 2
- Possible Lighting and Painting around the Church; possibly work on the Reredos (area at the back of the Sanctuary)
- Phase 3 Furnishings and finishing touches around the Church and Sanctuary

So why did we start in January and not in the Summer? The Liturgical Seasons play a very important part (Easter; Christmas), additionally the Church Diary also needed to be considered. The nature of the works cannot be rushed and adding additional resources simply would not bring us any real advantages. We were also aware of Weddings that had been booked in advance (2023 and 2024) and we have endeavoured to schedule the works around these dates. We did also look carefully at what might be feasible and the timelines in getting approvals for works to be carried out. We are working towards all the works being completed by the end of November 2025, in advance of the Centenary in 2026. If we had delayed the works until later in 2025, we would not have been ready, if we had started earlier in say Autumn 2024, we would also have similar issues with weather.

We truly understand and appreciate that there is no ideal time in doing this work, and we really need your patience and support in allowing us to get this work completed as quickly as we can, so please if there are any issues or concerns, please direct these to Gerard. Hopefully, we all share the same ambition to see the beauty of St Peter's Church in the Centenary Year.
